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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

During the week ended August 19, the outstanding features in the wheat situation were: A further reduction in the stocks in the elevators and afloat, a slight decrease in the export clearances compared with the previous week and increased marketings on the Prairie Provinces over those of a week ago.

During the week ended August 12, 1932 the amount of wheat received at the Western Country Elevators and over the loading platforms amounted to 1,156,910 bushels. This compares with 1,264,759 bushels for the corresponding week in 1931.

Primary Movement

By Provinces the receipts were as follows: Manitoba 226,230 bushels; Saskatchewan 93,826 bushels; Alberta 836,854 bushels.

Stocks in Store

Wheat stocks in the elevators and afloat in Canada and the United States for the week ended August 19, 1932 show a further decrease from the previous week. The amount reported in store for week ended August 19 was 113,377,774 bushels compared with 116,030,130 bushels for the previous week. For the week ended August 21, 1931, 102,833,346 bushels were reported in store.

Increased wheat stocks are noted in the Western Country Elevators, at the Canadian and United States seaboard ports and at Vancouver, B.C. over the previous week, while decreases are shown at the following points and Elevators, Interior Terminal Elevators Head of the Lakes, Canadian Eastern and United States Lake ports, Private and Mill Elevators, also at Churchill and Prince Rupert. Wheat in transit also shows a decrease of 1,110,142 bushels.

Wheat Clearances

Wheat clearances during the week ended August 18, 1932 decreased slightly from the previous week, and are in advance of those of the corresponding week in 1931.

Internal Movement

During the week ended August 19, a large increase is shown in the stocks, the amount being 4,213,820 bushels compared with 1,929,255 bushels for the previous week. These receipts were principally made up of 2,163,624 bushels at the Head of the Lakes; 1,073,794 bushels at the Western Country Elevators and 732,169 bushels at Vancouver, B.C. The shipments amounted to 7,811,166 bushels accounted for by a vessel movement from the Head of the Lakes of 3,460,694 bushels; Vancouver 702,561 bushels and Churchill 280,013 bushels. In the Eastern Division 1,154,777 bushels were shipped from Montreal.

Water Movement

Vessel shipments from the Head of the Lakes for the week ended August 21 were 602,778 bushels less than those of the previous week. The amount reported as shipped was 4,055,269 bushels compared with 4,658,047 bushels a week ago. Only one United States vessel carried wheat during the week, while 26 Canadian were named.

The distribution of the vessel shipments was as follows: To Canadian Lower Lake ports of Pt. Colborne, Prescott, Kingston and Toronto 2,441,897 bushels; To Georgian Bay and Lake Huron Ports 777,377 bushels; To Montreal 403,595 bushels; To Sorel 122,400 bushels, all of which was lightered at Port Colborne or Prescott; and to Buffalo 310,000 bushels.

For the corresponding period in 1931, the amount shipped by vessel from Head of the Lakes was 3,163,465 bushels, the distribution of which was as follows: To Canadian Lower Lake Ports including Georgian Bay and Lake Huron Ports 1,758,362 bushels; To Buffalo 827,400 bushels; To Montreal 392,265 bushels and to Sorel 185,438 bushels.

Coarse Grains

The primary movement of coarse grains increased slightly over that of the previous week. The amounts shipped to the Western County Elevators were Oats 176,174 bushels; Barley 62,996 bushels; Flaxseed 1,066 bushels and Rye 45,879 bushels. The shipments from the above elevators were Oats 89,817 bushels; Barley 36,699 bushels; Flaxseed 2,025 bushels and Rye 58,082 bushels. Platform Loadings show that 44,532 bushels of "other grain" were shipped during the week.

According to the vessel shipments from the Head of the Lakes 185,499 bushels of Oats were 153,625 bushels of Barley and 56,313 bushels of Flaxseed were moved from the Head of the Lakes to Montreal; and 97,113 bushels of Rye to Port Colborne.

Stocks of coarse grains in the Elevators in Canada and the United States for the week ended August 19 were as follows: Oats 5,764,389 bushels; Barley 2,613,669 bushels, Flaxseed 1,281,693 bushels and Rye 4,928,920 bushels.

WORLD SITUATION

The following table shows world shipments of wheat and wheatflour for the first three weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for the corresponding period last year. (Broomhall's figures).

World shipments for the week ending August 22 amounted to 6,286,000 bushels compared with 7,433,000 bushels for the previous week, and 17,890,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Russia has shipped no wheat this year compared with shipments of 12 million bushels during the first three weeks of 1931-32. Argentine shipments are greatly reduced this year amounting to 1.9 million bushels compared with 3.7 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1931-32. North American shipments for the first three weeks of the present crop year amounted to 14 million bushels compared with 17 million bushels for the same weeks last year. To date North American shipments have covered about two-thirds of the total world movement.

World shipments for the first three weeks of the present crop year amounted to 21.7 million bushels compared with 44.8 million bushels for the same weeks last year.

IMPORT REQUIREMENTS

Mr. Broomhall tentatively estimates world wheat import requirements for 1932-33 at 705 million bushels or 65 million bushels less than shipments in 1931-32. According to Mr. Broomhall's estimate Europe will take 517 million bushels while other countries will take 188 million bushels.

Owing to reduced production in Russia and the Danube this year, exports will likely be greatly reduced and will probably more than offset the reduced estimate of import requirements. In this case North America can look for a substantial trade in wheat this year in spite of a smaller demand in Europe.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 19th, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 19th, 1932 show a net decrease of 2,838,628 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 113,377,774; Oats 5,764,389; Barley 2,613,669; Flax 1,281,693 and Rye 4,928,920, a total of 127,966,445 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 2,652,356; Oats 49,178 and Barley 308,040 bushels, while Flax and Rye show increases of 31,463 and 139,483 bushels respectively. For the same week last year the amount in store was 133,514,593 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 102,833,346; Oats 9,420,184; Barley 8,142,577; Flax 786,916 and Rye 12,331,570 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.

Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show an increase of 1,895,234 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 1,469,305; Oats 146,409; Barley 172,420; Flax 20,053 and Rye 87,047 bushels.






