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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

For the week ended July 29th, some of the outstanding features of the Canadian wheat situation were:- marked reduction in the stocks in the elevators, and a continued decrease in the marketings on the Prairie Provinces from the previous week, while increased export clearances are shown over those of the previous week.

- Primary Movement -

Another small week's receipts are noted at the Western Country Elevators and over the loading platforms during the week ended July 22, 1932. The amount delivered for the week ended July 22 was 421,949 bushels compared with 475,242 bushels for the previous week. For the corresponding week in 1931, 1,140,453 bushels were shown as received at the above elevators.

By provinces the receipts were as follows:- Manitoba 15,523 bushels; Saskatchewan 198,956 bushels; Alberta 207,470 bushels. From August 1 to July 22, 1932, Country elevators and platform loadings amounted to 265,188,280 bushels compared with 305,937,605 bushels for the same period in 1930-31.

Marketings of wheat in the three prairie provinces up to July 22, as compared with the same period a year ago were as follows: figures within brackets being those for 1931:- Manitoba 24,765,658 (34,753,637) bushels; Saskatchewan 118,787,137 (163,900,500) bushels; Alberta 121,635,485 (107,283,468) bushels.

Stocks In Store

Reduced wheat stocks are again reported in the elevators and afloat in Canada and the United States for the week ended July 29, 1932, the amount shown in store being 121,469,701 bushels, a decrease of 8,076,166 bushels from the previous week. Wheat stocks a week ago were 129,545,867 bushels. For the week ended July 31, 1931, 110,731,356 bushels were reported.

In transit wheat increased 152,979 bushels over the previous week, the amount now reported being 5,122,543 bushels compared with 4,969,564 bushels. Country Elevator stocks decreased 4,623,339 bushels from those of a week ago and reductions were also shown at the Head of the Lakes of 1,721,269 bushels; at Vancouver 1,232,603 bushels; at Interior Terminals of 2,671 bushels; at Eastern Elevator Seaboard ports 380,920 and at the United States Lake and Seaboard ports 230,426 and 464,360 bushels respectively. Increased stocks were reported at Private and Mill Elevators of 22,694 bushels and Eastern Elevator Lake ports of 403,749 bushels.

Wheat Clearances

The wheat clearances for the week ended July 29, 1932 are larger than those of the previous week, and are also in advance of the same week in 1931.



INTERNAL MOVEMENT

During the week ended July 29, the movement of wheat into the elevators in the Western Division was 5,399,576 bushels, chiefly made up of receipts of 3,458,056 bushels at the Head of the Lakes; 894,242 bushels at private and mill Elevators; 408,715 bushels at Western Country Elevators and 636,963 bushels at Vancouver. The shipments amounted to 10,811,386 bushels accounted for principally by the Vessel movement from the Head of the Lakes of 5,400,074 bushels; Country Elevators of 2,594,388 bushels and 1,865,571 bushels from Vancouver. In the Eastern Division 1,543,416 bushels were shipped from Montreal and 927,264 bushels from Sorel, while the movement from the lower lake ports to Montreal was 1,179,795 bushels.

INSPECTIONS

Car inspections of wheat during the week ended July 31 were 742 cars less than the previous week, but 255 cars more than the same week last year. By inspection points the number of cars reported were as follows:- Winnipeg 1,952 cars; Calgary 153 cars; Moose Jaw 50 cars; Saskatoon 35 cars; Medicine Hat 39 cars; Vancouver 23 cars and Edmonton 208 cars. The total car inspections for the week ended July 31, were 2,460 cars compared with 3,202 cars for the previous week and 2,205 cars for the same week in 1931. Gradings show that 2,190 cars of the first amount were placed in the first four grades and 102 cars tough and damp. During the same week in 1931, 1,515 cars were graded in the contract grades and 413 cars tough and damp.

The weekly average price of No. 1 Hard wheat as calculated from the daily quotations shows an advance over the previous week. The average price for week ended July 30 for the above grade was 59.0 cents per bushels and for No. 1 Northern 58.1 cent per bushel. Last week the prices averaged 55.1 cents per bushel for No. 1 Hard and 54.3 cents for No. 1 Northern.

WATER MOVEMENT

Vessel shipments of wheat from the Head of the Lakes for period from July 22 to 31, were considerably over those of the previous week. The amount shown as shipped was 7,556,182 bushels compared with 4,378,807 bushels a week ago. The bulk of the first amount was carried in Canadian vessels. The number of Canadian and United States vessels carrying grain during the above period was 11 Canadian and 5 United States.

