CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Primary Movement

Deliveries of wheat to country elevators, and platform loadings for the week ending August 26, 1932, amounted to 6,474,225 bushels compared with 4,528,044 bushels for the preceding week. During the first four weeks of the present crop year country deliveries of wheat amounted to 12,679,665 bushels compared with 8,980,245 bushels for the same period last year. Reflecting an earlier harvest, marketings in Manitoba exceeded those of either Saskatchewan or Alberta during the first four weeks of 1932-33.

Inspections

During the week ending August 31, a total of 3,170 cars of new wheat was inspected. While inspections graded very high during the foregoing week, it is too early in the season and inspections have been too few to justify an opinion as to the quality of the crop. It is worthy of note, however, that of the 3,170 cars inspected, 828 were Durum - or about 25 per cent. Of 828 cars of Durum wheat inspected, 676 cars were placed in the top grade. The relatively heavy inspections of Durum wheat reflect the early harvest in Manitoba. Inspections in August have not reflected the wet weather of the last week of the month.

Export Clearances

Export clearances of wheat for the week ending September 1, 1932 amounted to 4,197,424 bushels compared with 3,887,083 bushels for the previous week and 1,843,790 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Clearances from Montreal, Vancouver, Churchill, Victoria and United States ports increased over the previous week while clearances from Sorel were lower.

Export clearances for the five weeks ending September 1st amounted to 16,732,749 bushels compared with 10,473,299 bushels for the corresponding period last year. Practically one half of export clearances since August 1 have been through the port of Montreal while Vancouver has handled about one quarter of total clearances. Export clearances from Churchill have amounted to 823,713 bushels during the past five weeks.

All Canadian ports have increased their clearances of wheat during the past five weeks compared with clearances for the same period in 1931. Since August 1st, 1932 clearances from Montreal have amounted to 8,517,509 bushels compared with 3,157,560 bushels for the same period last year, while Vancouver clearances amounted to 4,017,145 bushels compared with 3,455,793 bushels for the same period last year. The amount of wheat cleared through United States ports has decreased this year compared with last year, clearances since August 1st amounting to 1,973,000 bushels compared with 3,384,000 bushels shipped during the same period last year. Generally speaking, there has been a much better tone to the export market during August this year compared with the same month last year - at least in so far as Canada is concerned.

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour for the week ending September 5, amounted to 11,069,000 bushels compared with 7,511,000 bushels for the previous week and 16,600,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments increased sharply amounting to 7,741,000 bushels compared with 4,798,000 bushels for the previous week and were the largest since the middle of June. Shipments from the Argentine were sharply lower than last week while Australian shipments continued slightly under one million bushels. Russian clearances amounted to 704,000 bushels compared with 4,512,000 bushels for the same week last year.

For the five weeks ending September 5th world shipments amounted to 40,311,000 bushels compared with 77,993,000 bushels for the same weeks in 1931. North American shipments have remained slightly under last year, while all other countries have cleared much less this year than during the same period last year. Russian shipments since August 1 have amounted to only 848,000 bushels compared with 22,493,000 bushels for the same period last year.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 8.1 millions bushels during the first five weeks of the present crop year compared with 15.6 and 15.4 million bushels for the same period in 1931-32 and 1930-31, respectively. North American shipments have averaged 5.3 million bushels this year compared with 5.9 million bushels for the first five weeks of 1931-32.

Harvesting in Russia

The London correspondent of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics cabled on September 5th giving a report upon the progress of harvesting in Soviet Russia. Up to September 1, 1932, a total of 160 million acres of grain had been cut compared with 179 million acres at the same date last year. Of the 160 million acres cut, some 99 million acres had been stacked and 48 million acres threshed. The progress of harvesting in various cereal areas is given as follows:

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics is in receipt of a cable from the International Institute of Agriculture stating that the 1932 French wheat crop is officially estimated at 331 million bushels. The 1931 crop was estimated at 270 million bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING Sept. 2nd, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Sept. 2nd, 1932 show a net increase of 1,149,972 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 116,613,471, Oats 5,655,366, Barley 3,203,778, Flax 1,263,019 and Rye 5,148,677 bushels a total of 131,884,311 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 863,295, Barley 297,183, Flax 42,283 and Rye 32,798 bushels while Oats shows a decrease of 85,587 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 135,335,545 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 104,569,524, Oats 9,120,780, Barley 8,668,446, Flax 796,081 and Rye 12,180,714 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 1,450,907 bushels. Wheat and Flax show decreases of 1,780,368 and 9,632 bushels respectively while increases are noted in Oats of 111,173, Barley 207,123 and Rye 20,797 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). Stocks for the week show a net increase of 59,759 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 62,245 bushels, while Oats shows a decrease of 2,476 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 86,040 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 155,603 bushels while decreases are noted in Oats of 49,411 and Barley 20,152 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show a decrease of 62,694 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat shows a decrease of 172,062 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR).- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 1,035,143 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,192,054, Barley 44,036, Flax 16,730 and Rye 97,863 bushels while Oats shows a decrease of 315,540 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES:- Grain in transit shows a net increase of 920,565 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 664,913, Oats 308,529 and Barley 4,067 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 56,944 bushels.
