#### CANADIAN THEAT STATISTICS

For the week ended July 21, some of the outstanding features of the Canadian Wheat situation were: - decreased stocks in the elevators; alarge reduction in the marketings on the Prairie Provinces from the previous week with increased export clearances ever those of the previous week.

#### Primary Movement

A record reduction to about one quarter of the previous weaksreceipts were shown at the Western Country Elevators and over the Loading platforms during the week ended July 15, 1932. The amount delivered for the week of July 15th emounted to 475,242 bushels and 1,827,442 bushels for a week ago. For the corresponding week in 1931, 1,169,740 bushels were shown as received at the above elevators.

By provinces the receipts were as follows:- Manitoba 69.864 bushels: Saskatchewan 224,697 bushels: Alberta 160,681 bushels. From August 1 to July 15, 1932, Country elevators and platform loadings amounted to 264,766,331 bushels compared with 304,797,152 bushels for the same period in 1930-31.

Marketings of wheat in the three prairie provinces up to July 15, as compared with the same period a year ago were as follows: figures within brackets being those for 1931:- Manitoba 24,750,135 (34,694,417) bushels: Saskatchewan 118,588,181 (163,465,848) bushels: Alberta 121,428,015 (106,636,887) bushels.

#### Stocks in Store

A decided decrease is noted in the Wheat stocks in the elevators and afloat in Ganada and the United States for the week ended July 22, 1932, the amount shown in store being 129,545,867 bushels, a decrease of 7,467,184 bushels from the previous week. Wheat stocks a week ago were 137,013,051 bushels. For the week ended July 24, 1931.110,476,443 bushels were reported.

In Transit Wheat decreased 1,403,684 bushels from the previous week, the amount now being 4.969.564 bushels compared with 6,373,248 bushels. Country Elevator Wheat stocks decreased 4,580,271 bushels from those of a week ago and smaller reductions were shown at the Head of the Lakes of 995,071 bushels; at Vancouver 267,814 bushels, at the U.S. Seaboard elevators of 665,606 bushels; and Interior Terminals 1,420 bushels. Increased stocks are reported at the Canadian Lake and Seaboard elevators of 174,249 and 132,369 bushels respectively, while Private & Mill Elevators show an increase of 59,000 and United States lake ports 81.064 bushels. This makes a net decrease in elevator stocks of 7,467,184 bushels.

#### Wheat Clearances

The wheat clearances for the week ended July 21, 1932 are larger than those of the previous week, and are also in advance of the same week in 1931.

By ports the export clearances for the weeks ended July 21, 1932 and July 23, 1931 were as follows:-

During the week ended July 22, there has been a reduction in the movements of wheat into the elevators in the Western Division, while a large increase took place in shipments from them. The amount shown as teceived was 5,615,302 bushels chiefly made up of receipts of 3,795,076 bushels at the Head of the Lakes; 748,388 bushels at Vancouver, B.C; 647,966 bushels at the Private & Mill Elevators; and 421,115 bushels at the Country Elevators. The Chipments amounted to 11,598,706 bushels accounted for principally by the large movements from the Head of the Lakes of 4,630,037 bushels: Country Elevators of 5,375,607 bushels and 1,017,254 bushels from Vancouver. In the Eastern Division 1,559,113 bushels were shipped from Montreal and 228,800 bushels from Sorel while the movement from the Lower Lake Ports to Montreal was 1,589,302 bushels.

Inspections

Car inspections of wheat during the week ended July 21, were slightly less than those of the previous week but were 827 cars more than the same week in 1931. By inspection points the number of cars reported were as follows:— Winnipeg 2,387 cars; Calgary 226 cars; Moose Jaw 119 cars; Saskatoon 97 cars; Medicine Hat 84 cars; Vancouver 1 car; Edmonton 278 cars; and Churchill 10 cars. The total car inspections for the week ended July 21, were 3,202 cars compared with 3,604 cars for the previous week, and 2,375 cars for the same week in 1931. Gradings show that 2,798 cars of the first amount were placed in the first four grades and 175 cars tough and damp. During the same week in 1931, 1,725 cars were graded in the contract grades and 417 gars tough and damp.

