CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

During the week ending June 2, 1933, export clearances of wheat increased slightly compared with the previous week. The volume of stocks of wheat in store decreased by over 2 million bushels. Primary receipts for the week ending May 26, 1933 were slightly lower than during the preceding week.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT OF WHEAT

During the week ending May 26, primary receipts of wheat amounted to 1,751,913 bushels as compared with 2,231,927 bushels for the previous week and 2,164,812 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Marketings in the Prairie Provinces during the crop year to date amounted to 338,193,882 bushels compared with marketings of 243,339,333 bushels during the corresponding period in 1931-32. Marketings by provinces are as follows, with figures for the same period in 1931-32 in brackets: Manitoba 34,642,534 (22,751,955) bushels; Saskatchewan 171,991,332 (108,777,007) bushels; and Alberta 131,560,016 (111,810,371) bushels.

WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

A decrease of 2,383,372 bushels is reported in the stocks of wheat in store on June 2, as compared with the previous week. The Canadian visible supply was reported at 201,040,611 bushels compared with the revised figure of 203,423,983 bushels for the previous week and 144,574,198 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Stocks of Canadian wheat in store in the United States amounted to 4,595,659 bushels as compared with 5,958,366 bushels on the same date last year.

Wheat in transit on the Great Lakes amounted to 6,647,869 bushels on June 2. On June 3, 1932, 3,953,623 bushels were in transit on the Lakes.

EXPORT CLEARANCES OF WHEAT

Export clearances of wheat for the week ending June 2, 1933 amounted to 5,108,504 bushels compared with 4,671,172 bushels for the previous week and 5,173,206 for the corresponding week last year.


From August 1, 1932 to June 2, 1933 export clearances of wheat amounted to 197,834,036 bushels, compared with 140,896,371 bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32.



From August 1, 1932 to June 4, 1933 world shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 538 million bushels as compared with 684 million bushels for the same period in 1931-32. Australian shipments compare favourably with last year while all other exporting areas show reduced exports. The decrease in North American shipments is due to very small clearances from the United States during the present crop year. While total shipments from North America are below last year, Canadian clearances are considerably larger.

Russia

The London correspondent of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics advises that up to May 31 total sowings of grain in Russia amounted to 193 million acres compared with 186 million acres on the same date last year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 2, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 2, 1933 show a net decrease of 2,880,970 bushels. Stocks in store were as follows:- Wheat 201,040,611, oats 9,679,979, barley 6,403,493, flaxseed 1,090,868 and rye 5,064,070 bushels, a total of 223,279,021 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 2,383,372, oats 125,612, barley 176,415 and flaxseed 197,591 bushels while rye increased 2,020 bushels. For the corresponding week last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 144,574,198, oats 6,044,837, barley 6,442,574, flaxseed 1,404,158 and rye 9,447,575 bushels, a total of 167,913,342 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks decreased 1,603,080 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,531,005, barley 80,934 and flaxseed 7,786 bushels while oats and rye increased 9,376 and 7,269 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 197,019 bushels. Wheat and oats stocks decreased 193,297 and 3,722 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 309,882 bushels. Decreases are shown in wheat of 219,310, oats 80,799 and barley 12,267 bushels while rye increased 2,494 bushels.


PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks increased 20 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks decreased 681,031 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks in store decreased 3,952,514 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 3,639,777, oats 241,782, barley 70,536 and flaxseed 46,062 bushels while rye increased 45,643 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain stocks increased 2,183,612 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 2,246,076 and oats 131,300 bushels while decreases are shown in barley and flaxseed of 49,971 and 143,793 bushels respectively.


