CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

During the week ended October 23, some of the outstanding features of the Canadian wheat situation were: - decreased export clearances,: : reduced marketings in the Prairie Provinces from a week ago, together with increased stocks of Canadian wheat in the elevators in Canada and the United States over the previous week.

Primary Movement.

Deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and platform loadings for the week ending October 21, 1932. show a further reduction from those of the previous week. The amount reported for the above week was 17,008,586 bushels as compared with 17,751,512 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1931, 19,335,715 bushels were marketed.

For the first twelve weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 199,358,110 bushels as compared with 117,386,710 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to October 21, 1032 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:— Manitoba 25,684,731 (15,613,976) bushels; Saskatchewan 110,788,509 (59,421,546) bushels; and Alberta 62,884,870 (42,351,188) bushels.

Inspections.

For the period from October 21 to October 31, 1932, 8,267 cars were inspected in the Western Division, an increase of 1,717 cars over the previous week, when 6,550 cars passed inspection. Iuring the corresponding week in 1931, 14,684 cars were graded.


The gradings for the period monthst 7,632 cars or 92 per cent of the 8,257 cars were placed in the contract grades, and 174 cars tough and damp. For the same week last year 11,864 cars or 81 per cent were graded No. 3 Northern or hetter, while 1,817 cars were tough and damp.

Stocks in Store.

Stocks of Canadian wheat in Canada and the United States on October 28, increased still further over the previous week. The amount now shown in store is 236,531,056 bushels compared with 232,055,456 bushels a week ago. For the same week in 1931, 163,132,738 bushels were reported in store. Increases are shown in all the elevators except those at the Head of the Lakes and the Interior private and mill elevators. The in-transit wheat increased 1,126,048 bushels over the previous week. The wheat in storage in the eastern elevators amounts to 32,859,860 bushels compared with 15,976,334 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago.

Export Clearances.

Export clearances for the week ending October 28. decreased sharply from those of the previous week, the amount reported cleared for export being 5,279,666 bushels compared with 7,060,838 mishels a week ago. The only ports showing increases over the previous week were Sorel and the United States Atlantic Seaboard ports. The total export invenent for the week, however, is well in advance of the same week in 1931, while for the thirteen weeks ended October 28, 1932 the clearances are 29,567,091 bushels over those of the same period a year ago.



Internal Movement.

Slightly less wheat was received at the elevators in the Western Division as compared with the previous week, the amount being 25,344,151 bushels against 28,513,655 bushels a week ago. The majority of the above 25,344,151 bushels was received at the Western country elevators and the Head of the Lakes, the quantities recorded being 16,389,632 bushels and 4,112,224 bushels respectively. The receipts at Vancouver were 2,356,945 bushels; at Interior public and Femi-public, private and Mill elevators 1,965,561 bushels; at Churchill 290,013 bushels and Victoria 229,776 bushels. Principal shipments amounted to 9,505,043 bushels from Western country elevators; 7,475,855 bushels by vessel from the Head of the Lakes; and export shipments from Vancouver were 2,234,184 bushels. In the Eastern Division 5,200,656 bushels and 208,657 bushels were received by Vessel and rail respectively at the Eastern elevators, while 2,353,482 bushels were cleared for export from the ports of Montreal and Sorel. The inland movement by vessel from Lower Lake ports to Montreal was 1,249,599 bushels.

Water Movement .

Lake shipments of wheat from the Head of the Lakes for the period from October 22 to October 31 amounted to 8,948,315 bushels. During the previous week the movement was 4,083,692 bushels. The distribution of the former amount was ax follows:- to Georgian Bay and Lake Huron borts 1,896,973 bushels; to Lower Lake ports of Port Colborne, Toronto and Kingston 1,947,206 bushels; to Montreal 395,497 bushels; to Sorel 119,000 bushels; to Buffalo 4,116,708 bushels and to other United States ports 472,931 bushels. During the same period in 1931, 7,029,274 bushels were shipped from the Head of the Lakes, distributed as follows:- to Buffalo 3,904,874 bushels; to Lower Lake ports 2,249,786 bushels; to Montreal 451,657 bushels; to Sorel 390,471 bushels, and to Prescott 32,486 bushels.



World Situation

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour for the week ending November 2 amounted to 9,927,000 bushels compared with 12,819,000 bushels for the previous week and 14,584,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments dropped sharply for the week amounting to 5,709,000 bushels. Shipments from the Argentine were less than one half of the total for the preceding week. Australian shipments showed a moderate increase. Russian shipments continued small and were not an important factor in the market.

From August 1, 1932, to November 2, 1932, world shipments of wheat and wheatflour amounted to 134 million bushels compared with 212 million bushels for the same period last year. North American shipments remain as large as last year while all other exporting countries show sharp reductions in clearances for the first thirteen weeks of 1932-33 compared with the same weeks of 1931-32. Russian shipments amounted to only 8 million bushels compared with 54 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirteen weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.



As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 10.3 million bushels for the first thirteen weeks of 1932-33 compared with 16.3 and 15.7 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 6.5 million bushels per week this year as compared with 6.5 and 8.8 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.

Russia

The London correspondent of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics cables that up to October 25, a total of 85 million acres of grain had been sown as compared with a total of 87 million acres on the same date last year. To date 84.5 per cent of the fall sowing plan has been completed. Grain collections continue light. The following table shows the percentage fulfillment of the monthly grain collection plan:-

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 28, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 28, 1932 show a net increase of 6,885,869 bushels over the previous week. Increases are noted in Wheat of 7,213,060 bushels and Flaxseed of 103,209 bushels, while decreases occurred in Oats of 23,641 bushels, Barley 132,526 bushels and Rye 265,233 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 236,531,056 bushels, Oats 8,313,698 bushels, Barley 5,384,824 bushels, Flaxseed 1,436,761 bushels and Rye 5,252,335 bushels. For the same week a year ago the quantity in store was: Wheat 163,132,738 bushels, Oats 10,863,788 bushels, Barley 11,274,138 bushels, Flaxseed 1,587,839 bushels and Rye 13,023,895 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Stocks in these elevators show an increase of 6,247,500 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 6,042,928 bushels, Oats 68,074 bushels, Barley 13,370 bushels, Flaxseed 96,385 bushels and Rye 26,743 bushels.
