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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

During the week ending March 3 increased export clearances were shown from Canadian and United States Atlantic Seaboard ports over the previous week, also increased marketings in the Prairie Provinces. The stocks in the elevators in Canada and United States decreased slightly from those of a week ago.

Primary Movement

A sharp increase is shown in the wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces during the week ending February 24, 1933 compared with the previous week. The amount marketed was 3,820,648 bushels against 1,896,078 bushels a week ago. During the corresponding week in 1932, 3,527,350 bushels were reported shipped from the farms.

During the first thirty weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 296,642,399 bushels as compared with 217,929,724 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to February 24, 1933 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:- Manitoba 30,508,308 (20,493,616) bushels; Saskatchewan 152,902,205 (98,376,503) bushels; and Alberta 113,231,886 (99,059,605) bushels.

Inspections

The number of cars of wheat inspected in the western division for the week/February 28, 1933 increased over those of the previous week. The number reported was 2,221 against 1,362 a week ago and 2,685 cars for the same week in 1932. Of the first number 2,194 cars were hard spring wheat. The gradings show 1,329 cars or 82 percent were placed in the first four grades and 297 cars tough and damp. For the corresponding week in 1932, 2,057 cars or 76 percent graded within the contract grades.

Stocks in Store

A slight reduction is shown in the wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada and United States for the week ending March 3, 1933, the amount shown in store being 223,956,074 bushels compared with 224,964,807 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1932 184,920,044 bushels were reported. Decreases are shown in all the elevators except Vancouver, Private and Mill and Fort William and Port Arthur.

Export Clearances


An increase is shown in the wheat export clearances during the week ending March 2, 1933 compared with the previous week, also an advance over the same week a year ago. The amount shipped overseas was 3,492,869 bushels an increase of 423,862 bushels over the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1932, 2,531,789 bushels were exported. Vancouver was the chief port of export with United States Atlantic Seaboard ports next in order of quantity.

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour for the week ending March 5 amounted to 15,210,000 bushels compared with 16,063,000 bushels for the preceding week and 16,472,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments increased by about $1\frac{1}{2}$ million bushels. Argentine and Australian clearances decreased by approximately 900,000 and 1 million bushels respectively. Russia shipped no wheat.

From August 1, 1932 to March 5, 1933 world shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 381 million bushels in comparison to 473 million bushels for the same period in 1931-32.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty-one weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 12.3 million bushels for the first thirty-one weeks of 1932-33 compared with 15.2 and 15.0 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 6.4 million bushels per week this year as compared with 6.2 and 7.1 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 3, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 3, 1933 show a net decrease of 693,977 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- wheat 223,956,074, oats 9,513,722, barley 6,728,657, flaxseed 1,458,506 and rye 5,110,054 a total of 246,767,013 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,000,837 and flaxseed 37 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 248,709 barley 32,969 and rye 25,219 bushels. For the corresponding week last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 184,920,044, oats 14,311,780, barley 11,159,326, flaxseed 1,367,651 and rye 12,558,291 bushels a total of 224,317,092 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 200,576 bushels. Wheat decreased 498,008 bushels while increases are noted in oats of 233,956, barley 45,343, flaxseed 2,625 and rye 15,508 bushels.


