#### CANADIAN WHEAT ATATISTICS

For the week ended July 1.4th some of the outstanding features were; slightly decreased stocks of wheat in the elevators, marked lowering of the marketings on the Prairie Provinces and reduced expert clearances from those of the previous week.

#### Primary Movement

A little over half the amount of wheat was received at the western country elevators and over the loading platforms during the week ended July 8, compared with previous week. The amount delivered for the week of July 8 amounted to 1,827,442 bushels and 3,461,459 bushels for a week ago. For the corresponding week in 1931. 1,267,298 bushels were received.

By provinces the receipts were as follows:- Manitoba 126,593 bushels: Saskatchewan 879,202 bushels; Alberta 821,647 bushels. From August 1 to July 8, 1932. Country elevators and platform loadings amounted to 264,311,089 bushels compared with 303,627,412 bushels for the same period in 1930-31.

Marketings of wheat in the three prairie provinces up to July 8, as compared with the same period a year ago were as follows: figures within brackets being those for 1931:- Manitoba 24,680,271 (34,606,445) bushels; Saskatchewan 118,363,484 (163,465,848) bushels; Alberta 121,267,334 (106,121,074) bushels.

#### Stocks in Store

A slight decrease is noted in the wheat stocks in the elevators and afloat in Canada and the United States for the week July 15, 1932, the amount shown in store being 137,013,051 bushels compared with 137,921,648 bushels a week ago and 111,332,815 bushels for the same week in 1931.

In Transit wheat increased 1,392,427 bushels over the previous week, the amount now being 6,373,248 bushels compared with 4,980,821 bushels for the previous week. Country elevators stocks decreased 4,047,577 bushels from those of week ago and smaller reductions were shown at Vancouver of 286,567 bushels and the Head of the Lakes of 798,178 bushels. Increased stocks are reported at Eastern lake and Seaboard Elevators of 936,571 and 1,233,445 bushels respectively. United Lake ports increased 444,874 bushels; United States Seaboard ports 224,282 bushels and Christian Christ Churchill 16,086 bushels.

#### Wheat Clearances

The wheat clearances for the week ended July 14, 1932 are below those of the previous week, but are in advance of the same week in 1931.

By ports the export clearances for the weeks ended July 14, 1932 and July 17, 1931 were as follows:-

#### Internal Movement

During the week ended July 15th, there have been reduced movements to and from the Elevators in Canada from those of the previous week. Rail shipments from the Western Country Elevators amounted to 5,407,587 bushels while 3,776,021 bushels were received at the Head of the Lakes; 843,291 bushels at Vancouver; 16,086 bushels at Churchill and 433,393 bushels at the Western Private and Mill Elevators. The vessel shipments from Fort William and Port Arthur amounted to 4,681,028 bushels. In the Eastern Division 1, 327, 433 bushels were shipped from Montreal while the water movement from the Lower Lake Ports to Montreal was 1,161,188 bushels.

#### Inspections

Car inspections for the week ended July 14 decreased slightly from the previous week, but were 1,037 cars more than the same week in 1931. By inspection points the number of cars reported were as follows: Winnipeg 2,621 cars; Calgary 193 cars; Moose Jaw 260 cars; Saskatoon 136 cars; Medicine Hat 27 cars; Churchill 127 cars; Vancouver 9 cars, and Edmonton 227 cars. The total par inspections for the week ended July 14, were 3,604 compared with 3,758 cars for the previous week, and 2,567 cars for the same week in 1931. Gradings show that 3,163 caus of the first amount were placed in the first four grades and 200 cars graded tough and damp. During the same week in 1931, 1,797 cars were graded in the contract grades and 576 cars tough and damp.

The weekly average price for No.1 Hard wheat as calculated from Cally prices at Winnipeg during the week ended July 16 was 53.6 cents and for No.1 Northern 53 cents. Last week, the prices averaged 54.2 cents for No.1 Hard and 53.8 cents for No.1 Northern.

#### Water Movement

Lake Vessel shipments of wheat from the Head of the Lakes for the week ended July 14, 1932 were less than the previous week. The amount shown as shipped was 4,750,346 bushels compared with 6,482,217 bushels a week ago. As in the former week practically all the first amount was carried in Canadian boats. The number of Canadian and United States Vessols carrying grain during the week were 30 and 7 respectively.

