CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Some of the outstanding features of the Canadian wheat situation during the week ending October 7 were:- Decreased marketings on the Prairie Provinces compared with previous week, a further increase in the export clearances from Canadian and United States ports and in the stocks of Canadian wheat in Canadian and United States elevators over those of a week ago.

Primary Movement

Deliveries of wheat to western country elevators and platform loadings for the week ending September 30, 1932, show a reduction from those of the previous week. The amount reported for the above week was 24,074,044 bushels as compared with 34,592,823 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1931, 10,659,371 bushels were marketed. For the first nine weeks of the crop year country deliveries of wheat amounted to 138,253,477 bushels as compared with 62,701,023 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to September 30, 1932 on the three prairie provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year: Manitoba 23,280,057 (12,417,162) bushels; Saskatchewan 76,521,385 (31,532,581) bushels; Alberta 38,452,035 (18,751,280) bushels.

Inspections

During the month of September 1932, 50,090 cars of wheat were inspected, of which 3,295 cars were old crop wheat. The grading shows that 91% was placed in the first four grades compared with 75% for the same month last year. For the two months ended September 1932, 70,534 cars were inspected against 29,121 cars a year ago. Inspections for the first week of October amounted to 10,914 cars compared with 3,923 cars a week ago.

Stocks in Store

Stocks of Canadian wheat in store in Canada and the United States elevators on October 7, increased over those of a week ago. The amount now shown stored is 209,230,663 bushels compared with 198,239,902 bushels for the previous week. The stocks for the corresponding week in 1931 amounted to 134,296,709 bushels. Largely increased stocks for the week are shown at Western Country Elevators, Head of the Lakes, interior terminal and eastern elevators. Lake ports, while smaller increases are noted at Vancouver, Churchill, and U.S. Seaboard ports. Wheat in transit shows a large decrease from the previous week amounting to 3,883,877 bushels.

Export clearances for the week ended October 7 show a further increase over the previous week, the amount reported shipped being 7,929,793 bushels, which is the highest since the crop year 1929-30. The previous week's movement amounted to 7,218,320 bushels compared with 3,575,896 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Increased export shipments are shown at all the ports except Montreal and the United States Atlantic Seaboard ports.

Montreal and Vancouver still maintain the lead as exporters shipping 22,959,203 and 10,641,103 bushels respectively.

Water Movement

Lake shipments of wheat from the Head of the Lakes for the week ended October 7, 1932 amounted to 6,565,562 bushels, compared with previous week when 14,614,056 bushels were reported. The distribution of the former amount (6,565,562 bushels) was as follows: to Lake Huron and Georgian Bay ports 2,802,992 bushels; to Port Colborne 557,743 bushels; to Montreal 155,350 bushels; to Quebec 20,000 bushels; and to Buffalo 3,029,477 bushels. Over half the wheat was destined to Canadian ports with the majority of the latter going to Lake Huron and Georgian Bay ports; the remainder was billed to Buffalo. For the same week in 1931, 4,994,395 bushels were shipped from the Head of the Lakes destined as follows:- to Buffalo 2,442,183 bushels; to Canadian Lower Lake ports 1,707,341 bushels; to Montreal 844,871 bushels.

Internal Movement

A reduction is shown in the receipts of wheat at the elevators in the Western Division as compared with the previous week, the amount being 39,819,461 bushels, against 55,545,449 bushels a week ago. The majority of the former amount was received at the western country elevators and the Head of the Lakes, the quantities being shown as 23,063,564 and 11,564,520 bushels respectively. The receipts at Vancouver were 2,562,809 bushels; at Interior, private & mill elevators 1,999,406 bushels; and at Churchill 629,162 bushels. Shipments from the above elevators totalled 25,633,254 bushels during the week, some 12,656,886 bushels less than a week ago. Principal shipments amounted to 14,681,922 bushels; from the western country elevators; 7,624,593 bushels by vessel from the Head of the Lakes; and export shipments from Vancouver were 1,840,531 bushels. In the Eastern Division 10,039,530 bushels and 466,229 bushels were received by vessel and rail respectively at the eastern elevators while 4,537,791 bushels were cleared for export from the ports of Montreal and Sorel. The movement by vessel from the Lower Lake ports to Montreal was shown as 2,584,221 bushels.

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour for the week ending October 10, 1932, amounted to 15,073,000 bushels compared with 13,709,000 bushels for the previous week and 17,464,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments of wheat and wheatflour showed an increase of over 2 million bushels for the week, amounting to 10,406,000 bushels compared with 8,426,000 bushels for the previous week. Argentine shipments continued small amounting to only half a million bushels. Australian shipments showed an increase for the week, amounting to 2,316,000 bushels. Russian clearances were lower, amounting to 1 million bushels.

World shipments for the ten weeks ending October 10th, amounted to 100 million bushels compared with 162 million bushels for the same weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 62 million bushels compared with 63 million bushels for the same weeks last year. All other exporting countries show sharply decreased shipments this year compared with last year. For the first ten weeks of 1932-33 Russia has shipped 7.2 million bushels compared with 44.7 million bushels for the same weeks last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first nine weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 10.0 million bushels for the first ten weeks of 1932-33 compared with 16.2 and 15.4 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 6.2 million bushels per week this year as compared with 6.3 and 9.3 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.

Australia

The 1932 wheat acreage in Australia is estimated at 16.6 million acres compared with 15.7 million acres in 1931 and 18.2 million acres in 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Oct. 7, 1932 show a net increase of 12,092,296 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 209,230,663, Oats 7,950,857, Barley 5,926,072, Flax 1,455,288, and Rye 5,179,142 a total of 229,742,052 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 11,062,537, Oats 920,327, Barley 176,679, and Flax 93,152 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 150,399 bushels. For the same period last year the amount in store was 167,693,944 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 134,296,709, Oats 8,877,892, Barley 11,311,773, Flaxseed 985,528 and Rye 12,222,042 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show an increase of 9,088,018 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 8,011,403, Oats 738,011, Barley 151,281, Flax 149,746, and Rye 37,577 bushels.


PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Wheat shows a decrease of 377,814 bushels.