The weekly average price of No. 1 Hard Wheat as calculated from the daily quotations at Winnipeg during the week ended July 23 was 55.1 cents per bushel and for No. 1 Northern 54.3 cents. Last week the prices averaged 53.6 cents for No. 1 Hard and 53 cents for No. 1 Northern.

Water Movement

Lake Vessel shipments of wheal from the Head of the lakes for the week ended July
21, 1932, were slightly less than those of the previous week. The amount shown as shipped
was 4,373,207 bushels compared with 4,750,346 bushels a week ago. Practically all the
first arount was carried in Canadian boats. The number of Canadian and United States
Vessels carrying grain during the week were 38 and 4 respectively.

The distribution of the Vessel shipments was as follows: To Lower lake ports consisting of Fort Colborne, Frescott, Kingston and Toronto 1,860,341 bushels: to Georgian Bay and Lake Huron Ports 175,897 bushels; to Montreal 768,176 bushels of which 346,096 bushels were lightered at Port Colborne or Prescott; to Sorel 642,479 bushels all of which was lightered at Port Colborne or Prescott; and to Buffalo 931,914 bushels.


For the corresponding week in 1931, the amount shipped by Vessel from Head of the Lakes was 2,622,766 bushels of which the distribution was as follows:- To Buffalo 1,539,147 bushels; to Canadian Lower Lake ports 831,410 bushels; and to Montreal 252,209 bushels.

From the opening of navigation to July 21, 1932, 52,211,826 tushels of wheat were shipped from the Head of the Lakes by Vessel, which compares favourably with the amount last year, when it is taken into consideration, that the opening of navigation was two weeks later than last year. The amount shipped by Vessel for above period in 1931 was 56,171,453 bushels.

Coarse Grains
The Primary Movement of coarse grains consisted of 304,596 bushels of oats:
121.144 bushels of Barley; 15,382 bushels of flaxseed and 13,146 bushels of Rye. The amount shown as 'other grains' shipped over the loading platform amounted to 34,253 bushels. The shiuments from the Western Country Elevators were as follows:- Oats 751.237 bushels; Barley 392,564 bushels; Planseed 137,901 bushels and Rye 137,903 bushels.

According to the vessel shipments from head of the Lakes 153,588 bushels were moved to the following destinations: To Toronto 27,000 bushels: To Montreal 126,588 bushels. Barley shipments amounted to 326,525 bushels to Montreal. Rye Movement consisted of 562,507 bushels, 115,818 bushels going to Lower Lake ports and 446,689 bushels to Montreal, publication of Figure 1, were shipped to Toronto.

Stocks of coarse grains in the elevators in Canada and the United States for week ended July 22nd were as follows:— Oats 5,625,857 bushels; Barley 3,520,592 bushels; Mexseed 1,215,573 bushels; and Bye 5,885,278 bushels. For the corresponding week in 1931, the quantities in store were:— Oats 3,340,716 bushels; Barley 10,576,162 bushels; Flaxseed 716,425 bushels and Rye 11,852,451 bushels.





World shipments for the week ending July 23rd, 1932, amounted to 8,164,000 bushels compared with 8,707,000 bushels for the preceding week and 12,320,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments increased slightly for the week. Argentine shipments were the smallest of the crop year.

World shipments from August 1st, 1931, to July 23rd, 1932, amounted to 760 million bushels compared with 777 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31. During the same period North American shipments amounted to 324 million bushels compared with 349 million bushels in 1930-31. To date in the present crop year Russia has shipped 71 million bushels compared with 92 million bushels during the same period in 1930-31.



#### Import Requirement Estimate

Mr. Broomhall estimates world wheat import requirements for 1931-32 at 776 million bushels. The position of this estimate on July 23, 1932, is shown in the following table:-



Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 22nd, 1932 show a decrease of 8,816,532 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 129,545,867, Oats 5,625,857, Barley 3,520,592, Flax 1,215,373 and Rye 5,485,278 a total of 145,392,967 bushels. Decreases were noted in Wheat of 7,467,184, Oats 143,212, Barley 402,302, Flax 689 and Rye 803,145 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 142,462,197 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 110,476,443, Oats 8,840,716, Barley 10,576,162, Flax 716,425 and Rye 11,852,451 bushels.


PRINCE REPERT ELEVATOR. - Stocks at this elevator shows a decrease in Oats of 65 bushels.
