CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

For the week ended August 5, some of the outstanding features of the Canadian wheat situation were:- A slight increase in the stocks in the elevators and afloat; negligible marketings on the Prairie Provinces and a marked reduction in the export clearances as compared with the previous week.

- Primary Movement -

With the week ended July 29, 1932, another crop year has drawn <sup>to</sup> a close, and owing to corrected returns being later received from licensees of the western country elevators a minus adjustment is necessitated for the province of Alberta. The quantity is greater than the receipts at the other two prairie provinces thus showing a minus quantity shipped to the Western Country Elevators and over the Loading platforms the amount of the revision being (-)89,895 bushels by provinces the receipts were as follows:- Manitoba 14,908 bushels; Saskatchewan 87,695 bushels; Alberta (-)192,498 bushels. From August 1 to July 29, 1932, Country elevators and platform loadings amounted to 265,098,385 bushels compared with 307,146,626 bushels for the same period in 1930-31.

Marketings of wheat in the three prairie provinces up to July 29, as compared with the same period a year ago were as follows: figures within brackets being those for 1931:- Manitoba 24,780,556 (34,813,973) bushels; Saskatchewan 118,874,832 (164,539,395) bushels; Alberta 121,442,987 (107,793,258) bushels.

Stocks in Store

Wheat stocks in the Elevators and afloat in Canada and the United States for the week ended August 5, 1932 amounted to 121,786,709 bushels, an increase of 299,940 bushels over the previous week, Wheat stocks a week ago were 121,469,701 bushels. For the week ended August, 1931, 107,825,654 bushels were reported.

In Transit wheat decreased 123,004 bushels from the previous week, the amount now reported being 4,999,539 bushels compared with 5,122,543 bushels. Country Elevators stocks for the week ended August 5, increased 1,421,396 bushels over the previous week, while increases took place in the Eastern Elevators, at the Lake and Seaboard ports of 654,907 and 1,278,459 bushels respectively. United States Lake ports also increased 222,842 bushels. Reductions are shown at Fort William and Port Arthur stocks of 2,316,469 bushels; at Vancouver of 124,601 bushels; at Private and Mill Elevators 413,371 bushels and at United States Seaboard ports 313,641 bushels.

Wheat Clearances


Wheat clearances during the week ended August 5, 1932, are less than half of the previous week, but are little in advance of those of the corresponding week in 1931.

Internal Movement

During the week ended August 5, the movement of wheat into the elevators in the western division dropped to less than half of the <sup>previous</sup> week, the amount being 2,494,638 bushels. These receipts were made up principally of 1,632,915 bushels at the Head of the Lakes; 490,179 bushels at private and mill elevators and 441,381 bushels at Vancouver. The shipments amounted to 9,160,482 bushels accounted for principally by the Vessel Movement from the Head of the Lakes of 3,949,534 bushels; Country Elevators 3,963,068 bushels; Private and Mill Elevators 680,635 bushels and 544,877 bushels from Vancouver. In the Eastern Division 1,216,637 bushels were shipped from Montreal, while the movement from the Lower lake ports to Montreal were 1,692,514 bushels.

#### Water Movement

Vessel shipments of wheat from the Head of the Lakes for the week ended August 7, 1932 were below those of the previous week. The amount shown as shipped was 4,661,841 bushels compared with 7,556,182 bushels a week ago. The bulk of the first amount was carried in Canadian vessels. The number of Canadian and United States vessels carrying grain during the week was 28 Canadian and 8 United States.

The distribution of the vessel shipments was as follows:- To Lower Lake ports consisting of Port Colborne, Prescott, Kingston and Toronto 1,463,522 bushels; to Georgian Bay and Lake Huron ports 492,171 bushels, to Montreal 335,424 bushels; to Sorel 203,000 bushels of which 108,000 bushels were lightered at Prescott; to Quebec 222,100 bushels of which 110,000 bushels were lightered at Prescott; to Buffalo 1,212,570 bushels and to other United States lake ports 733,024 bushels.

