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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

The Canadian wheat situation for the week ending January 5, 1933 shows decreases in marketings in the Prairie Provinces and stocks of Canadian wheat in Canadian and United States elevators, also reduced export clearances from those of a week ago.

Primary Movement

Another decrease is noted in the wheat receipts at the western country elevators and over the loading platforms during the week ending December 30, 1932 compared with the previous week. The amount reported for the above week was 2,052,868 bushels compared with 3,374,622 bushels a week ago. For the corresponding week in 1931, 2,101,691 bushels were marketed.

During the first twenty-two weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 275,505,437 bushels as compared with 196,459,256 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to December 30, 1932 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:- Manitoba 29,568,846 (20,017,553) bushels; Saskatchewan 145,582,997 (91,462,670) bushels; and Alberta 100,353,594 (84,979,033) bushels.

Stocks in Store

Canadian wheat stocks for the week ending January 6, 1933 decreased from those of the previous week. The amount shown in store for the above week was 236,336,608 bushels compared with 237,390,896 bushels for the previous week. For the corresponding week in 1932 wheat stocks amounted to 200,829,004 bushels. Large decreases in stocks took place at western country elevators, Vancouver, eastern elevators, lake ports and United States elevators, lake ports, while increases are noted at the Head of the Lakes and eastern elevators, seaport ports.

Export Clearances

Export clearances during the week ending January 5, 1933 show a decrease of 611,684 bushels from the previous week and 483,926 bushels from those of the same week a year ago. For the twenty-three weeks ending January 5, 1933 the movement shows an increase of 50,362,648 bushels over the same period last year.

World shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the week ending January 8, 1933, amounted to 11,590,000 bushels compared with 9,679,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,840,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Australian shipments increased sharply for the week amounting to 4,373,000 bushels compared with 2,589,000 a week ago. Shipments from North America decreased by about one million bushels as compared with the previous week and were lower than during the corresponding week last year.

From August 1, 1932 to January 8, 1933, world shipments amounted to 256 million bushels compared with 344 million bushels for the same period in 1931-32. North American shipments continue above last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twenty-three weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 11.1 million bushels for the first twenty-three weeks of 1932-33 compared with 15.0 and 14.9 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 6.9 million bushels per week this year as compared with 6.6 and 7.7 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 6, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 6, 1933 show a net decrease of 1,464,694 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: - Wheat 236,336,608, Oats 9,217,112, Barley 6,747,543, Flaxseed 1,449,434 and Rye 5,003,592 a total of 258,754,289 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,416,691, Oats 44,566 and Barley 35,978 bushels, while Flax and Rye show increases of 17,997 and 14,544 bushels respectively. For the same week last year the amount in store was 242,615,869 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 200,829,004, Oats 15,622,891, Barley 11,688,159, Flaxseed 1,450,665 and Rye 13,045,150 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTY ELEVATORS:-

Stocks in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 352,549 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 331,494, Oats 32,431 and Barley 5,856 bushels, while Flax and Rye show increases of 12,148, and 5,084 bushels respectively.






