CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

For the week ending March 31, 1933 slightly decreased wheat clearances were shown from Canadian and United States seaboard ports as well as a small reduction in the marketings in the Prairie Provinces. A slight increase is reported in the stocks in the elevators over those of a week ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 24, 1933 decreased slightly from those of the previous week the amount reported being 5,159,028 bushels compared with 5,231,870 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1932, 3,072,438 bushels were reported marketed.

During the first thirty-four weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 315,210,991 bushels as compared with 230,882,257 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to March 24, 1933, in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:- Manitoba 32,343,154 (21,359,407) bushels; Saskatchewan 160,654,629 (103,281,847) bushels; and Alberta 122,213,208 (106,241,003) bushels.

INSPECTIONS

Wheat inspections for the week ending March 31, 1933 amounted to 5,723 cars in the western division, an increase of 2,686 cars over the previous week and 2,617 cars in advance of the same week in 1932. Of the 5,723 cars inspected 5,555 cars were hard spring wheat, of which 5,047 cars or 91 per cent in the first four grades. For the corresponding week in 1932, 2,296 cars or 74 percent were placed in the contract grades.

STOCKS IN STORE

Wheat stocks in the elevators in Canada and the United States increased over the previous week. The quantity in store for the week ending March 31, was 226,742,716 bushels compared with 225,225,051 bushels the revised total for the previous week. For the corresponding week in 1932, 183,955,935 bushels were reported. Practically all the above increase took place at the Head of the Lakes, the remainder of the elevators reporting small decreases.

EXPORT CLEARANCES


A decrease of 25,525 bushels is shown in the wheat clearances for the week ending March 31, 1933 compared with the previous week. For the thirty-five weeks ending March 31, 1933, the clearances amounted to 164,148,712 bushels against 102,822,488 bushels for the same period in 1932. An outstanding feature this year is the large export movement from Vancouver. So far this year there was as much wheat cleared from Vancouver as for the whole of the crop year 1931-32.

World shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the week ending April 2nd amounted to 11,888,000 bushels compared with 15,083,000 bushels for the preceding week and 15,656,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments increased by almost 2 million bushels while there was a sharp decrease in Argentine and Australian clearances.

From August 1, 1932 to April 2, 1933 world shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 436 million bushels as compared with 536 million bushels for the same period in 1931-32.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty-five weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 12.5 million bushels for the first thirty-five weeks of 1932-33 compared with 15.3 and 15.0 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 6.1 million bushels per week this year as compared with 6.1 and 6.8 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 31, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 31, 1933 show a net increase of 1,866,737 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- wheat 226,742,716, oats 11,863,549, barley 6,789,544, flaxseed 1,358,798 and rye 5,178,103 bushels, a total of 251,932,710 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,162,258, oats 715,552 and barley 99,322 bushels while flaxseed and rye decreased 85,744 and 24,651 bushels respectively. For the corresponding week last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 183,955,935, oats 14,801,274, barley 11,099,600, flaxseed 1,382,704 and rye 12,322,591 bushels, a total of 1,223,562,104 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net increase of 271,876, oats and barley increased 562,559 and 40,090 bushels respectively, while decreases are noted in wheat of 187,740, flaxseed 81,912 and rye 61,121 bushels.