For the corresponding period in 1931 the amount shipped by vessel from Head of the Lakes was 3,259,866 bushels, of which the distribution was as follows:- To Buffalo 1,494,250 bushels; To Lower Lake ports 1,375,784 bushels; To Montreal 377,512 bushels and to Sorel 12,320 bushels

#### Inspections

Car inspections of wheat during the week ended August 7, were 1,359 cars less than the previous week, but 177 cars more than the same week last year. By inspection points the number of cars reported were as follows:- Winnipeg 832 cars; Calgary 107 cars; Moose Jaw 20 cars; Saskatoon 27 cars; Medicine Hat 7 cars; Vancouver 1 car and Edmonton 107 cars. The total car inspections for the week ended August 7, were 1,101 cars compared with 2,460 cars for the previous week and 924 cars for the same week in 1931. Gradings show that 984 cars of the first amount were placed in the first four grades and 32 cars tough and damp. During the same week in 1931, 571 cars were graded in the contract grades and 259 cars tough and damp. In addition 12 cars of new crop wheat were reported.

#### Exports

According to Customs Returns for the month of July 1932, 19,620,224 bushels of wheat were exported as compared with 12,004,817 bushels for the same month in 1931. For wheatflour, the amount exported was 446,379 barrels compared with 466,967 barrels for the same month in 1931. Reducing the wheatflour to bushels at  $4\frac{1}{2}$  bushels of wheat to the barrel of flour makes 21,628,930 bushels exported for July 1932, against 14,106,169 bushels for the corresponding month 1931.

Wheat exports for the crop year ended July 31, 1932 were 182,803,382 bushels as compared with 228,480,403 bushels for crop year 1931. Of the former amount 129,638,423 bushels were billed from Canadian seaboard ports and 48,691,666 bushels from United States ports to overseas countries. After making allowances for Canadian wheat rerouted from United States lake ports to Montreal, the revised movement is shown as follows:- Exports from Canadian ports 136,476,990 bushels and from United States ports 41,853,099 bushels.

#### Coarse Grain

Exports of Oats for the crop year ended July 31, 1932 are almost double those of the previous year, being 13,611,111 bushels and 7,822,022 bushels. Barley shows a slight reduction for the crop year 1932, compared with the crop year, 1931, the export being shown as 13,538,225 bushels for 1932 and 19,250,207 bushels for 1931. Rye exports show a gratifying increase, the amounts are shown as 9,047,138 bushels in 1932 and 2,089,847 bushels in 1931. Flaxseed exports were only 250,635 bushels in 1932 and 1,998,018 bushels in 1931.

Stocks of coarse grains in the elevators in Canada and United States for the week ended August 5 were as follows:- Oats 5,890,596 bushels; Barley 3,203,578 bushels; Flaxseed 1,263,720 bushels and Rye 5,160,170 bushels. For the corresponding week in 1931, the quantities in store were Oats 6,272,215 bushels; Barley 3,671,709 bushels; Flaxseed 1,280,182 bushels and Rye 5,585,412 bushels.

World Situation

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour for the week ending August 6th with comparative figures for last year are as follows. (Thousand bushels).

World shipments for the week ending August 6th, 1932, amounted to 8,012,000 bushels compared with 15,560,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from the Argentine amounted to 459,000 bushels compared with 1,241,000 bushels for the same week last year. During the past week no shipments were reported from Russia whereas in the same week last year 3,080,000 bushels were shipped.

Italy

The following cable was received from the International Institute of Agriculture: -

"Italy, based on reports at the end of June, wheat area on which harvest is expected this season amounts to 12,199,000 acres and the yield for the current year is forecasted at 252,976,244 bushels".

The 1931 Italian wheat crop is estimated at 248 million bushels.

Germany

The International Institute of Agriculture cables as follows:

"Germany, yield current year forecasted as follows:- wheat 189 million bushels (last year 156 million bushels); rye 320 million bushels (last year 262 million bushels); barley 150 million bushels (last year 139 million bushels); oats 424 million bushels (last year 427 million bushels)".

India

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics is in receipt of a cable from the Department of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics, Calcutta, India, which states that the 1931 production of wheat amounted to 331,463,221 bushels from 33,749,000 acres compared with 341,894,546 bushels from 32,189,000 acres in 1930.

Russia

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics received the following cable on August 8th from its correspondent in London dealing with crop prospects in Russia.

UKRAINE. - Autumn sown grains in northwest Ukraine, poor to fair; southwest and south-central, fairly good to poor; southeast, extremely poor. In Ukraine generally, winter wheat and rye good where seeded in time in good seedbed but much sown late and the amount of well prepared land is small. Winter wheat and rye harvest is much below 1931 when the southern half of Ukraine had good to very good harvest. Practically all spring sown crops poor to very poor, being short, thin and weed-choked due to late seeding on unprepared land. Very large areas of oats are smutty and not worth harvesting. Sugar beets very poor and weed smothered. Much caterpillar damage.

