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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

During the week ending November 4, some of the outstanding features of the Canadian wheat situation were slight increases in the export clearances and stocks over those of a week ago together with decreased marketings in the Prairie Provinces from the previous week.

Primary Movement

Wheat deliveries to the western country elevators and platform loadings for the week ending October 28, 1932, show a further reduction from those of the previous week. The amount reported for the above week was 15,643,563 bushels compared with 17,008,586 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding period in 1931, 16,003,775 bushels were marketed.

For the first thirteen weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 215,006,578 bushels as compared with 133,320,455 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to October 28, 1932 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:- Manitoba 26,231,349 (16,425,592) bushels; Saskatchewan 119,050,387 (67,245,751) bushels; and Alberta 66,724,942 (49,719,142) bushels.

Stocks in Store.

Stocks of Canadian wheat in Canada and the United States on November 4, 1932 increased slightly over those of the previous week the amount reported in store being 242,088,307 bushels compared with 239,434,997 bushels a week ago. For the same week in 1931, 170,642,297 bushels were reported in store. Increases are shown in all the elevators except those at Vancouver, interior and semi-public terminals and eastern elevator, seaboard ports. The in-transit wheat decreased 3,247,341 bushels from the previous week. One of the outstanding features is the large increase of 6,620,623 bushels in store in western country elevators over those a week ago.

Export clearances for the week ending November 4 increased by 1,089,095 bushels over those of a week ago, the amount reported cleared for export being 6,368,761 bushels compared with 5,279,666 bushels for the previous week. Vancouver was the only port to show an increase over the previous week when 3,369,021 bushels were reported exported against 2,151,628 bushels for the same week in 1931. For the fourteen weeks ending November 4, 29,306,038 bushels more wheat were cleared than for the same period last year.

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour for the week ending November 7 amounted to 14,491,000 bushels compared with 9,927,000 bushels for the previous week and 18,560,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments increased sharply amounting to 8,734,000 bushels compared with 6,709,000 bushels for the previous week. North American shipments were considerably lower than for the corresponding week last year. Argentine shipments remained small and were of the same volume as shipments of the preceding week. Australian shipments increased by over one million bushels while Russian shipments amounted to 1,536,000 bushels, the largest shipments from this source during the past month.

From August 1, 1932 to November 7, 1932, world shipments of wheat and wheatflour amounted to 148 million bushels compared with 230 million bushels for the same period last year. North American shipments this year are about the same as for the same period last year while all other exporting countries show sharp reductions in the total outward movement of wheat. To date in the present crop year the Argentine has shipped 10 million bushels compared with 20 million bushels during the same period last year; Australia has shipped 21 million bushels compared with 25 million bushels last year; Russia has shipped 10 million bushels compared with 55 million bushels last year and shipments from the Danube have been very small this year compared with a heavy movement during the early months of the past crop year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first fourteen weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 10.6 million bushels for the first fourteen weeks of 1932-33 compared with 16.5 and 15.9 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 6.7 million bushels per week this year as compared with 6.8 and 5.9 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31. Weekly shipments of Russian wheat have averaged .7 million bushels per week this year compared with an average of 4.0 million bushels during the first fourteen weeks of 1931-32. Argentine shipments have averaged .7 million bushels per week compared with an average of 1.4 million bushels per week during the same period in 1931-32.



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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 4, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 4, 1932, show a net increase of 5,828,436 bushels over the previous week. Increases are noted in wheat of 5,557,251 bushels; oats 204,266 bushels and flaxseed 116,919 bushels while decreases occurred in barley of 177,720 bushels and rye 192,512 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- wheat 242,038,307 bushels, oats 8,517,964 bushels; barley 5,207,104 bushels, flaxseed 1,553,680 bushels and rye 5,059,823 bushels. For the same week a year ago the quantity in store was wheat 170,642,297 bushels, oats 12,112,545 bushels; barley 10,608,134 bushels, rye 1,716,714 bushels, and rye 12,262,584 bushels.

**Western Country Elevators.** A net increase is shown in stocks of 6,702,978 bushels. Increases are shown in wheat of 6,620,623 bushels, oats 26,927 bushels, flaxseed 46,288 bushels and rye 12,336 bushels while barley shows a decrease of 3,196 bushels.

**INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).** Stocks for the week ending Nov. 4 show a net decrease of 510,032 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat 509,981 bushels, barley 375, bushels, while an increase is shown in oats of 324 bushels.

**VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.** - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 1,275,124 bushels. The increases were oats 154,961, flax 73 and rye 2,346 bushels while the decreases were wheat 1,427,124 and barley 5,380 bushels.

**PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.** - Stock remains the same as previous week.

**VICTORIA ELEVATOR.** - Shows an increase of 115,911 the total amount being in wheat.

**PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).** - A net increase of 994,685 bushels is shown. The increases are shown in wheat 997,623 bushels, barley 29,438 bushels and flax 40,230 bushels while the decreases are as follows: Oats 66,519, rye 5,087 bushels.

**NEW WESTMINSTER.** - Stocks remain same as previous week.

**CHURCHILL.** - A net increase of 94,612 bushels is shown in wheat.

**IN TRANSIT LAKES.** - A net decrease of 3,477,094 is shown. The decreases noted were wheat 3,248,341 bushels, oats 42,177 bushels, barley 192,006 bushels while an increase shown is flax 5,430 bushels.




