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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

The Canadian wheat situation for the week ending March 17th shows decreased wheat clearances from Canadian and United States seaboard ports with increased marketings in the Prairie Provinces. The stocks in the elevators also increased slightly from those of a week ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 10, 1933, increased over those of a week ago. The amount marketed was 4,190,522 bushels against 3,987,162 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1932, 2,697,991 bushels were reported marketed.

During the first thirty-two weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 304,820,093 bushels as compared with 224,044,537 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to March 10, 1933 in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:- Manitoba 31,367,745 (20,830,869) bushels; Saskatchewan 156,095,286 (100,424,166) bushels; and Alberta 117,357,062 (102,789,502) bushels.

Inspections

During the week ending March 14, 1933, 3,078 cars of wheat were inspected in the Western Division compared with 2,978 cars for the previous week and 1,552 cars for the same week 1932. Of the 3,078 cars inspected 2,977 cars were hard spring wheat, some 2,608 cars or 87 per cent were placed in the first four grades and 284 cars tough and damp. For the corresponding week in 1932, 1,145 cars or 75 per cent graded within the contract grades and 272 cars tough and damp.

Stocks in Store

Wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada and the United States increased slightly over those of the previous week. The amount in store for the week was 224,329,558 bushels compared with 223,453,144 bushels for the previous week. For the corresponding week in 1932, 186,709,074 bushels were reported. Increases are shown in the stocks at the Head of the Lakes, Vancouver and Private and Mill Elevators, while decreases are noted at the Canadian Eastern lake and seaboard elevators as well as at the United States lake and Atlantic ports.

Export Clearances

A decrease is shown in the export clearances of 249,180 bushels during the week ending March 17, 1933 compared with the previous week. An increase of 636,689 bushels is noted over the same week in 1932. For the thirty-three weeks ending March 17, 1933 the clearances amounted to 158,785,477 bushels against 97,599,363 bushels for the corresponding period in 1932.

World shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the week ending March 19 amounted to 12,549,000 bushels compared with 18,042,000 bushels for the preceding week and 16,288,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments decreased by about 1,800,000 bushels. Argentine shipments showed a slight decrease while Australian were about 3 million bushels lower than for the preceding week. Russia shipped a very small amount of wheat.

From August 1, 1932 to March 19, 1933, world shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 411 million bushels as compared to 507 million bushels for the same period in 1931-32.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty-three weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 12.4 million bushels for the first thirty-three weeks of 1932-33 compared with 15.3 and 15.0 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 6.3 million bushels per week this year as compared with 6.1 and 6.9 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 17, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 17, 1933 show an increase of 1,573,553 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- wheat 224,329,558, oats 10,443,649, barley 6,751,308, flaxseed 1,441,912 and rye 5,133,272 bushels, a total of 248,099,699 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 880,896, oats 585,697, barley 77,502, flaxseed 3,730 and rye 25,728 bushels. For the corresponding week last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 136,709,074, oats 14,891,683, barley 11,181,275, flaxseed 1,381,489, rye 2,612,438 bushels a total of 226,775,959 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 398,462 bushels. Increases are noted in oats of 524,254, barley 38,146, and rye 9,289 bushels while wheat and flaxseed decreased 167,068 and 6,159 bushels respectively.