CRIMEA. - About the same crop as in 1931, with very good winter wheat where land well prepared but much land poorly prepared on which crops are fair to poor.

NORTHERN CAUCASUS. - Grain crops extremely poor compared to a record yield in 1931, considerable part of which was lost by late rains and bad harvesting. Very heavy winter kill due to hard frosts before snow and late seeding on unprepared land. Winter and spring crops weed choked and hence heavy loss of grain by combining. Winter and spring wheat subjected to extremely heavy losses by heavy stem rust infection. Quality of all wheat poor to very poor and badly shrunk by rust and bleached by heavy frequent July rains.

MIDDLE VOLGA. - Crops promising in early June but insufficient rain since that time must have considerably reduced prospects.

LOWER VOLGA. - Reports are conflicting but tend to confirm the statement that crops are poor to extremely poor. Insufficient rain and high temperatures were experienced during heading and filling periods.



WESTERN SIBERIA. - No rain or soil moisture at the beginning of June, but good rains since must have greatly improved prospects. It is highly probable, despite late seeding and unfavourable weather in some parts, that Volga (especially the middle area) and western Siberia have considerable better crops than in 1931 when the yield was extremely poor and virtually a complete failure in many parts.

URAL. - Good to very good rains and probably a better crop than 1931.

KAZAKSTAN. - Indications point to a poor crop on account of little rain and high temperatures.

GENERAL SUMMARY. - Grain exports are dependent upon the policy of the Soviet Government and the urgency of the need of foreign currency. Country needs all grains for food especially in view of the continued acute shortage of other foodstuffs. Vegetables are lacking for the winter months and at present vegetables constitute a large part of the diet as grain reserves, excepting army supplies from 1930 crops are consumed. The foregoing and other factors including a tremendous discrepancy between open market and collective prices, the freedom of peasants to sell on the open market after December and an acute shortage of manufactured goods to trade for grain, indicate unprecedented difficulties in collecting the government's share of the harvest. Much poorer crops than last year in areas around export outlets.

PROGRESS OF HARVESTING

The London correspondent of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics cabled on August 11th that the grain procuring campaign in Russia is not progressing in a satisfactory manner. Up to August 5th a total of 94,375,000 acres (45.2 per cent of sown acreage) had been harvested compared with 123,307,000 acres on the same date last year (57.4 per cent of the sown acreage). Of the total harvested to date, 24,216,000 acres were stocked and 8,895,000 acres were threshed.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 5th, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 5th, 1932, show a net decrease of 974,446 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- wheat 121,786,709, oats 5,890,596, barley 3,203,578, flax 1,263,720 and rye 5,160,170, a total of 137,304,773 bushels. Decreases are noted in oats of 381,619, barley 468,131, flax 16,462 and rye 425,242 bushels, while wheat shows an increase of 317,008 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 138,819,237 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 107,825,654, oats 3,775,219, barley 9,150,013, flax 793,131 and rye 12,275,220 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net increase of 1,285,919 bushels. Wheat and oats show increases of 1,421,396 and 11,666 bushels respectively, while decreases are noted in barley of 59,220, flax 13,604 and rye 74,319 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show an increase of 30,508 bushels, made up as follows: wheat 30,490 bushels and barley 18 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 185,859 bushels, made up as follows: wheat 124,601, oats 48,133 bushels and barley 13,125 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Stocks at this elevator are the same as for previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 2,977,552 bushels, made up as follows: wheat 2,316,469 bushels, oats 311,602 bushels, barley 320,527, flax 10,191 bushels and rye 18,763 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks are the same as for the previous week.

IN TRANSIT - LAKES. - Grain in transit shows a net decrease of 504,959 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 123,004, barley 26,000 and rye 579,673 bushels, while oats shows an increase of 223,718 bushels.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - LAKE PORTS. - Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 663,320 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 654,907 bushels, flax 3,914 bushels and rye 32,307 bushels, while oats and barley show decreases of 23,496 and 4,312 bushels respectively.

EASTERN ELEVATORS - SEABOARD PORTS (CANADIAN GRAIN). - Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 1,345,404 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,278,459 bushels, barley 88,945 bushels and rye 93,996 bushels, while oats shows a decrease of 115,991 bushels.






