CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Primary Movement

Deliveries of wheat to country elevators, and platform loadings for the week ending September 2, 1932, amounted to 5,922,008 bushels compared with 6,474,225 bushels for the preceding week. During the first four weeks of the present crop year country deliveries of wheat amounted to 19,689,803 bushels compared with 8,980,254 bushels for the same period last year. Reflecting an earlier harvest, marketings in Manitoba exceeded those of either Saskatchewan or Alberta during the first five weeks of 1932-33. Marketings up to September 2, 1932, in the three Prairie Provinces are shown as follows: Manitoba, 8,141,178 bushels; Saskatchewan, 6,757,262 bushels; Alberta, 4,791,363 bushels.

Inspections

During the month of August, 1932, 20,444 cars of wheat were inspected compared with 8,370 cars during August, 1931. Of the 20,444 cars inspected during August, 17,502 graded No. 3 Northern or better, or 86.1 per cent. During the month of August 1931, 67.03 per cent of inspections graded No. 3 Northern or better. A feature of the present crop year has been relatively heavy inspections of high quality Durum wheat. During August 1932, 2,102 cars of Durum were inspected compared with 1,274 cars for the same month in 1931. Eighty per cent of inspections of Durum wheat graded No. 1, during August 1932, while for the same month last year only 47 per cent of inspections were placed in the top grade.

It is interesting to note that during the past month only 206 cars of wheat graded tough and damp while for the same month last year, out of much smaller inspections, 946 cars graded tough or damp.

Export Clearances

Export clearances of wheat for the week ending September 9, 1932, amounted to 3,980,642 bushels compared with 4,197,424 bushels for the previous week. Clearances for the week were higher from Montreal and Churchill, and lower from Vancouver, Sorel and United States ports.

Export clearances of wheat for the six weeks ending September 9, 1932, amounted to 20,711,373 bushels compared with 13,638,027 bushels for the same period in 1931-32. Clearances by ports for the six weeks ending September 9, with comparative figures for last year, are shown in the following table:

As shown by the above table all Canadian ports have shown increased clearances of wheat this year compared with last year. The most important gain is registered by Montreal with clearances of 10,814,072 bushels compared with 4,956,303 bushels for the same period last year. It is interesting to note the volume of clearances for Churchill during recent weeks when 1,319,802 bushels were cleared. While the total movement of Canadian wheat has increased this year compared with last, and while the foregoing Canadian ports have shown increased clearances, the amount of Canadian wheat cleared through United States ports has decreased. For the six weeks ending September 10, 1932, clearances of wheat through United States ports amounted to 2,300,000 bushels compared with 3,483,000 bushels for the same weeks last year.

WORLD SITUATION

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour for the week ending September 12 amounted to 6,378,000 bushels compared with 11,069,000 bushels for the previous week and 16,152,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments decreased sharply for the week, being over 4 million bushels less than the preceding week. Shipments from the Argentine increased slightly while the movement from Australia and Russia was slightly lower than the previous week.

For the six weeks ending September 12, world shipments amounted to 46,689,000 bushels compared with shipments of 94,145,000 bushels for the same period in 1931-32. North American shipments remained slightly under last year while all other major exporting countries showed large decreases as compared with last year. Russian shipments since August 1, amounted to 1,352,000 bushels compared with shipments of 28,549,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year.

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first six weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31:

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 7.8 million bushels for the first six weeks of 1932-33 compared with 15.7 and 15.0 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 5.0 million bushels per week this year as compared with 5.8 and 9.7 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPT. 9th., 1932

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Sept. 9, 1932, show a net increase of 9,194,709 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 125,789,882, Oats, 5,529,094, Barley 3,314,400, Flax 1,249,090 and Rye 5,196,554, a total of 141,079,020 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 9,176,411, Barley 110,522 and Rye 47,877 bushels, while Oats and Flax show decreases of 126,272 and 13,929 bushels respectively. For the same week last year the amount in store was 143,449,038 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 111,689,572, Oats 9,542,276, Barley 9,256,075, Flax 774,038 and Rye 12,187,077 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS - Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show an increase of 8,402,069 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 8,090,943, Oats 102,777, Barley 142,731 Flax 11,257 and Rye 54,361 bushels.


