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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended September 25, 1931, according to elevator reports from Canadian Seaboard ports, 2,740,927 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports amounted to 501,000 bushels, making a total export clearance for the week of 3,241,927 bushels.

For the four weeks ended September 25, 1931, the amount of wheat shipped overseas from Canadian Seaboard ports was 9,464,246 bushels, this with the clearances from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports of 1,552,000 bushels makes a total of 11,016,246 bushels.

Wheat stocks show an increase compared with the previous week ended Sept. 18, 1931. The quantity in store on September 25, 1931, was 120,700,871 bushels, compared with 114,444,355 bushels for the week ended September 18, 1931, while 152,210,868 bushels were in store for the week ended September 26, 1930.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store on September 25, 1931, 6,372,631 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports, of which 5,159,907 bushels are in store and afloat at Buffalo, New York.

During the week ended September 18, 1931, 12,737,355 bushels were delivered to the Western Country Elevators and shipped over the loading platforms. This is a slight reduction from the previous week, which was 16,190,591 bushels. For the week ended September 19, 1930, 16,507,348 bushels were marketed. The shipments from the above elevators amounted to 24,749,888 bushels for the period from August 1 to September 18, 1931.

New crop wheat inspections for the Western Division during the week ended September 21, 1931 were 5,009 cars, as compared with 12,981 cars for the same week last year. Of the former number 3,963 cars graded No. 3 Northern and better, while 11,654 cars were placed in the contract grades for the corresponding week in 1930.

THE FOREIGN SITUATION

The following communication has been received from the Canadian Trade Commissioner in Australia:

**WHEAT** - With less than four million bushels of last season's wheat unsold, Australia is a comparatively unimportant factor in the world's markets at this period when the harvest is being garnered in the Northern hemisphere.

Fortunately for Australia, unusually large orders from China (in particular) and Japan have not only had the effect of holding domestic prices firm, but the sustained demand caused prices to advance from time to time. Approximately 750,000 tons of wheat have already been sold to China and some 650,000 tons to Japan of which about 175,000 tons have yet to be shipped.



Australia will enter the coming wheat export season (as from December 1st) with practically no carry-over, largely caused by the demand from the Orient.

Wheat Production in Spain:- The International Institute of Agriculture at Rome cabled on September 21st that the 1931 Spanish wheat crop is estimated at 130,768,693 bushels compared to 145,991,000 bushels harvested in 1930, and the five-year average 1924 to 1928 of 146,581,000 bushels.

Argentine Wheat Stocks:- On September 29th, the Argentine Government released an estimate of the amount of wheat still available in that country. The report showed a surplus of 40,969,000 bushels available on that date. This figure is much lower than commercial calculations of stocks of wheat in the Argentine. It was generally accepted that available stocks in the Argentine at the end of September amounted to 60 or 65 million bushels.

Smaller Rye Production:- Recent estimates place 1931 German rye production at 275 million bushels compared to 302 million bushels in 1930, or a reduction of 27 million bushels. The Polish rye crop is estimated at 203 million bushels compared to 274 million bushels last year, or a reduction of 71 million bushels. The combined 1931 rye crop of Germany and Poland is, therefore, estimated to be 98 million bushels less than in 1930.

Estimates of rye production for 13 European countries show a reduction of approximately 130 million bushels compared to 1930.

North America also shows a smaller estimated rye production in 1931 compared to last year. The Canadian rye crop is estimated at 7,576,000 bushels compared to 22,018,000 bushels in 1930, while the United States 1931 rye crop is estimated at 36,233,000 bushels compared to 48,149,000 bushels for 1930.

World Shipments:- (Broomhall's figures) World shipments of wheat and flour amounted to 15,859,000 bushels for the week ending September 26th, compared to 19,200,000 for the week previous. World shipments from August 1st to September 26th amounted to 126,116,000 bushels compared to 122,617,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year. Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 25, 1931, show net increase of 6,862,139 bushels. Stock for the week were as follows:- Wheat 120,700,871; Oats 9,461,658; Barley 10,904,950; Flax 858,232 and Rye 12,309,500, total of 154,235,211 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 6,256,516; Barley 1,087,538 and Flax 38,258 bushels while Oats and Rye show decreases of 323,591 and 196,582 bushels respectively. For the same period last year the amount in store was 202,459,693 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 152,210,868; Oats 9,129,184; Barley 27,892,247; Flax 1,002,564 and Rye 12,224,830 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net increase of 4,195,099 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 4,087,054; Barley 174,744; Flax 21,869; Rye 23,814 while Oats show a decrease of 112,382.
