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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

For the week ended December 2, 1932 the Canadian wheat situation shows record export clearances from Canadian and United States ports with decreased marketings in the Prairie Provinces and decreased stocks of wheat in the elevators from the previous week.

Primary Movement

Wheat receipts at the western country elevators and platform loadings for the week ending November 25, 1932 decreased further from the previous week. The amount reported for the above week was 7,491,780 bushels compared with 9,319,945 bushels a week ago. During the same week in 1931, 5,231,366 bushels were marketed.

During the first seventeen weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 252,323,983 bushels as compared with 175,062,076 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to November 25, 1932 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:-- Manitoba 28,059,632 (18,793,829) bushels; Saskatchewan 136,669,296 (84,256,029) bushels; and Alberta 87,595,055 (72,012,218) bushels.

Inspections

Inspections in the western division during the week ended November 30 were 5,120 cars compared with 4,349 cars for the previous week and 4,938 for the same week in 1931. According to the gradings 4,202 cars were placed in the first four grades and 454 cars tough and damp. For the corresponding week in 1931, 3,614 cars were graded in the contract grades and 767 cars tough and damp.

Stocks in Store

Canadian wheat stocks in Canada and the United States on December 2, 1932 decreased slightly from the previous week. The amount reported in store for the above week was 236,324,516 bushels compared with 238,249,580 bushels the revised total for the previous week or a decrease of 1,915,064 bushels. For the corresponding week in 1931, 187,187,671 bushels were reported in store. Decreases are shown in all the elevator stocks from the previous week except in western country elevators, Prince Rupert elevator and in Canadian and United States Seaboard Elevators. One of the noteworthy features is the increased stocks in the Maritime ports over a week ago.

Wheat Clearances

The quantity of wheat cleared for export during the week ended December 1, 1932 was the largest for any week during the crop year 1930-31 and so far this year; the amount shipped was 8,988,059 bushels compared with 7,163,544 bushels a week ago. During the corresponding week in 1931, 4,142,702 bushels were reported. It will be seen that the amount moved this week was twice that for the same week in 1931. For the eighteen weeks ended December 1, 1932 clearances amounted to 101,720,292 bushels compared with 58,949,594 for the same period in 1931.

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour for the week ending December 5, 1932 amounted to 16,223,000 bushels compared with 12,770,000 bushels last week and 11,640,000 bushels for the same week last year. Shipments for the week ending December 5 were the largest of the present crop year and exceeded shipments of the corresponding week last year by $4\frac{1}{2}$ million bushels.

North American shipments amounted to 12,791,000 bushels compared with 8,932,000 bushels last week and 7,128,000 bushels for the same week last year. North American shipments were the largest of the crop year to date. Shipments from Australia, the Argentine and Russia declined slightly.

From August 1, 1932 to December 5, 1932 world shipments of wheat and wheatflour amounted to 202 million bushels compared with 286 million bushels for the same period last year. North American shipments amounted to 131 million bushels compared with 126 million bushels last year. Shipments from the Argentine during the first eighteen weeks of the present crop year amounted to 14 million bushels compared with 24 million bushels for the same period last year. Australian shipments to date are about the same as last year. Since August 1 Russian shipments have amounted to 13 million bushels compared with 62 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first eighteen weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 11.2 million bushels for the first eighteen weeks of 1932-33 compared with 15.9 and 16.0 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 7.3 million bushels per week this year as compared with 7.0 and 8.4 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 2nd, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 2, 1932 show a net increase of 376,031 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 236,324,516 bushels, Oats 9,081,947 bushels; Barley 5,937,187 bushels; Flaxseed 1,577,746 bushels; Rye 4,765,751 bushels; a total of 257,687,147 bushels. Oats and Barley show increases of 428,895 and 369,302 bushels while decreases are noted in Wheat of 255,533 bushels, Flaxseed 5,411 bushels and Rye 161,222 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was as follows: Wheat 187,187,671 bushels; Oats 14,216,091 bushels; Barley 10,780,827 bushels; Flaxseed 1,640,191 bushels and Rye 12,146,960 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show an increase of 2,747,536 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 2,565,842 bushels; Barley 211,532 bushels; and Rye 17,112 bushels while Oats and Flaxseed decreased 43,951 and 2,999 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 78,375 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 253,174 bushels while Oats and Barley increased 114,100 and 60,699 bushels, respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show an increase of 90,099 bushels over the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks decreased 266,402 bushels from a week ago.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 706,764 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 749,405 bushels; Barley 5,677; Oats 104,620; and Rye 77,698 bushels while Oats increased 230,646 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Stocks in this elevator remained the same as the previous week.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit show a net decrease of 787,803 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 543,480 bushels, Oats 260,462 bushels and Rye 105,000 bushels while Barley and Flaxseed increased 11,719 and 109,600 bushels respectively.

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
