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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

During the week ending November 18th, some of the outstanding features of the Canadian wheat situation were slightly increased wheat clearances over the previous week and decreases in the marketings in the Prairie Provinces and the stocks of wheat in the elevators.

Primary Movement

Wheat deliveries to the western country elevators and platform loadings for the week ending November 11th, 1932 decreased slightly from the previous week. The amount reported for the above week was 9,557,241 bushels compared with 10,948,339 bushels a week ago. During the corresponding weeks in 1930 and 1931, 13,441,911 and 9,591,016 bushels were marketed respectively.

For the first fifteen weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 235,512,258 bushels as compared with 160,239,694 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to November 11th, 1932 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:- Manitoba 26,905,062 (17,749,124) bushels; Saskatchewan 128,844,723 (78,484,884) bushels; and Alberta 79,762,473 (64,005,686) bushels.

Inspections

During the weeks ending November 14th and 21st, 1932, 4,982 and 4,349 cars of wheat were inspected in the Western Division. This compares with 9,008 and 6,604 cars respectively for the same week in 1931.

The gradings for the week ending November 14th show that 4,210 cars were placed in the first four grades and 341 cars tough and damp which compared with 7,018 cars in the contract grades and 1,215 cars tough and damp for the same week in 1931. During the week ending November 21st, 3,604 cars graded in No. 3 Northern and better with 345 cars tough and damp. For the corresponding week in 1931, 4,781 cars were placed in the top grades with 1,205 cars tough and damp.

Stocks in Store

Canadian wheat stocks in Canada and the United States on November 18th, 1932 decreased slightly from those of a week ago. The amount reported in store was 238,810,174 bushels compared with 241,487,070 bushels, the revised figure of the previous week. For the corresponding week in 1931, 181,767,541 bushels were reported in store. Large decreases are shown in stocks at the Head of the Lakes, eastern elevators, seaboard ports and United States lake ports. The in-transit wheat decreased 1,170,662 bushels from the previous week.

Water Movement

Lake shipments of wheat from the Head of the Lakes for the week ending November 14th, 1932 amounted to 2,894,537 bushels, the distribution of which was as follows: to Georgian Bay and Lake Huron ports 506,000 bushels; to Lower Lake ports of Pt. Colborne, Prescott, and Kingston 608,496 bushels; to Montreal 195,175 bushels; to Buffalo 1,533,001 bushels and Europe (direct) 51,865 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1931, 6,480,972 bushels were shipped from the Head of the Lakes distributed as follows:- to Buffalo 3,880,035 bushels; to Canadian Lower Lake ports 3,899,019 bushels; to Montreal 360,394 bushels; and to Sorel 172,200 bushels.

Export Clearances

Export clearances for the week ending November 18th, 1932 increased slightly from those of the previous week, the amount reported cleared for export being 6,968,759 bushels compared with 6,241,786 bushels for the previous week and 4,638,020 bushels for the corresponding week in 1931. For the sixteen weeks ending November 18th, 85,568,689 bushels were cleared compared with 51,069,021 bushels for the same period last year.

Destination of Canadian Wheat Exports

During the month of October, according to Customs returns, the exports of wheat amounted to 40,192,415 bushels of which 30,368,085 bushels were destined to Empire countries and 9,324,330 bushels to Foreign countries. Of the former amount 29,241,952 bushels were destined to Great Britain; 91,875 bushels to Irish Free State; 23,848 bushels to British South Africa and the balance 410 bushels, to British West Indies.

The chief countries making up the foreign export were: Netherlands 2,566,915 bushels; Belgium 2,057,125 bushels; China 1,929,673 bushels; Germany 1,503,547 bushels; and France 1,163,956 bushels while the remainder was made up of smaller amounts to other foreign countries.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 18, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 18, 1932, show a net increase of 4,396,894 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:-Wheat 238,810,174; Oats 8,181,139; Barley 5,356,240; Flaxseed 1,524,850, and Rye 4,848,625; a total of 258,721,028 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 4,133,594 bushels, Oats 183,208 bushels; Flaxseed 167,748 bushels, and Rye 43,303 bushels, while Barley increased 130,959 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was Wheat 181,767,541 bushels; Oats 12,604,021 bushels; Barley 10,598,354 bushels; Flaxseed 1,563,147 bushels, and Rye 12,305,909 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- A net increase is shown in the grain stocks of 1,078,060 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,157,300 bushels; Barley 64,896 bushels; Flaxseed 8,123 bushels, and Rye 17,049 bushels, while Oats decreased 169,308 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS).- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 518,761 bushels. Oats increased 10,354 bushels, while wheat decreased 529,115 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 1,077,291. Increases are noted in Wheat of 901,310 bushels, Oats 173,310 bushels, and Barley 2,868 bushels, while Rye decreased 197 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Stocks remain same as previous week.

NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATOR.- Stocks remain same as previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- An increase of 225,061 bushels was shown in Wheat over the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- A decrease of 2,480,617 was shown. Wheat 2,155,251 bushels; Oats 131,756 bushels; Barley 28,303 bushels; Flax 106,255 bushels, and Rye 59,052 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR - Stocks increased 7,616 bushels.

IN TRANSIT, LAKES.- Grain in-transit shows a net decrease of 1,275,353 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,170,662 bushels; Oats 105,923 bushels and Flaxseed 79,125 bushels, while Barley and Rye increased 75,010, and 5,347 bushels, respectively.




