CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

The Canadian wheat situation for the week ending January 13 1933 shows export clearances almost double those of a week ago, and a substantial decrease in the stocks from the previous week. The marketings in the Prairie Provinces increased slightly in volume over those of the former week.

Primary Movement

Increased receipts of wheat at the western country elevators and over the loading platforms are shown during the week ended January 6, 1932 compared with the previous week. The amount reported for the above week was 2,483,134 bushels against 2,052,868 bushels a week ago. For the corresponding week in 1931, 2,817,700 bushels were marketed.

During the first twenty-three weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 277,988,571 bushels as compared with 199,276,956 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to January 8, 1932 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:- Manitoba 29,657,039 (20,113,892) bushels; Saskatchewan 146,493,860 (92,332,724) bushels; and Alberta 101,837,672 (36,830,340) bushels.

Inspections

During the week ending January 14, 1933, 1,538 cars of wheat were inspected of which 1,518 cars were hard spring wheat. Of this latter amount 1,096 cars or 72.2% graded No. 3 Northern and better while 353 cars were placed in the tough and damp grades. For the same week in 1932, 1,366 cars were inspected, 1,020 or 74% grading in the contract grades and 326 cars tough and damp.

Stocks in Store

A substantial decrease is shown in the stocks of Canadian wheat in the elevators in Canada and United States for the week ending January 13, 1933 compared with the previous week. The amount reported in store for the above week was 231,200,967 bushels a reduction of 5,650,906 bushels from a week ago when 236,851,875 bushels were shown in store. For the corresponding week in 1932, 198,650,529 bushels were reported. Decreased stocks are shown in all the elevators except those at the Head of the Lakes and Victoria. An outstanding reduction is shown at the Vancouver elevators.

Export Clearances

Export clearances during the week ending January 13, 1933 were almost double those of the previous week, the majority of the export being from the Port of Vancouver, accounting for 4,018,411 bushels. For the same week a year ago clearances amounted to 2,665,098 bushels. An increase of 53,162,961 bushels is shown in the export movement for the twenty-four weeks ending January 13, 1933 compared with same period in 1932.

Exports

According to Customs Department figures the exports of wheat during the month of December 1932 amounted to 27,735,999 bushels compared with 27,301,976 bushels for the previous month and 22,355,975 bushels for the corresponding month a year ago. Of the export of 27,735,999 bushels 14,276,171 bushels were moved from Canadian Pacific ports; 12,146,612 bushels from Canadian Atlantic ports and only 1,313,216 bushels were billed via United States Atlantic ports of which 344,700 bushels were re-routed back into Canadian channels making a net movement to United States ports of 968,516 bushels. The export from Canadian ports would therefore be increased to 12,491,312 bushels.

For the five months ended December 31, 1932, 140,794,459 bushels were exported from Canada compared with 94,978,086 bushels for the same period in 1932. The following amounts were exported from Canada through the following Canadian ports:- Vancouver 43,553,159 bushels; Montreal 41,693,924 bushels; Sorel 9,437,876 bushels; Quebec 1,218,230 bushels; Prince Rupert 677,813 bushels; Victoria 596,121 bushels; Saint John 512,000 bushels; New Westminster 316,844 bushels; and North Sydney 84 bushels; making a total of 98,128,080 bushels. The amount billed via United States ports was 79,500,462 bushels. From this amount must be deducted 16,669,233 bushels re-routed back into Canadian ports making the movement 22,831,22 bushels which should pass through the United States Atlantic ports. The above re-routed wheat will have to be added to the exports from Canadian ports bringing the total to 114,797,313 bushels.

Oats exported during the month of December amounted to 1,433,865 bushels against 1,232,261 bushels for the same month in 1931. During the five months ended December 1932, 6,953,011 bushels were exported while 5,127,048 bushels were shipped for the same period in 1931.

Barley exported during the month of December totalled 272,667 bushels against 2,205,976 bushels for the same month in 1931. During the five-month period exports of barley amounted to 4,056,109 bushels against 7,601,591 bushels in 1931.

Exports of rye show a decrease for the month the amount being only 17,143 bushels compared with 1,249,981 bushels for the same month in 1931. For the five months ended December 1932, 2,545,958 bushels were exported against 2,692,662 bushels for the same period in 1931.

Destination of Wheat Exports

The majority of wheat exports in the month of December were billed to United Kingdom according to customs export entries the amount being shown as 17,206,177 bushels, while for the five months 95,646,468 bushels were so destined. The most important countries to which wheat was exported for the five-month period were:- Belgium 3,425,459 bushels; Netherlands 10,855,516 bushels; Germany 5,456,521 bushels; France 5,110,563 bushels; China 4,681,746 bushels; Italy 2,369,036 bushels; Japan 1,906,110 bushels; and Norway 1,569,541 bushels.

Coarse Grains

The primary movement of coarse grains to western country elevators for the five months ended December, 1932 was as follows:- oats 13,349,755 bushels; barley 7,209,156 bushels; flaxseed 1,295,627 bushels; and rye 1,435,630 bushels. For the same period in 1931 20,792,692 bushels of oats were moved from the farms to the country elevators; 6,603,815 bushels of barley; 1,614,927 bushels of flaxseed; and 1,646,786 bushels of rye.

Stocks of coarse grains in the elevators on January 13, 1933 were: oats 9,090,331 bushels; barley 6,739,612 bushels; flaxseed 1,458,411 bushels; and rye 5,008,986 bushels. These compare with 15,072,873 bushels oats; 11,441,221 bushels barley; 1,425,112 bushels of flaxseed and 13,163,216 bushels of rye for the same date in 1932.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JAN. 13, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 13, 1933 show a net decrease of 5,255,982 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 231,200,967, Oats 9,090,331, Barley 6,739,612, Flaxseed 1,458,411 and Rye 5,008,986 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,135,641, Oats 126,781 and Barley 7,931 bushels, while Flaxseed and Rye show increases of 8,977 and 5,394 bushels respectively. For the same week last year the amount in store was 239,752,956 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 198,650,529, Oats 15,072,878, Barley 11,441,221, Flaxseed 1,425,112, and Rye 13,163,216 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 105,379 bushels while increases are noted in Oats of 16,512, Barley 13,017, Flaxseed 424 and Rye 6,314 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 2,988,706 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 3,042,309 bushels, while Oats and Barley show increases of 19,553, and 34,050 bushels respectively.






