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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Wheat clearances from Canadian and United States seaboard ports for the week ending April 14, 1933 increased slightly over those of a week ago. A substantial reduction is noted in the wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces while the stocks in Canadian and United States elevators decreased slightly from those of a week ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

A decided decrease is noted in the wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 7, 1933, the amount being 2,556,368 bushels compared with 4,104,597 bushels for the previous week. During the same week in 1932, 1,588,204 bushels were reported marketed.

During the first thirty-six weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 321,571,956 bushels as compared with 233,992,004 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to April 7, 1933, in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows,-- the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year:- Manitoba 32,889,300 (21,711,202) bushels; Saskatchewan 163,812,018 (104,623,121) bushels; and Alberta 125,160,638 (107,657,681) bushels.

INSPECTIONS

Western inspections during the week ending April 14, 1933 amounted to 1,979 cars compared with 2,349 cars a week ago and 1,317 cars for the corresponding week in 1932. Of the first amount 1,854 cars were shown as hard spring wheat of which 1,663 cars or 89 per cent graded No. 3 Northern or better. During the same week in 1932, 1,289 cars of hard spring wheat passed inspection of which the gradings show 97 percent were in the top four grades.

STOCKS IN STORE

A reduction is shown in the wheat stocks in Canada and the United States elevators from those of a week ago. The quantity in store for the week ending April 14, was 224,843,104 bushels compared with 225,867,542 bushels the revised total for the previous week. For the same week in 1932, 176,215,009 bushels were reported. Wheat in export positions are as follows:- Pacific ports 10,166,928 bushels; Eastern Elevators - St. Lawrence and Maritime Ports 4,817,792 bushels; Lake Ports 12,811,851 bushels; United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard Elevators 4,896,843 bushels. The amount awaiting the opening of navigation at the Head of the Lakes is shown as 73,399,866 bushels. Large stocks are also held in the western country elevators, the amount being 107,364,315 bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

Wheat clearances during the week ending April 14, increased slightly over the previous week but are less than the corresponding week in 1932. The amount shown as cleared for the above week was 2,135,460 bushels compared with 2,099,052 bushels a week ago. During the same week in 1932 3,076,274 bushels were reported. For the thiryt-seven weeks ending April 14, 1933, 168,383,224 bushels were shipped from Canadian and United States ports against 108,264,860 bushels for the same period in 1932.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 14, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 14, 1933 show a net decrease of 1,312,419 bushels. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 224,843,104, oats 12,026,662, barley 6,623,880, flaxseed 1,326,239 and rye 5,138,518 a total of 249,958,404 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,024,438, oats 206,407, barley 96,642 and rye 9,091 bushels while flaxseed increased 24,159 bushels. For the corresponding week last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 176,215,009, oats 13,360,691, barley 10,734,733, flaxseed 1,403,935 and rye 12,309,058 bushels, a total of 214,022,426 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 441,186 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 120,356, oats, 271,821, barley 41,038 and rye 7,974 bushels, while flaxseed increased 3 bushels.


Platform Loadings to April 7th, 1933.
