CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

During the week ending January 26, 1933, the Canadian wheat situation shows slightly increased stocks and export clearances over those of the previous week. The marketings in the Prairie Provinces decreased slightly from those of a week ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces during the week ending January 20, 1933, decreased slightly from the previous week. The receipts reported for the above week amounted to 2,381,573 bushels compared with 2,594,478 bushels a week ago. For the corresponding week in 1932, 2,163,829 bushels were shipped from the farms.

During the first twenty-five weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 282,964,622 bushels as compared with 203,220,301 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to January 20, 1933 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:- Manitoba, 29,824,934, (20,270,092) bushels; Saskatchewan 147,868,051 (93,356,494) bushels; and Alberta 105,271,637 (89,593,715) bushels.

STOCKS IN STORE

A slight increase is noted in the wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada and United States for the week ending January 27, 1933, compared with the previous week. The quantity shown in store for the above week was 229,567,921 bushels compared with 228,891,246 bushels, the revised total for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1932 195,510,442 bushels were reported. There were no outstanding increases or decreases in the stocks at any of the elevators during the week.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

For the week ending January 27, 1933 the export clearances increased slightly over those of the previous week as well as over the corresponding week a year ago. The bulk of the overseas movement was from the port of Vancouver.

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour for the week ending January 29, 1933, amounted to 13,780,000 bushels compared with 16,261,000 bushels for the previous week. North American shipments were well maintained in the face of heavy shipments from the Argentine and Australia.

From August 1, 1932 to January 29, 1933, world shipments of wheat and wheatflour amounted to 303 million bushels compared with 394 million bushels for the same period last year. To date North America has shipped 175 million bushels compared with 168 million bushels during the same period last year. Australian shipments during 1932-33 continued on the level of 1931-32. The Argentine has shipped considerably less wheat this crop year than last and shipments from Russia and the Danube have been very small.

India

The correspondent of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in Calcutta advises by cable that the 1933 wheat acreage in India is estimated at 31,829,000 acres compared with 33,078,000 acres in 1932 a reduction of 1,249,000 acres this year as compared with last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twenty-six weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 11.6 million bushels for the first twenty-six weeks of 1932-33 compared with 15.1 and 14.9 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 6.7 million bushels per week this year as compared with 6.5 and 7.5 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 27, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 27, 1933 show a net increase of 170,719 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- wheat 229,567,921, oats 9,277,481, barley 6,798,627, flax 1,472,540 and rye 5,014,487 bushels a total of 252,131,056 bushels. Increases noted are wheat 83,566, oats 52,660, barley 28,938 and rye 6,892 bushels while flax decreased 1,337 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was wheat 195,510,442, oats 14,626,247, barley 11,401,547, flax 1,395,847 and rye 12,864,497 bushels making a total of 235,798,580 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a net decrease of 966,537 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,014,579, oats 6,537 and flax 1,224 bushels while barley and rye increased 44,421 and 11,382 bushels respectively.
