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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Some of the outstanding features in the Canadian wheat situation during the week ended September 23, 1932 were:- Record increase in the marketing on the Prairie Provinces; large export clearances from Canadian and United States ports and increased wheat stocks in Canadian and United States elevators over the previous week.

Primary Movement

Deliveries of wheat to Western Country Elevators and platform loadings for the week ended September 16, 1932, exceeded those of any week since the crop year 1928-29, the amount being 37,487,227 bushels compared with 22,409,580 bushels for the previous week. During the first seven weeks of the crop year country deliveries of wheat amounted to 79,586,610 bushels, compared with 47,232,236 bushels for this same period last year. Marketings up to September 16, 1932, in the three Prairie Provinces were as follows:- Manitoba 16,288,620 bushels; Saskatchewan 42,865,093 bushels and Alberta 20,432,897 bushels. For the corresponding period during 1931-32, the deliveries were:- Manitoba 10,929,175 bushels; Saskatchewan 23,766,430 bushels and Alberta 12,536,-631 bushels.

Inspections

During the week ended September 21, 15,853 cars of wheat were inspected in the Western Division compared with 10,877 cars for the previous week and 5,009 cars for the same week in 1931. Of the first amount 14,848 cars or 93 per cent graded No. 3 Northern or better. Durum wheat inspections amounted to 654 cars against 460 cars for the same week a year ago.

Stocks in Store

Stocks of Canadian wheat in store in Canada and the United States on September 23, 1932 increased to 174,434,070 bushels from 153,333,585 bushels for the previous week. The stocks for the corresponding week in 1931 amounted to 121,238,828 bushels. Increased stocks for the week ended September 23, is accounted for by an increase of 18 millions at Western Country Elevators and the Head of the Lakes over the previous week while smaller increases are shown at all the Elevators with exceptions of Victoria and Churchill.

Export Clearances

Export clearances of wheat for the week ended September 23, 1932, were the largest so far this crop year, amounting to 6,654,701 bushels compared with 4,223,675 bushels for the previous week and 3,241,927 bushels for the same week a year ago. Increased clearances for the week are shown at Montreal, Vancouver, Churchill, and Victoria, B.C., while Sorel and United States ports show decreased export shipments.

Export clearances of wheat for the eight weeks ending September 22, 1932, amounted to 31,591,949 bushels compared with 19,645,755 bushels for the same period in 1931-32.

From the above it will be seen that all Canadian ports show increased shipments over the previous crop year, Montreal being the most outstanding, the amount shown as exported being 16,103,424 bushels compared with 7,487,489 bushels for the same period last year. The Port of Churchill shows shipments of 2,219,324 bushels against 544,769 bushels a year ago. Port of Vancouver export shipments amounted to 7,600,975 bushels compared with 5,556,256 bushels last year.

Water Movement

An advance is shown in the movement of wheat down the lakes as compared with the previous week. The amount shipped during the week ended September 21, 1932 was 9,233,153 bushels against 7,726,261 bushels a week ago. The distribution of the former amount was as follows:- To Lake Huron and Georgian Bay Ports 1,304,326 bushels; To Lake Ontario ports of Pt. Colborne, Kingston, Prescott and Toronto, 4,689,551 bushels; To Montreal 580,885 bushels; To Sorel 111,899 bushels; (lightered at Prescott), To Quebec 32,553 bushels and to Buffalo 2,015,939 bushels. One of the features of the Lake Movement this season is the large shipments to the Lower Ontario ports of Pt. Colborne, Kingston, Prescott and Toronto in comparison to the Georgian Bay and Lake Huron Ports. During the week ended September 21, 1931, 2,574,327 bushels were shipped from the Head of the Lakes destined as follows:- To Canadian Lower Lake ports including Lake Huron and Georgian Bay ports 1,463,468 bushels; To Buffalo 590,441 bushels; To Montreal 450,186 bushels and to Sorel 90,232 bushels.

Internal Movement

During the week ended September 23, the amount of wheat in the Western Division moving to the Elevators reached the total of 57,546,732 bushels, made up of 35,286,899 bushels to Western Country Elevators; 18,092,634 bushels to the Head of the Lakes; 2,507,842 bushels to Vancouver; 1,044,129 bushels to Interior, Private and Mill Elevators and 15,228 bushels to Churchill. The shipments from the above elevators amounted to 32,928,532 bushels accounted for chiefly by 20,434,777 bushels from the Western Country Elevators; 8,259,940 bushels from the Head of the Lakes, 1,818,589 bushels from Vancouver and 251,933 bushels from Victoria. In the Eastern Division 8,231,119 bushels were received by vessel at the Eastern Elevators and 3,513,179 bushels were cleared for export from the ports of Montreal and Sorel. The movement from the Lower Lake Ports to Montreal were shown as 2,932,047 bushels.

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour for the week ending September 26 amounted to 13,863,000 bushels compared with 10,904,000 bushels for the previous week and 15,928,000 bushels for the same week last year. Shipments for the week ending September 26 were the largest of the present crop year. North American shipments for the week ending September 26 showed a sharp increase, amounting to 7,918,000 bushels compared with 5,500,000 bushels for the previous week. Shipments from the Argentine and Australia increased slightly for the week while clearances from Russia were less than one million bushels.

World shipments for the eight weeks ending September 26, amounted to 71 million bushels compared with 129 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to 44 million bushels compared with 48 million bushels for the same weeks last year. It is interesting to note that during the first eight weeks of 1932-33 North American shipments constituted 60 per cent of world shipments while during the same weeks in 1931 North American shipments constituted only 37 per cent of total world shipments. Shipments from Russia during the present crop year amount to 4 million bushels compared with 38 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first eight weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 8.9 million bushels for the first eight weeks of 1932-33 compared with 16.1 and 15.4 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 5.5 million bushels per week this year as compared with 6.0 and 9.7 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.

ITALY

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics is in receipt of a cable from the International Institute of Agriculture at Rome which estimates the 1932 Italian wheat crop at 276 million bushels compared with an output of 248 million bushels in 1931.

RUSSIA

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics is in receipt of a cable from its London correspondent stating that up to September 20 sowings of all crops amounted to 52 million acres compared with 69 million acres sown at the same time last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPT. 23rd, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Sept. 23rd, 1932, show an increase of 23,003,463 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 174,434,070, Oats 6,450,262, Barley 5,102,021, Flax 1,253,610 & Rye 5,320,110 bushels a total of 192,560,073 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 21,100,485, Oats 775,174, Barley 1,026,675, Flax 751 & Rye 100,378 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 154,556,774 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 121,238,826, Oats 9,262,450, Barley 10,887,566, Flax 856,886 & Rye 12,311,044 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.

Stocks of grain in Store in these elevators show an increase of 10,496,379 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 8,292,116, Oats 795,090, Barley 586,047, Flax 46,533 & Rye 76,593 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 559,685 bushels. Wheat & Rye show increases of 731,115 & 1,468 bushels respectively while decreases are noted in Oats of 135,211, Barley 37,508 & Flax 199 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Stocks are the same as for the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Wheat shows a decrease of 251,933 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR. - Wheat shows a decrease of 681,722 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Grain stocks show a net increase of 9,268,325 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 3,931,501, Barley 363,345 & Rye 74,463 bushels, while Oats & Flax show decreases of 81,563 & 19,416 bushels respectively.
