CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

During the week ended October 21, some of the outstanding features of the Canadian wheat situation were - slightly increased export clearances and stocks of Canadian wheat in the elevators in Canada and the United States over those of the previous week, together with reduced marketings in the Prairie Provinces from a week ago.

Primary Movement

Deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and platform loadings for the week ended October 14, 1932 declined from those of the previous week. The amount reported for the above week was 17,751,512 bushels as compared with 26,341,535 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1931, 18,185,510 bushels were marketed.

For the first eleven weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 182,349,524 bushels, as compared with 98,049,995 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to October 14, 1932 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year: - Manitoba,25,178,208 (14,673,601) bushels; Saskatchewan 101,011,487 (50,294,617) bushels; and Alberta 56,159,829 (33,081,777) bushels.

Inspections

For the week ended October 21, 1932, 6,550 cars were inspected in the Western Division, a reduction of 1,694 cars from the previous week, when 8,244 cars passed inspection. During the corresponding week in 1931, 8,165 cars were graded.

The gradings show that 6,039 cars or 92 per cent of the 6,550 cars were placed in the contract grades, and only 71 cars tough and damp. For the same week last year, 6,307 cars or 77 per cent were graded No. 3 Northern or better while 1,430 cars were tough and damp.

Stocks in Store

Stocks of Canadian wheat in Canada and the United States on October 21 show a further increase over the previous week. The amount now shown in store is 229,317,996 bushels compared with 222,267,357 bushels a week ago. For the same week in 1931, 153,850,824 bushels were reported in store. Increases are shown in all the elevators except those at the Head of the Lakes, Vancouver, Eastern Lake and United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports. The in-transit wheat decreased 1,716,438 bushels from the previous week. Over twice the quantity of Canadian wheat is in store in the Eastern elevators in comparison with the same week of last year.

Export Clearances

Export clearances for the week ending October 21 increased slightly over those of the previous week, the amount reported cleared for export being 7,060,838 bushels as compared with 6,944,766 bushels a week ago. Clearances from Vancouver exceed those of the previous week by 962,546 bushels, and Montreal increased 1ts export by 296,751 bushels. The total export movement for the week and the twelve weeks ended October 21 were almost twice as large as those of the corresponding periods a year ago.



Water Movement

Lake shipments of wheat from the Head of the Lakes were reduced to less than half the previous week's movement. The quantity reported shipped was 4,083,592 bushels compared with 8,871,451 bushels for the previous week. The distribution of the former amount was as follows:— to Georgian Bay&Lake Huron ports 1,752,004 bushels; to Lower Lake ports of Port Colborne, Toronto & Kingston 902,393 bushels: to Montreal 218,304 tushels and to Buffalo 1,210,991 bushels. Over half the movement was destined to Canadian ports, the balance going to Puffalo. During the same week in 1931, 6,724,552 bushels were shipped from the Head of the makes destined as follows:— to Buffalo 2,742,675 bushels; to Lower Lake ports 2,741,834 bushels; to Montreal 1,229,530 bushels and to Quebec 10,513 bushels.

Internal Movement

A further reduction is shown in the receipts of wheat at the elevators in the Western Division as compared with the previous week, the amount being 28,513,655 bushels against 32,341,447 bushels a week ago. As in the previous week the majority of the former amount was received at the western country elevators and the Head of the Lakes, the quantities being shown as 17,087,620 bushels and 4,576,339 bushels respectively. The receipts at Vancouver were 3,386,071 bushels; at Interior public and semi-public, private and mill elevators 2,790,666 bushels; at Churchill 559,301 bushels and Victoria 113,658 bushels. Shipments from the above elevators totalled 21,079,335 bushels, 6,925,286 bushels less than the previous week. Principal shipments amounted to 10,759,432 bushels from the western country elevators; 5,514,989 bushels by vessel from the Head of the Lakes and export shipments from Vancouver were 3,510,817 bushels. In the Lastern Mivision 5,511,036 bushels and 548,670 bushels were received by vessel and rail respectively at the eastern elevators, while 3,198,921 bushels were cleared for export from the ports of Montreal and Sorel. The movement by vessel from Lower Lake ports to Montreal was shown as 1,336,817 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending October 25 amounted to 12,819,000 bushels compared with shipments of 11,593,000 bushels for the week previous and shipments of 19,064,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments increased by over 2 million bushels as compared with the week ending October 17th, Argentine shipments were about 900,000 bushels higher than during the previous week. Australian shipments and Russian shipments were sharply lower than during the previous week.

From August 1, 1932 to October 25, 1932, world shipments of wheat and wheatflour smounted to 125 million bushels compared with shipments of 197 million bushels for the same period last year. North American shipments for the above period were about 2 million bushels higher than last year. Australian shipments were moderately lower than for the same period last year while Russia has only shipped 8 million bushels compared with 52 million bushels during the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twelve weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 10.5 million bushels for the first ten weeks of 1932-33 compared with 16.5 and 15.8 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 6.6 million bushels per week this year as compared with 6.5 and 9.0 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.

RUSSIA

The London correspondent of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics cabled on October 27th that up to October 20th 48 per cent of the yearly collection plan for grains had been fulfilled. The monthly plan had been fulfilled as follows:-

NEW WESTMINSTER EXEVATOR .- Grain in store remained the same as previous week.