The distribution of the Vascal shipments was as follows: To Lower Lake ports consisting of Port Colborne, Prescott, Kingston and Toronto 1,886,308 bushels; to Georgian Bay and Lake Huron Ports 309,999 bushels; to Montreal 456,928 bushels of which 114,454 bushels were lightered at Prescott or Port Colborne; to Sorel 564,214 bushels all of which was hightered at Prescott or Port Colborne; and to Buffalo 1,532,997 bushels.

For the corresponding week in 1931, the amount shipped by Vessel from the Head of the Lakes was 1,836,738 bushels of which 539,181 bushels were destined to Buffalo; 539,181 bushels to Lover Lake ports; 213,859 bushels to Montreal and 111,500 bushels to shipped by Vessel from the Sorel.

Coarse Grains


The Primary Movement of coarse grains consisted of 262,214 bushels of oats;
111,537 bushels of Earley; 13.2% bushels of charsed and 12,020 bushels of Rye.
The amount shown as other grains shipped over the loading platform amounted to 33,114 bushels. The shipments from the Testern Country Elevators were as follows: Oats 770,436 bushels; Barley 358,032 bushels; Flaxseed 67,607 bushels and Rye 117,236 bushels.

According to the Vessel shipments from the Head of the Lakes 575,747 bushels of oats were roved to the following destinations: To Lower Lake Ports 307,137 bushels; to Montreal 238,202 bushels, and to Halifax 30,408 bushels. Barley shipments amounted to 265,792 bushels,184,953 bushels going to Montreal and 80,829 bushels to Canadian Lower Lake Ports. Rye Movement consisted of 349,888 bushels destined to Lower Lake ports and Montreal, the amounts being 115,000 and 234,888 bushels respectively.

Stocks of coarse grains in the elevators in Canada and the United States for week ended July 14 were as follows: - Oats 5,769,069 bushels; Barley 3,922,894 bushels; Flaxseed 1,216,062 bushels and Rye 6,233,423 bushels.

For the corresponding week in 1931, the quantities in store were: Oats 9,002,859 bushels; Barley 10,425,373 bushels; Rye 12,178,162 bushels; and Flaxseed 697,263 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending July 16th amounted to 8,707,000 bushels compared with 10,354,000 bushels for the week previous and 10,664,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1931. North American shipments declined about one million bushels for the week while shipments from the Argentine were the lowest for the crop year.

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour from August 1, 1931, to July 16, 1932 amounted to 751 million bushels, compared with 765 million bushels for the same week in 1930-31. During the same period, North American shipments have amounted to 319 million bushels, compared with 344 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31. To date in the present crop year, Russia has shipped 71 million bushels compared with 91 million bushels during the same period in 1930-31.

Mr. Broomhall estimates world wheat import requirements for 1931-32 at 776 million bushels. The position of this estimate on July 16, 1932, is shown in the following table:-

According to the above estimate there is a balance of 25 million bushels to he shipped in the last 2 weeks of the present crop year, or an average of 12,346,000 bushels per week compared with weekly average shipments of 15,026,100 bushels for the preceding weeks.

#### CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 15th, 1932

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 15th, 1932 show a decrease of 2,005,641 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 137,013,051, Oats 5,769,069, Barley 3,922,894, Flax 1,216,062 and Rye 6,288,423, a total of 154,209,499 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 908,597, Oats 33,944, Barley 413,215, Flax 168,299 and Rye 481,586 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 143,636,472 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 111,332,815, Oats 9,002,859 Barley 10,425,373, Flax 697,263, and Rye 12,178,162 bushels.

WEST RN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of 5,197,460 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 4,047,577, Oats 589,505, Barley 265,565 Flax 142,508 and Rye 152,305 bushels.



EASTERN ELEVATORS - LAKE PORTS: Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 1,118,758 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 936,571, Oats 180,860, and Rye 41,642 bushels, while Barley and Flax show decreases of 3,244 and 37,071 bushels respectively.
