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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT.

During the week ended October 2, 1931, according to elevator reports from Canadian Seaboard ports, 2,234,660 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports amounted to 831,000 bushels, making a total export clearance for the week of 3,065,660 bushels.

Wheat stocks show an increase compared with the previous week ended September 25, 1931. The quantity in store on October 2, 1931 was 120,537,527 bushels, compared with 120,700,871 bushels for the week ended September 25, 1931, while 153,606,-425 bushels were in store for the week ended October 3, 1930.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store on October 2, 1931, 7,344,517 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports, of which 6,101,990 bushels are in store and afloat at Buffalo, New York.

During the week ended September 25th, only 4,809,416 bushels were delivered to the Western Country Elevators. This compares with 12,737,355 bushels for the previous week September 18, 1931. For the week ended September 26, 1930, 20,820,394 bushels were marketed. The shipments from the above elevators amounted to 28,776,418 bushels, for the period from August 1, to September 25, 1931.


Despite showers in some regions, late cutting and threshing has proceeded satisfactorily and deliveries have attained a normal volume for this season.

New crop wheat inspections for the western division during the week ended September 30, 1931, were 3,711 cars, as compared with 12,925 cars for the same week last year. Of the former number 2,847 cars graded No. 3 Northern and better, while 11,427 cars were placed in the contract grades for the corresponding week in 1930.

The vessel shipments from the Head of the Lakes during the period from September 22 to 30th amounted to 5,375,043 bushels, distributed as follows:- to Buffalo 2,981,801 bushels; to Montreal 1,321,867 bushels, to Canadian Lower Lake ports 801,789 bushels and to Sorel 269,586 bushels.

Foreign Situation.

Argentina.- The Dominion Bureau of Statistics reports the receipt of a cablegram (dated October 6) from the Canadian Trade Commissioner at Buenos Aires communicating the second official forecast of the areas sown to wheat, flaxseed and oats for the crop season 1931-32, as follows: wheat 17,235,000 acres, as compared with 21,720,000 acres in 1930-31 and with 19,228,000 acres, the average for the five years 1926-27 to 1930-31; flaxseed 8,544,000 acres, as compared with 7,262,000 acres in 1930-31 and with 6,457,000 acres, the five-year average; oats 3,504,000 acres, as compared with 3,976,000 acres in 1930-31 and with the five-year average of 3,530,000 acres.



WHEAT - QUANTITIES ON PASSAGE TO EUROPE

Quantities of wheat on passage to Europe have declined sharply during the past two weeks. For the week ending September 21st 46,424,000 bushels were on passage to Europe compared to 42,608,000 for the week ending September 28th and 37,848,000 for the week ending October 2nd, a decline of 8,576,000 bushels during the two weeks.

Quantities on passage to Europe on October 3rd were lighter than at any time since January 1931. The following table shows quantities of wheat and flour on passage to Europe, weekly, February 6th to October 2nd, 1931:-

United States: Wheat and Flour Exports.

Exports of wheat and flour continue far below the level of 1930, according to a report issued on September 29, 1931 by the Department of Commerce. Exports of wheat for the week ending September 26th amounted to 1,377,000 bushels compared to 2,371,000 bushels for the week ending September 19th. For the period July 1st to September 26th United States exports of wheat amounted to 28,127,000 bushels compared to a total of 41,844,000 bushels for the same period last year, a decrease of 13,717,000 bushels.

Exports of flour from the United States show a decline over the same period in 1930. From July 1st to September 26th exports of United States flour amounted to 2,075,000 barrels compared with 3,256,000 barrels for the corresponding period in 1930, or a decline of 1,181,000 barrels.

The major part of the reduced exports of United States wheat is accounted for by smaller exports to the United Kingdom and Europe, partially offset by larger exports elsewhere.

World Shipments:- (Broomhall's figures) World shipments of wheat and flour amounted to 15,521,000 bushels for the week ending October 3rd, compared to 15,859,000 for the week previous. World shipments from August 1st to October 3rd amounted to 141,726,000 bushels compared to 139,449,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year. The following table shows world wheat and flour shipments from August 1st to October 3rd, by weeks.

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Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 2, 1931, show a net increase of 275,439 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 120,537,527, Oats 9,495,994, Barley 11,326,152, Flax 852,979 and Rye 12,297,998 a total of 154,510,650 bushels. Oats and Barley show increases of 34,336 and 421,202 bushels respectively, while decreases are noted in Wheat of 163,344, Flax 5,253 and Rye 11,502 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 210,717,166 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 158,606,425, Oats 9,642,130, Barley 29,357,083, Flax 1,299,559 and Rye 11,611,969 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net increase of 702,785 bushels, Wheat and Barley show increases of 782,089 and 2,323 bushels respectively. While decreases are noted in Oats of 80,733, Flax 144 and Rye 750 bushels.
