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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Primary Movement

Deliveries of wheat to country elevators, and platform loadings for the week ending September 9, 1932, amounted to 22,409,580 bushels compared with 7,010,138 bushels for the preceding week. During the first six weeks of the present crop year country deliveries of wheat amounted to 22,409,580 bushels compared with 16,490,597 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings in Saskatchewan exceeded those of either Manitoba or Alberta during the first six weeks of 1932-33. Marketings up to September 9, 1932, in the three Prairie Provinces are shown as follows:- Manitoba 12,130,812 bushels; Saskatchewan 19,000,842 bushels; Alberta, 10,967,729 bushels.

INSPECTIONS

During the week ending September 14, 10,877 cars of wheat were inspected in the Western Division compared with 4,306 cars for the previous week and 6,403 cars for the corresponding week in 1931. Of the 10,877 cars inspected during the week, 9,148 cars, or 84 per cent, graded No. 3 Northern or better. Shipments of Durum wheat continued large with 1,328 cars inspected, 808 cars of which graded No. 1.

of STOCKS IN STORE

Stocks/Canadian wheat in store in Canada and the United States on September 16 amounted to 153,333,585 bushels compared with 125,739,882 bushels for the previous week and 114,444,405 bushels on the same date last year. Rapid delivery of the new crop accounted for the increase in the visible supply during the week ending September 16. Stocks of wheat in country elevators increased by over 18 million bushels for the week. Increased stocks were also reported at Vancouver, Port Arthur and Fort William and Eastern Canadian Seaboard and Lake Ports. During the week the volume of wheat in transit on the great lakes increased by over 1½ million bushels, amounting to 7,520,453 bushels.


EXPORTS CLEARANCES

Export clearances of wheat for the week ending September 16, 1932, amounted to 4,223,875 bushels compared with 3,980,624 bushels for the previous week. Clearances for the week were higher from Montreal and Churchill, and lower from Vancouver, Sorel and United States ports.

Export clearances of wheat for the seven weeks ending September 16, 1932, amounted to 24,937,248 bushels compared with 16,403,828 bushels for the same period in 1931-32. Clearances by ports for the ^{seven} weeks ending September 16, with comparative figures for last year, are shown in the following table:

All the above Canadian ports show increased handlings during the present crop year compared with the same period in 1931-32. Montreal shows the largest increase with clearances of 12,832,126 bushels compared with 6,131,554 bushels last year. There were no clearances from Churchill during the past week and the total handlings of that port during the present crop year amount to 1,367,713 bushels. For the week ending September 16, clearances from Vancouver were the largest of the past month and amounted to over one million bushels.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 16th, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Sept. 16, 1932 show an increase of 28,477,590 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 153,333,585, Oats 5,675,088, Barley 4,075,346, Flax 1,252,859 and Rye 5,219,732 a total of 169,556,610 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 27,543,703, Oats 145,994, Barley 760,946, Flax 3,769 and Rye 23,178 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 151,330,895 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 118,219,450, Oats 9,635,366, Barley 10,101,480, Flax 1,247,631 and Rye 12,530,133 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show an increase of 18,797,674 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 18,251,922, Oats 274,499, Barley 234,967, Flax 22,272 and Rye 14,014 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). Stocks for the week show an increase of 541,969 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 330,733, Oats 9,256, Barley 1,929 and Rye 51 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 1,374,892 bushels. Wheat and Rye show increases of 1,453,727 and 7,943 bushels respectively. While decreases are noted in Oats of 84,974 and Barley 1,804 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat shows a decrease of 1,334 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat shows an increase of 53,245 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks for the week show a net increase of 2,636,863 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 2,303,415, Oats 9,317 Barley 370,946 and Rye 1,074 bushels while Flax shows a decrease of 47,589 bushels.
