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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

A decrease of 2,319,206 bushels is reported in the stocks of wheat in store on July 21, as compared with the previous week. The Canadian visible supply was reported at 198,054,967 bushels compared with the revised figure of 200,374,173 bushels for the previous week and 129,205,117 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

The reduction in the stocks of wheat from the previous week is due to the decreased quantity in store at the Western Country Elevators.

Canadian wheat in store in the United States amounted to 6,221,801 bushels as compared with 5,401,614 bushels on the same date last year.

In transit wheat on the Great Lakes amounted to 2,786,577 bushels on July 21, 1933. On July 22, 1932 4,969,564 bushels were in transit on the lakes.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

The wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces amounted to 2,967,503 bushels for the week ending July 14, 1933, a decrease of 123,720 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 3,091,223 bushels were marketed. For the same week in 1932 455,242 bushels were reported.

Marketings in the Prairie Provinces during the crop year to date amounted to 366,277,650 bushels compared with marketings of 264,766,331 bushels during the corresponding period in 1931-32. Marketings by provinces are as follows, with figures for the same period in 1931-32 given in brackets: Manitoba, 38,022,038 (24,750,135) bushels; Saskatchewan, 185,028,839 (118,588,181) bushels; and Alberta 143,226,773 (121,428,015) bushels.

EXPORTS CLEARANCES OF WHEAT

Export clearance of wheat for the week ending July 21, 1933, amounted to 2,005,941 bushels compared with 1,802,001 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 203,940 bushels. For the corresponding week in 1932, 3,124,167 bushels were reported.

From August 1st, 1932, to July 21, 1933, export clearances of wheat amounted to 218,939,378 bushels compared with 167,664,626 bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32.

During the week ending July 9, 1933 world shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 9,357,000 bushels compared with 10,261,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,840,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year. Shipments from North America and Australia increased compared with the preceding week while clearances from the Argentine show a considerable decrease.

From August 1, 1932 to July 9, 1933 world shipments of wheat amounted to 604 million bushels compared with 760 million bushels for the same period in 1931-32.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 21, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 21, 1933 show a net decrease of 1,859,434 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- wheat 198,054,967, oats 11,863,807, barley 7,619,904, flaxseed 1,099,753 and rye 5,559,036 a total of 224,197,467 bushels. Wheat and rye show decreases of 2,319,206 and 113,349 bushels respectively, while increases are noted in oats of 401,248, barley 165,343, and flaxseed 6,530 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 144,621,185 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 129,205,117, oats 5,330,883, barley 3,449,189, flaxseed 1,191,262 and rye 5,444,734 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 2,230,791 bushels. Wheat and rye show decreases of 2,364,522, and 2,655 bushels respectively, while increases are noted in oats of 99,601, barley 36,608 and flaxseed 177 bushels.
