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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Decreases are shown in the export clearances; the marketings in the Prairie Provinces and in the stocks in the elevators in Canada and the United States from those of a week ago.

Primary Movement

For the week ending February 17, 1933 a slight decrease is noted in the wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces, the amount being 1,896,078 bushels compared with 2,109,930 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1932, 2,763,170 bushels made up the primary movement.

During the first twenty-nine weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 292,822,051 bushels as compared with 214,402,374 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to February 17, 1933 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:- Manitoba 30,354,345 (20,329,341) bushels; Saskatchewan 151 343,393 (97,121,057) bushels; and Alberta 111,124,313 (97,121,057) bushels.

Inspections

A slight increase is shown in the inspections of wheat during the week ending February 21, 1933 compared with the previous week. The number of cars reported was 1,362 against 1,303 a week ago and 1,740 cars for the same week in 1932. Of the first number 1,346 cars were hard spring wheat. The gradings show 1,100 or 81.7 percent were placed in the first four grades and 197 cars tough and damp. For the corresponding week in 1932, 1,339 cars or 77 percent graded within the contract grades.

Stocks in Store

A further decrease is shown in the stocks of wheat in the elevators in Canada and the United States for the week ending February 24, 1933, the amount shown being 224,956,911 bushels, a reduction of 1,558,748 bushels when 226,497,704 bushels were shown in store for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1932, 186,119,880 bushels were reported. Slight increases are shown in the stocks at the western country elevators, at Vancouver and the Head of the Lakes while decreases are noted in the other elevators from those of a week ago.

Export Clearances


A decrease is shown in the export clearances for the week ending February 24, 1933 as compared with the previous week. The amount shipped overseas was 3,069,007 bushels while 4,583,231 bushels were cleared last week. During the corresponding week in 1932, 2,163,217 bushels were exported. As in the previous week Vancouver was the leading port in export clearances during the week.

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour for the week ending February 26 amounted to 16,063,000 bushels compared with 17,704,000 bushels for the week previous and 15,320,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments decreased by almost 2 million bushels. Argentine clearances were 883,000 bushels lower than during the preceding week, while Australian shipments increased by over 1 million bushels. Russia shipped a small amount of wheat.


From August 1, 1932 to February 26, 1933 world shipments of wheat and wheatflour amounted to 365 million bushels compared with 450 million bushels for the same period in 1931-32.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 12.2 million bushels for the first thirty weeks of 1932-33 compared with 15.2 and 15.0 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 6.4 million bushels per week this year as compared with 6.3 and 7.2 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.



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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 24, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 24, 1933 show a net decrease of 1,407,996 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- wheat 224,956,911, oats 9,265,013, barley 6,695,688, flaxseed 1,458,543, and rye 5,084,835 bushels, a total of 247,460,990 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,540,793, barley 4,014, flaxseed 4,351 and rye 5,480 bushels, while oats increased 146,642 bushels. For the corresponding week last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 186,119,880, oats 14,278,769, barley 11,182,960, flaxseed 1,362,672, and rye 12,615,393 a total of 225,559,674, bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net increase of 404,271 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 230,258, oats 141,546, barley 34,175, and flaxseed 2,150 bushels, while rye decreased 3,858 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 92,322 bushels. Wheat decreased 98,102 bushels while oats increased 5,780 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 185,579 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 120,335, oats 31,309 and barley 34,218 bushels while flaxseed decreased 283 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks decreased 289,666 bushels.






