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

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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

During the week ending December 23, 1932, a substantial increase is shown in the wheat clearances compared with those a week ago, while reductions are noted in the elevator stocks and the receipts at the western country elevators from those of the previous week.

Primary Movement

A sharp reduction took place in the wheat receipts at the western country elevators and over the loading platforms during the week ending December 16, 1932. The amount reported for the above week was 3,848,020 bushels compared with 6,633,350 bushels a week ago. During the corresponding week in 1931, 4,973,397 bushels were marketed.

During the first twenty weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 270,077,947 bushels as compared with 190,959,556 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to December 16, 1932 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:- Manitoba 29,270,797 (19,714,907) bushels; Saskatchewan 143,592,109 (89,476,146) bushels; and Alberta 97,215,041 (81,768,503) bushels.

Stocks in Store

Wheat stocks in Canada and United States during the week ending December 23, 1932 amounted to 236,104,389 bushels, a slight decrease from the previous week when 236,876,992 bushels were reported in store. For the corresponding week in 1931 wheat stocks amounted to 191,009,332 bushels. Decreases are shown in the elevators at Vancouver and Canadian and United States lake ports, also at the private and mill elevators. Corresponding increases are noted at western country, the head of the lakes and Canadian seaboard ports.

Export Clearances

Export clearances increased 1,718,701 bushels over those of the previous week and represent twice the quantity shipped for the same week in 1931.

World shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the week ending December 26, 1932, amounted to 11,174,000 bushels compared with 11,398,000 bushels for the preceding week and 12,432,000 bushels for the same week last year. The feature of the week was the increase in shipments from the Argentine. Australian shipments were slightly above the previous week.

From August 1, 1932 to December 26, 1932, world shipments of wheat amounted to 235 million bushels compared with 322 million bushels for the same period last year. During the same period North American shipments have exceeded those of last year by about 9 million bushels.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twenty-one weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 11.2 million bushels for the first twenty-one weeks of 1932-33 compared with 15.3 and 15.4 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 7.2 million bushels per week this year as compared with 6.7 and 8.0 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 23, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 23, 1932, show a net decrease of 180,249 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- wheat 236,104,589, oats 9,322,513, barley 6,629,823, flaxseed 1,420,595 and rye 4,979,264, a total of 255,456,334 bushels. Decreases are shown in wheat of 274,545, oats 111,343 and flaxseed 38,029 bushels, while increases are noted in barley of 172,204 bushels and rye 74,464 bushels. For the corresponding week in 1931, the amount in store was wheat 192,239,151, oats 15,293,409, barley 11,318,524, flaxseed 1,482,052 and rye 11,996,430, a total of 232,382,566 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks for the week show an increase of 985,248 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 682,435, oats 149,306, barley 100,877, flaxseed 6,762 and rye 15,808 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC ELEVS. Stocks for the week show a net increase of 8,462 bushels. Increases are noted in oats 8,196 bushels and barley 1,258 bushels, while wheat decreased 992 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 822,700 bushels. Increases are shown in wheat of 796,448 bushels, oats 19,973 bushels and rye 15,293 bushels while barley increased 9,014 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks remain same as the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks show a net increase of 80,172 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR). - Grain stocks show a net increase of 1,105,054 bushels, made up as follows:- wheat 931,047 bushels, oats 30,662 bushels, barley 125,671 bushels, flax 12,744 bushels and rye 4,930 bushels.
