CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

During the week ending November 11th some of the outstanding features of the Canadian wheat situation were slight reductions in the wheat clearances and a marked decrease in the marketings in the Prairie Provinces from <sup>the</sup> previous week together with slightly increased stocks of wheat in the elevators over those of a week ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat deliveries to the western country elevators for the week ending November 4th and platform loadings during the period from October 21st to 31st, amounted to 10,948,339 bushels compared with 15,648,568 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding weeks in 1930 and 1931, 13,625,180 and 13,430,621 bushels were marketed respectively.

For the first fourteen weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 225,955,017 bushels as compared with 146,809,073 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to November 4th, 1932 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:-- Manitoba 26,466,062 (16,921,576) bushels; Saskatchewan 124,319,472 (72,699,819) bushels; and Alberta 75,169,483 (57,187,678) bushels.

Inspections

For the week ending November 7th, 1932, the inspections of wheat in the Western Division dropped to almost half of those of the same week in 1931. The inspections during the week were 4,657 cars compared with 8,267 cars for the previous ten-day period to October 31st. During the corresponding week in 1931, 9,170 cars were graded.

The gradings for the week ended November 7th, 1932 show 3,995 cars or 83 per cent of the 4,657 cars were placed in contract grades while 30 cars <sup>were</sup> tough and damp. For the same week a year ago 7,408 cars or 80 per cent were graded No. 3 Northern or better and 1,067 cars were tough and damp.

Stocks in Store

Canadian wheat stocks in Canada and the United States on November 11th, 1932 showed a further increase over the previous week, the amount reported in store being 242,943,768 bushels compared with 242,304,042 bushels a week ago. For the same week in 1931, 176,186,462 bushels were reported in store. There were no outstanding increases in stocks in any of the elevators over the previous week. The in-transit wheat decreased 254,713 bushels from the previous week.

Export Clearances

Export clearances for the week ending November 11th, 1932, decreased slightly from those of the previous week, the amount reported cleared for export being 6,241,786 bushels compared with 6,368,761 bushels for the previous week and 3,878,895 bushels for the corresponding week in 1931. For the fifteen weeks ending November 11, 78,658,846 bushels were cleared compared with 46,431,001 bushels for the same period last year.

Water Movement

Lake shipments of wheat from the Head of the Lakes for the week ending November 7th, 1932 amounted to 4,750,205 bushels, of which distribution was as follows:- to Georgian Bay and Lake Huron ports 1,287,244 bushels; to Lower Lake ports of Pt. Colborne, Prescott and Kingston 1,016,952 bushels; to Montreal 269,435 bushels; to Sorel 278,000 bushels; to Quebec 10,000 bushels and to Buffalo 1,888,574 bushels. During the same week in 1931, 5,966,349 bushels were shipped from the Head of the Lakes distributed as follows:- to Lower Lake ports 2,009,788 bushels; to Buffalo 3,509,620 bushels; to Montreal 358,941 bushels; and to Sorel 88,000 bushels.

Wheat Exports

According to the Canadian Customs returns 40,192,415 bushels of wheat were exported from Canada during the month of October 1932 of which 26,119,090 bushels were billed from Canadian seaboard ports and 14,073,325 bushels via United States ports. During the above month 4,367,400 bushels were re-routed from United States lake ports to Canadian ports which would increase the Canadian movement to 30,486,490 bushels and reduce the amount exported via United States ports by a corresponding amount making 9,705,925 bushels exported via United States ports. During the three months ended October 31, 1932 according to Customs returns Canadian wheat exports amounted to 85,356,484 bushels compared with 45,170,048 bushels for the same period in 1931. The former amount left Canada via the following ports:- from Canadian seaboard ports 55,884,307 bushels and via United States 29,472,057 bushels. Making the adjustment for the wheat re-routed from United States lake ports to Canadian ports, which amounted to 7,302,066 bushels, would increase the Canadian export movement to 63,186,373 bushels and decrease the United States export to 22,169,991 bushels for the above period. Coarse grain exports were as follows for the three months ended October 31:- oats 3,990,512 bushels compared with 2,530,087 bushels for the same period in 1931; barley 3,034,641 bushels against 4,266,147 bushels in 1931; rye 2,024,099 bushels against 700,290 bushels in 1931; and flaxseed 362,578 bushels against 61,500 bushels in 1931. Wheatflour exports amounted to 1,244,289 barrels in 1932 compared with 1,637,202 barrels in 1931. For details of the export movement see pages 19 to 27.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 11, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 11, 1932, show a net increase of 691,044 bushels over the previous week. Increases are noted in Wheat of 855,461 bushels, Barley 18,177 bushels, and Flaxseed 138,918 bushels, while decreases are shown in Oats of 153,617 bushels, and Rye 167,895 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 242,943,768 bushels, Oats 3,364,347 bushels, Barley 5,225,281 bushels, Flaxseed 1,692,598 bushels, and Rye 4,871,928 bushels. For the same week a year ago the quantity in store was: Wheat 176,186,462 bushels, Oats 12,009,451 bushels, Barley 10,453,667 bushels, Flaxseed 1,739,147 bushels, and Rye 12,400,460 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS--An increase is shown in these elevators of 3,771,124 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 3,661,534 bushels, Oats 60,229 bushels, Barley 39,181 bushels, Flaxseed 438 bushels and Rye 9,742 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a new decrease of 905,623 bushels. Wheat decreased 905,976 bushels, and Oats increased 353 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 237,089 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 279,214 bushels, and Flaxseed 64 bushels, while Oats and Barley decreased 28,192, and 13,991 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Stocks remained the same as the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Stocks show an increase of 124,795 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 124,683 bushels, and Oats 112 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 865,819 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat and Rye of 830,116, and 198,618 bushels respectively, while increases are noted in Oats of 89,737 bushels, Barley 31,669 bushels, and Flaxseed 41,709 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks increased 52,648 bushels.

IN TRANSIT - Lakes.- Grain in transit shows a net decrease of 545,758 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 254,713 bushels; Oats 378,375 bushels, and Barley 68,209 bushels, while increases are shown in Flaxseed and Rye of 95,726 and 59,813 bushels respectively.