The distribution of the vessel shipments was as follows:- To Lower Lake ports consisting of Port Colborne, Prescott, Kingston and Toronto 4,027,429 bushels; to Georgian Bay and Lake Huron ports 287,149 bushels; to Montreal 881,771 bushels of which 384,045 bushels were lightered at Port Colborne, Kingston or Prescott, to Sorel 666,574 bushels all of which was lightered at Port Colborne, Kingston or Prescott; to Quebec 198,053 bushels 115,055 bushels of which was lightered at Port Colborne, Kingston or Prescott and to Buffalo 1,495,205 bushels.

For the corresponding period in 1931 the amount shipped by vessel from Head of the Lakes was 3,218,279 bushels of which the distribution was as follows:- To Buffalo 1,936,256 bushels; To Lower Lake ports 941,652 bushels; To Montreal 246,806 bushels and to Sorel 93,565 bushels.

From the opening of navigation to July 31, 1932, 59,768,008 bushels of wheat was shipped from the Head of the Lakes by vessel compared with 59,389,712 bushels for the same period in 1931.

COARSE GRAINS

The Primary Movement of coarse grains consisted of 221,578 bushels of Oats; 63,629 bushels of Barley; 7,380 bushels of Flaxseed and 12,684 bushels of Rye. The amount shown as 'other grains' shipped over the loading platform, amounted to 23,076 bushels. The shipments from the Western Country Elevators were as follows:- Oats 545,345 bushels; Barley 172,387 bushels; Flaxseed 36,757 bushels and Rye 82,000 bushels.

According to the vessel shipments from the Head of the Lakes 232,460 bushels of Oats were shipped to the following destinations: To Lower Lake ports 182,485 bushels; to Montreal 49,975 bushels. Barley shipments amounted to 362,454 bushels, of which 95,834 bushels were destined to Lower Lake ports and 266,620 bushels to Montreal. Flaxseed shipments amounted to 35,533 bushels filled to Goderich and the Rye movement consisted of 53,413 bushels going to Goderich and 18,200 bushels to Montreal.

Stocks of coarse grains in the elevators in Canada and the United States for week ended July 22nd were as follows:- Oats 6,272,215 bushels; Barley 3,671,709 bushels; Flaxseed 1,280,182 bushels; and Rye 5,585,412 bushels; For the corresponding week in 1931, the quantities in store were:- Oats 8,886,980 bushels; Barley 10,260,748 bushels; Flaxseed 742,388 bushels and Rye 12,163,007 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending July 31st, 1932, amounted to 9,331,000 bushels compared with 8,164,000 bushels for the preceding week and 9,928,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments increased sharply while shipments from the Argentine and Australia remained at the level of the previous week.

World shipments from August 1st, 1931, to July 31st, 1932, amounted to 769 million bushels compared with 786 million bushels for the crop year 1930-31. During the crop year just concluded North American shipments amounted to 371 million bushels compared with 354 million bushels in 1930-31. Russian shipments amounted to 71 million bushels compared with 93 million bushels in 1930-31; Argentine shipments amounted to 138 million bushels compared with 123 million bushels in 1930-31; and Australian shipments amounted to 151 million bushels compared with 154 million bushels in 1930-31.

The Argentine

The correspondent of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in the Argentine cabled as follows on July 31st, 1932.

"July wheat exports 54,000 tons. Balance remaining 1,050,000 tons. Small movement and market quiet. Fair local demand but little export. Unseasonably mild damp weather unfavourable for wheat. Locusts increasing in north but little irreparable damage".

Russian Harvesting Data

The London correspondent of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics cabled on August 3rd in regard to progress of Russian harvesting up to July 25th. The data are summarized in the following table.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 29, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 29, 1932 show a net decrease of 7,113,748 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 121,469,701, Oats 6,272,216, Barley 3,671,709, Flax 1,280,182 and Rye 5,585,412 a total of 138,273,219 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 8,076,166 bushels, while increases are noted in Oats of 646,358, Barley 151,117, Flax 64,801 and Rye 100,134 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 142,784,479 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 110,731,756, Oats 6,886,980, Barley 10,260,748, Flax 742,388 and Rye 12,163,007 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of 5,090,713 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 4,643,339, Oats 322,809, Barley 77,538, Flax 24,580 and Rye 12,452 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR. Wheat stocks are the same as for the previous week.

IN TRANSIT - LAKES. Grain in transit shows a net increase of 773,145 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 152,979, Oats 130,382, Barley 312,198 and Rye 190,361 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 18,775 bushels.
