CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Slightly increased wheat clearances are shown from the Canadian and United States seaboard ports during the week ending April 21, 1933 compared with those of a week ago wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces show a further reduction while a substantial decrease is noted in the stocks from those of a week ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

A further decrease is shown in the wheat marketing in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 14, 1933, the amount being 2,042,994 bushels compared with 2,556,368 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1932, 1,796,332 bushels were marketed.

During the first thirty-seven weeks of the crop year the deliveries of wheat to the western country elevators and shipments over the loading platforms amounted to 323,914,950 bushels as compared with 235,788,336 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to April 14, 1933, in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows, - the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year: - Manitoba 33,033,745 (21,866,411) bushels; Saskatchewan 164,834,661 (105,268,846) bushels; and Alberta 126,046,544 (108,653,079) bushels.

STOCKS IN STORE

Wheat stocks in Canada and the United States elevators are less than those of the previous week by 3,800,708 bushels. The quantity shown in store for the week ending April 21, 1933 was 220,561,342 bushels compared with 224,362,050 bushels, the revised total for the previous week. For the corresponding week in 1932, 168,473,031 bushels were reported. Wheat in transit on the lakes (amounting to 2,352,796 bushels) is reported a week earlier than last year. United States wheat in Canadian elevators for the week ending April 21, 1933 amounted to 5,794,342 bushels compared with 6,319,030 bushels for the previous week and 27,313,829 bushels for the same week a year ago.

-INSPECTIONS-

During the week ending April 21, 1933 2,060 cars of wheat were inspected in the western division compared with 1,979 cars a week ago and 2,092 cars for the corresponding week in 1932. Of the first amount 1,953 cars were shown as hard spring wheat of which 1,643 or 84.1 per cent graded No. 3 northern or better. During the same week in 1932 2,026 cars of hard spring wheat passed inspection of which the gradings show 80.7 per cent were in the top four grades.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

The quantity of wheat cleared from Canadian and United States elevators during the week ending April 21, 1933, increased slightly over those of the previous week.

The amount shipped overseas is shown as 2,444,355 bushels compared with 2,135,460 bushels a week ago and 4,049,021 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932.

During the thirty-eight weeks ending April 21, 1933, 170,827,579 bushels were shipped from Canadian and United States ports against 112,313,881 bushels for the same period in 1932.

World shipments for the week ending April 23, 1933, amounted to 10,319,000 bushels compared with 9,148,000 bushels for the previous week and 16,376,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments were slightly lower than during the preceding week while shipments from the Argentine and Australia were slightly higher.

From August 1, 1932 to April 26, 1933, world shipments of wheat amounted to 466 million bushels compared with 584 million bushels for the same period in 1931-32.

I N D I A

The correspondent of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in Calcutta cables that 1933 wheat production is estimated at 335,097,000 bushels from 32,293,000 acres as compared with 341,968,000 bushels from 33,669,000 acres in 1932.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 21, 1933

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 21, 1933 show a net decrease of 4,022,796 bushels. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 220,561,342, oats 11,763,108, barley 6,471,678, flaxseed 1,323,439 and rye 5,151,195 bushels a total of 245,270,762 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 3,800,708, oats 163,249 and barley 101,211 bushels, while flaxseed and rye increased 20,957 and 21,415 bushels respectively. For the corresponding week last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 168,473,031, oats 11,711,046, barley 9,892,134, flaxseed 1,319,922 and rye 11,807,087 bushels, a total of 203,203,220 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks decreased 338,389 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 288,665, oats 30,150, and barley 27,465 bushels while flaxseed and rye increased 715 and 7,176 bushels respectively.
