CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Decreased wheat clearances are shown for the week ending April 7, 1933 from the Canadian and United States seaboard ports also a reduction in the marketings in the Prairie Provinces. Wheat stocks in the elevators increased over those of a week ago.

Primary Movement

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 31, 1933 decreased from those of the previous week the amount reported being 4,104,597 bushels compared with 5,159,028 bushels for the previous week. During the same week in 1932, 1,521,543 bushels and in 1931 1,124,224 bushels were reported marketed.

During the first thirty-five weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 319,315,588 bushels as compared with 232,403,800 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to March 31, 1933, in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows; - the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:- Manitoba 32,733,883 (21,527,169) bushels; Saskatchewan 162,582,655 (104,015,240) bushels; and Alberta 123,999,045 (106,861,391) bushels.

Inspections

During the month of March 1933, wheat inspections in the western division amounted 14,816 cars against 9,008 cars for the same month in 1932. According to the gradings 14,401 cars were hard spring wheat of which 12,815 cars or 88.9 percent were placed in the first four grades. During the eight months ending March 1933, 156,489 cars passed inspections of which 149,928 cars were hard spring wheat. Gradings indicate 137,928 cars or 91.9 percent were segregated within the contract grades. For the week ending April 7 2,349 cars were inspected compared with 5,723 cars for the previous week and 1,422 cars a year ago.

Stocks in Store

Elevator wheat stocks in Canada and the United States increased slightly over those of the previous week. The quantity in store for the week ending April 7 was 225,875,792 bushels compared with 225,529,220 bushels the revised total for the previous week. For the same week in 1932 181,307,459 bushels were reported. Decreases are shown in the wheat stocks in all the elevators with the exception of those at the Head of the Lakes. Exceptionally small stocks are noted at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard Ports, the amount being only 5,664,352 bushels this compares with 10,860,032 bushels for the same week in 1932. The former quantity is the smallest in the last four seasons in these ports at this time of the year.

Export Clearances

Wheat clearances for the week ending April 7, 1933 decreased 569,803 bushels from those of the previous week. The amount shown as cleared was 2,099,052 bushels compared 2,668,855 bushels for a week ago. During the thirty-six weeks ending April 7, 1933, 166,247,764 bushels were shipped from the Canadian and United States ports against 105,118,586 bushels for the same period in 1932.

World shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the week ending April 9th amounted to 9,877,000 bushels compared with 11,888,000 bushels for the preceding week and 14,760,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments decreased by more than 2 million bushels. There was a sharp increase in Argentine shipments while Australian clearances were almost 1½ million bushels lower than for the preceding week.

From August 1, 1932 to April 9, 1933 world shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 447 million bushels as compared with 551 million bushels for the same period in 1931-32. North American and Australian shipments compare favourably with last year while all other exporting areas show reduced exports. Heavy shipments from Australia since the middle of January have been a feature of the past three months. Russia and the Danubian countries have taken little part in the world wheat market during the present crop year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 7, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 7, 1933 show a net increase of 417,644 bushels. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 225,875,792, oats 12,238,182, barley 6,742,331, flaxseed 1,319,831 and rye 5,141,294 bushels a total of 251,317,435 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 346,572, oats 85,954, flaxseed 34,194, and rye 10,784 bushels while barley decreased 59,860 bushels. For the corresponding week last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 181,307,459, oats 14,403,144, barley 11,072,873, flaxseed 1,409,335 and rye 12,368,708 bushels, a total of 220,561,519 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: Grain stocks decreased 619,270 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 441,632, oats 147,758, barley 6,764, flaxseed 9,669 and rye 13,447 bushels.


