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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Primary Movement

During the week ended June 10, 1932, increased receipts are shown in the movement of wheat to the Western Country Elevators and over the loading platforms. The amount delivered during the above week was 5,154,732 bushels compared with 4,377,369 bushels for the previous week. By provinces the receipts were as follows:- Manitoba 638,105 bushels; Saskatchewan 2,464,605 bushels; Alberta 2,052,022 bushels. From August 1, to June 10, Country Elevators and platform loadings amounted to 252,871,434 bushels compared with 297,463,523 bushels for the same period in 1930-31.

Marketings of wheat in the three prairie provinces up to June 10, as compared with the same period a year ago were as follows: figures within brackets being those for 1931:- Manitoba 23,787,730 (34,136,246) bushels; Saskatchewan 113,224,353 (159,784,075) bushels; Alberta 115,859,351 (103,543,202) bushels.

STOCKS IN STORE

Stocks of Canadian wheat in the elevators and afloat in Canada and the United States for the week ended June 17, 1932 amounted to 135,584,980 bushels, 4,029,265 bushels less than the previous week. For the corresponding date in 1931, 115,325,611 bushels were reported in store.

In Transit wheat on the lakes for the week amounted to 4,866,290 bushels a decrease of 241,123 bushels from the previous week. Western Country Elevator stocks decreased 5,723,699 bushels from that of week ago and minor reductions were shown in the Interior and Vancouver elevators. Increased holdings were shown at the Head of the Lakes, at Churchill and at the Private and mill elevators. Canadian Eastern elevator wheat stocks increased 1,362,546 bushels, while a decrease is noted in the wheat in United States positions of 1,400,424 bushels. The amount reported in store in the Canadian Eastern elevators, was 14,239,916 bushels compared with 12,876,370 bushels for the previous week.

WHEAT CLEARANCES

Increased wheat clearances overseas are shown from Montreal and Vancouver also from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports during the week ended June 17, 1932. This advanced the movement over that of the previous year as well as the same week last year.

In comparing the movement for the three weeks ended June 17, 1932, with that of the same period last year, it will be noted that the shipments from Montreal are some 2,600,000 bushels ahead of a year ago.

INTERNAL MOVEMENT

An outstanding feature during the week has been the heavy rail shipments from the Western Country elevators amounting to 9,147,452 bushels. Large rail receipts are shown at the Head of the Lakes and Vancouver of 4,794,119 bushels and 1,791,529 bushels respectively. The vessel shipments from Ft. William and Port Arthur were 3,589,244 bushels. In the Eastern Division 2,233,586 bushels were shipped from Montreal and Sorel and 1,047,526, bushels from the lower lake ports to Montreal.

INSPECTIONS

During the week ended June 14, 1932 the wheat inspections amounted to 6,041 cars, compared with 4,262 cars of a week ago and 4,504 cars for the corresponding week in 1931. Gradings show the bulk of the former, 5,269 cars was placed in the contract grades and only 428 cars tough and damp. For the same week in 1931, 3,652 cars graded in the four grades and 547 cars tough and damp.

The average price for the week ended June 17, at Winnipeg for No. 1 Hard Manitoba was 56.3 cts. per bushel, No. 1 Northern 54.6 cents, per bushel compared with 57.8 per bushel and 55.5 cents per bushel respectively for the previous week. Vancouver prices averaged 53.9 cents per bushel for No. 1 Hard and 52.1 cents No. 1 Northern for the week ended June 17, 1932,. This compared with 54.5 cents and 53.1 cents per bushel for the previous week.

WATER MOVEMENT

The vessel movement of wheat from the Head of the Lakes for the week ended June 14, 1932 amounted to 3,021,949 bushels and with the exception of 272,290 bushels which went to Buffalo were carried in Canadian vessels to Canadian ports. The distribution of the above shipments were as follows:- To Lower lake ports of Port Colborne, Toronto, Kingston and Prescott 2,023,463 bushels; to Georgian Bay and Lake Huron ports 187,737 bushels. To Montreal 430,173 bushels of which 229,346 bushels were lightered at Port Colborne and Prescott; To Sorel 108,283 bushels lightered from Port Colborne and Prescott. For the corresponding week last year, the amount moved from the Head of the Lakes was 4,909,369 bushels; 3,174,167 bushels to Lower lake ports including Georgian Bay and Lake Huron ports; 450,995 bushels to Montreal and 1,284,207 bushels to Buffalo.

COARSE GRAINS

The coarse grain movement to the western country elevators for the week ended June 10, 1932, consisted of 461,199 bushels of Oats, Barley 123,071 bushels; Flaxseed 14,026 bushels and Rye 20,234 bushels. The other grain shipped over the loading platforms amounted to 77,366 bushels. The shipments from the above elevators were as follows:- Oats 207,554 bushels; Barley 174,850 bushels; Flaxseed 42,015 bushels and Rye 142,472 bushels.

The stocks of Canadian coarse grain in the elevators in Canada and the United States for the week ended June 17, 1932 were as follows:- Oats 5,924,012 bushels; Barley 5,940,569 bushels; Flaxseed 1,371,037 bushels and Rye 8,557,147 bushels. The majority of the grain was held in the Western Country elevators and elevators at the Head of the Lakes. For the same week in 1931 there were in store, Oats 9,922,847 bushels, Barley 12,733,584 bushels; Flaxseed 1,229,786 bushels, and Rye 12,506,412 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending June 18th amounted to 12,939,000 bushels, compared with 14,708,000 bushels for the previous week and 17,344,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1931. North American shipments were well maintained for the week, while the Argentine and Australia shipped smaller quantities. Russia continued to take an inactive part as far as the wheat market is concerned.

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour from August 1, 1931, to June 18, 1932 amounted to 712 million bushels, compared with 712 million bushels for the same week in 1930-31. During the same period, North American shipments have amounted to 297 million bushels, compared with 320 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31. To date in the present crop year, Russia has shipped 71 million bushels compared with 91 million bushels during the same period in 1930-31.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 17, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 17, 1932, show a decrease of 5,281,306 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 135,584,980, Oats 5,924,012, Barley 5,940,559, Flax 1,371,037 and Rye 8,557,147 a total of 157,377,765 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,029,265, Oats 179,136, Barley 367,278, Flax 83,477 and Rye 622,150. For the same week last year the amount in Store was 151,718,240 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 115,325,611, Oats 9,922,847, Barley 12,733,584, Flax 1,229,786 and Rye 12,506,412 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 6,082,363 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,723,699, Barley 61,324, Flax 66,244 and Rye 231,096 bushels, while Oats shows an increase of 192,447 bushels.

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
