CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

For the week ending March 10th, 1933 the Canadian wheat situation shows slightly increased clearances from Canadian and United States seaboard ports as well as an increased movement to western country elevators. The stocks in the elevators decreased slightly from those of a week ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

The wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 3, 1933 increased slightly over those of a week ago. The amount marketed was 3,987,162 bushels against 3,820,648 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1932, 3,416,822 bushels constituted the primary movement.

During the first thirty-one weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 300,629,571 bushels as compared with 221,346,546 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to March 3, 1933 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:- Manitoba 30,930,680 (20,666,022) bushels; Saskatchewan 154,445,434 (99,587,328) bushels; and Alberta 115,253,457 (101,193,196) bushels.

- INSPECTIONS -

During the week ending March 7, 1933, 2,978 cars of wheat were inspected in the Western Division compared with 2,012 cars for the same week in 1932. Of the 2,978 cars inspected 2,916 cars were hard spring wheat, some 2,558 cars 87 percent were placed in the first four grades and 266 cars tough and damp. For the corresponding week in 1932, 1,509 cars or 98 percent graded within the contract grades.


For the month of February, 1933, 6,499 cars were inspected in the Western Division of which 5,188 or 81.3 percent were shown in the first four grades. The accumulated total inspections for the seven months ending February, 1933 counted to 141,673 cars compared with 118,719 cars in 1932. Gradings show 125,113, or 87.31 percent of the hard spring wheat were in the top four grades while for the same period in 1932, 90,008 cars or 79.21 percent of the 1932 crop graded No. 3 northern and better.

STOCKS IN STORE

The wheat stocks in the elevators decreased slightly from those of the previous week. The amount reported in store for the week was 223,448,662 bushels compared with 223,534,889 bushels the revised total for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1932, 185,436,854 bushels were reported. The bulk of the elevators shows decreases from the previous week, the most outstanding being in the western country and eastern lake port elevators. Increases are shown at Vancouver and the Head of the Lakes.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

An increase is shown in the export clearances of 912,149 bushels during the week ending March 9, 1933 compared with the same week in 1932. The amount shipped overseas for the above week was 3,104,411 bushels compared with 2,192,262 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932. For the thirty-two weeks ending March 9, 1933, 155,930,246 bushels were shipped overseas against 95,380,821 bushels for the corresponding period in 1932. Of the former amount 137,236,216 bushels moved from Canadian ports and 18,694,000 from United States Atlantic seaboard ports.

For the month of February, 1933, according to Customs Department figures, the exports of wheat amounted to 10,922,337 bushels compared with 14,706,801 bushels for the previous month and 9,898,363 bushels for the same month a year ago. The export of 10,922,337 bushels practically all left Canada from Canadian ports; 9,197,664 bushels from Pacific ports and 17,247,741 bushels from Canadian Atlantic Ports. There was no re-routed wheat during the month.

During the seven months ending February, 1933, 166,023,597 bushels of wheat were exported compared with 114,348,795 bushels for the same period in 1932. The following amounts were exported from Canada through the undermentioned ports; Vancouver 64,737,293 bushels; Montreal 41,717,924 bushels; Sorel 9,487,876 bushels; Saint John 4,268,093 bushels; Victoria 885,788 bushels; Quebec 1,218,239 bushels; Prince Rupert 677,813 bushels; New Westminster 592,155 bushels; Halifax 141,000 bushels; Sydney 101 bushels and Churchill 2,735,939 bushels a total of 126,463,221 bushels.

The amount billed via United States ports was 39,530,396 bushels. The re-routed wheat during the seven-month period was 16,669,233 bushels. After adding the amount to the exports from Canadian ports and deducting same from the quantity billed via United States ports makes the adjusted totals 143,132,454 bushels exported via Canadian ports and 22,861,243 bushels via United States ports.


Oats exported during the month of February, 1933 amounted to 824,704 bushels over twice the quantity of the previous month when 354,614 bushels were shown leaving Canada. For the seven months ending February, 1933, 8,132,329 bushels were exported while 7,451,363 bushels were exported for the same period in 1932.

Barley exports increased slightly over the previous month the amount shown as exported being 223,139 bushels compared with 191,524 bushels for the previous month. During the seven months ending February, 1933, 4,470,772 bushels were exported compared with 8,156,519 bushels for the same period in 1932.

Rye exported for the month totalled 43,314 bushels compared with 17,143 bushels for the previous month. For the same month in 1932, 302,337 bushels left Canada. For the seven months period 2,606,415 bushels were shown as exported from Canada against 3,213,503 bushels in 1932.

Flaxseed exports amounted to 2,458 bushels during the month compared with 1,200 bushels for the same month in 1932. During the seven months period 366,436 bushels were moved against 246,963 bushels for the same period in 1932.

Destination of the wheat exports.— The bulk of wheat exports during the month of February, 1933 was billed to the United Kingdom according to Customs export entries, the amount being 7,296,326 bushels while for the seven months 112,529,989 bushels were so destined. The most important countries to which wheat was exported for the seven-month period were:- Belgium 10,530,271 bushels; Netherlands 11,316,850 bushels; France 6,754,344 bushels; China 6,652,970 bushels; Germany 6,649,684 bushels; Japan 2,870,210 bushels; Italy 2,473,410 and 1,726,341 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 10, 1933

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 10, 1933 show a net decrease of 240,867 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: wheat 223,448,662, oats 9,857,952, barley 6,673,806, flaxseed 1,438,182 and rye 5,107,544 bushels, a total of 246,526,146 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 507,412, barley 54,851, flaxseed 20,324, and rye 2,510 bushels while oats increased 344,230 bushels. For the corresponding week last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 185,436,854, oats 14,634,544, barley 11,080,190, flaxseed 1,374,804 and rye 12,581,015 bushels, a total of 225,107,407 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks in store at these elevators show a net decrease of 778,105 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,141,756, barley 58,070 and flaxseed of 1,524 bushels while oats and rye increased 416,539 and 4,706 bushels respectively.



Victoria Elevator.- Wheat stocks decreased 280,934 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Stocks in store remain unchanged.


