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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended September 17, 1931, according to elevator reports from Canadian Seaboard ports, 1,826,801 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports amounted to 939,000 bushels, making a total export clearance for the week of 2,765,801 bushels.

For the three weeks ended September 17, 1931, the amount of wheat shipped overseas from Canadian Seaboard ports was 6,723,319 bushels, this with the clearances from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports of 1,051,000 bushels makes a total of 7,774,319 bushels.

Wheat stocks show an increase compared with the previous week ended September 11, 1931. The quantity in store on September 18, 1931, was 114,444,355 bushels, compared with 102,337,225 bushels for the week ended September 11, 1931, while 143,799,092 bushels were in store for the week ended September 19, 1930.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store on September 18, 1931, 6,435,484 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports, of which 5,274,993 bushels are in store and afloat at Buffalo, New York.

During the week ended September 11, 1931, 16,190,591 bushels were delivered to the Western Country Elevators and shipped over the loading platforms. This is almost twice the amount for the previous week, which was 9,324,039 bushels. For the week ended September 12, 1930, 32,709,354 bushels were marketed. The shipments from the above elevators amounted to 16,606,906 bushels for the period from August 1 to September 11, 1931.

New crop wheat inspections for the Western Division during the week ended September 14, 1931 were 6,403 cars, as compared with 14,106 cars for the same week last year. Of the former number 4,902 cars graded No. 3 Northern and better, while 12,272 cars were placed in the contract grades for the corresponding week in 1930. Wheat shipments by vessel, from Fort William and Port Arthur for the period from September 15 to 21 amounted to 2,574,327 bushels, the distribution, of which was as follows:- To Canadian Lower Lake ports 1,463,468 bushels; to Buffalo 590,441 bushels; to Montreal 430,186 and to Sorel 90,232 bushels.



World Wheat Production Down

The following statement was issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics on September 24th, 1931:

"World wheat production, in 1931 exclusive of Russia and China, is estimated to be 225 million bushels less than in 1930, according to a statement issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics today. To the foregoing amount will have to be added any deficiency in the 1931 Russian crop as compared to production in 1930. It is generally recognized that Soviet production this year is less than in 1930.

The decline in world wheat production in 1931 is due to smaller spring wheat crops in North America, drastic reductions in early estimates of the European crop, an estimated decrease of 57 million bushels in the Indian wheat crop and reduced prospects from the Argentine and Australia as a result of major reductions in acreage.

Early July and August estimates of European wheat production were very hopeful and indicated a crop in excess of last year by some 60 million bushels. Very wet weather in central Europe combined with drought and hot winds in sections of southern Europe during August and the early part of September have materially reduced the outturn of continental wheat crops. Present estimates indicate an European wheat crop slightly smaller than in 1930, or a reduction of from 60 to 65 million bushels under the outturn promised by early estimates.

The largest reductions in estimated yields have taken place in France, Germany, Spain and Czechoslovakia. Early estimates placed the 1931 French wheat crop at 270 million bushels but it is now estimated at 257 million bushels. In Germany early estimates indicated a crop of 168 million bushels but the German wheat crop is now officially estimated at 156 million bushels, and as a result of further unfavourable developments is unofficially estimated at 150 million bushels. In Spain early estimates indicated a crop of 145 million bushels whereas production is now officially estimated at 130 million bushels. Estimates of the 1931 wheat crop in Czechoslovakia have declined from 50 million bushels to 38 million bushels. The sum total of the reductions from early estimates reduce prospective European wheat production to slightly below the level of 1930.

A particularly important development is the reduced crop in Danubian countries as shown by the following data:

As shown by the above figures 1931 Danubian wheat production is estimated to be 34 million bushels under 1930.

Smaller Crops Elsewhere

North American wheat production is currently estimated at about 100 million bushels under last year as a result of light spring wheat production in Canada and the United States. Asiatic production is reduced by the large decrease in 1931 wheat production in India, officially estimated as 347 million bushels compared to 390 million bushels in 1930. While it is too early to estimate Southern Hemisphere crops, on the basis of average yields per acre, total outturn should be about 80 million bushels less than in 1930 on account of greatly reduced acreages in the Argentine and Australia."

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 18, 1931, show an increase of 13,738,001 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 114,444,355; Oats 9,785,249; Barley 9,817,412; Flaxseed 819,974 and Rye 12,506,082 bushels, a total of 147,373,072 bushels. Increases are shown in all the grains as follows:- Wheat 12,107,130; Oats 369,548; Barley 853,003; Flaxseed 79,021 and Rye 329,299 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was Wheat 143,799,092; Oats 8,168,751; Barley 27,569,406; Flaxseed 711,796 and Rye 11,632,053, a total of 191,881,098.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show an increase of 9,451,754 bushels over the previous week, made up as follows:- Wheat 9,137,546; Oats 117,266; Barley 152,418; Flaxseed 29,594; Rye 14,930 bushels.
