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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Some of the outstanding features of the Canadian wheat situation during the week ending September 30, 1932 were:- another large quantity marketed on the Prairie Provinces, a further increase in the export clearances from Canadian and United States ports and in the stocks of Canadian wheat in Canadian and United States elevators.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Deliveries of wheat to western country elevators and platform loadings for the week ended September 23, 1932, were almost as great as those of the previous week, the amount being 34,592,823 bushels as compared with 37,487,227 bushels for the previous week. For the corresponding week in 1931, only 4,309,416 bushels were marketed. During the first eight weeks of the crop year country deliveries of wheat amounted to 114,179,433 bushels compared with 52,041,652 bushels for the same period last year. Marketings of wheat up to September 23, 1932 on the three prairie provinces were as follows, the quantity within brackets being for the same period last year: Manitoba 21,732,759 (12,417,162) bushels; Saskatchewan 62,483,227 (31,532,581) bushels; Alberta 29,963,447 (18,751,280) bushels.

INSPECTIONS

During the week ending September 30, 1932, 15,759 cars of wheat were inspected in the Western Division compared with 15,853 cars for the previous week and 3,711 cars for the same week in 1931. Of the first amount 15,191 cars or 96 per cent graded No. 3 Northern or better. Tough and damp wheat amounted to only 48 cars against 456 cars for the same week in 1931. Durum wheat inspections were 302 cars compared with 300 cars a year ago.

STOCKS IN STORE

A further increase is shown in the Canadian wheat stocks in Canada and United States elevators on September 30 when 198,168,126 bushels were reported as compared with 175,673,470 bushels for the previous week. The stocks for the corresponding week in 1931 amounted to 126,461,896 bushels. Increased stocks for the week ended September 30 are shown at Western Country Elevators and the Head of the Lakes of 15 million bushels, while smaller increases are noted at all the elevators, with the exception of the elevators at Prince Rupert, Victoria and the Eastern Seaboard and United States Atlantic ports.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

Export clearances of wheat for the week ended September 30th were the largest on record, during the past crop year 1931-32 and so far this crop year, the amount cleared being 7,218,320 bushels compared with 6,654,701 bushels for the previous week and 3,015,660 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. Increased export shipments are shown at Montreal, Sorel, Prince Rupert and United States Atlantic Seaboard ports, while Vancouver and Churchill show decreased export shipments.

From the foregoing it will be noted that the shipments from Canadian ports constituted a large majority of the 38,834,269 bushels cleared. Montreal and Vancouver were the most outstanding, the quantities forwarded being 19,691,992 bushels and 8,800,572 bushels respectively.

WATER MOVEMENT

Another advance is shown in the lake shipments of wheat for the period from September 21 to 30, 1932 compared with previous week ended September 21, 1932, the amount shipped during the above period being 14,614,056 bushels against 9,233,153 bushels a week ago. The distribution of the former amount (14,614,056 bushels) was as follows:- to Buffalo 7,625,878 bushels; to other United States Lake ports 312,140 bushels; to Lake Huron and Georgian Bay Ports 3,908,073 bushels; to Lower Lake Ports 2,540,236 bushels; and to Montreal 312,140 bushels. It will be noted from the above that over half the above movement was destined to Buffalo and other United States Lake ports, while the majority shipped to Canadian ports went to those on Lake Huron and Georgian Bay.

During the corresponding week in 1931, 5,375,043 bushels were shipped from the Head of the Lakes destined as follows:- to Canadian Lower Lake ports including Lake Huron and Georgian Bay ports, 801,789 bushels; to Buffalo 2,981,801 bushels; to Montreal 1,321,867 bushels; and to Sorel 269,586 bushels.


INTERNAL MOVEMENT

During the week ending September 30, the amount of wheat in the Western Division received at the elevators amounted to 55,545,449 bushels; by far the majority was received at the Western Country Elevators and the Head of the Lakes, the quantities being 32,298,691 and 17,959,291 bushels respectively. The receipts at Vancouver were 2,472,566 bushels; at interior and mill elevators 1,644,117 bushels; and at Churchill 170,784 bushels. Shipments from the above elevators were a little in advance of those of the previous week amounting to 38,290,140 bushels compared with 38,928,532 bushels a week ago. Some 23,539,004 bushels were shipped from the Western Country Elevators; 12,323,955 bushels from the Head of the Lakes by vessel; 1,634,622 bushels were exported from the Pacific ports and Churchill and a small amount of 773,343 bushels was moved from the interior and mill elevators. In the Eastern Division 10,582,876 bushels and 212,534 bushels were received by vessel and rail respectively at the eastern elevators, and 14,606,698 bushels were cleared for export from the ports of Montreal and Sorel. The movement from the Lower Lake ports to Montreal was shown as 3,547,924 bushels.

World shipments of wheat and wheatflour for the week ending October 3, 1932, amounted to 13,709,000 bushels compared with 13,863,000 bushels for the previous week and 15,248,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments for the week showed an increase amounting to 8,426,000 bushels compared with 7,918,000 bushels for the previous week and 6,426,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from the Argentine and Russia declined for the week. Clearances from Russia amounted to 1,912,000 bushels compared with 952,000 bushels for the previous week.

World shipments for the nine weeks ending October 3, 1932, amounted to 85 million bushels compared with 144 million bushels for the corresponding weeks in 1931. For the nine weeks North American shipments amounted to 52 million bushels compared with 54 million bushels last year. Shipments from Russia during the present crop year have amounted to 6.2 million bushels compared with 41.6 million bushels for the same weeks last year.

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first nine weeks of 1932-33 along with comparative figures for 1931-32 and 1930-31.

As shown by the above table, world shipments have averaged 9.4 million bushels for the first nine weeks of 1932-33 compared with 16.0 and 15.5 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of 1931-32 and 1930-31 respectively. North American shipments have averaged 5.7 million bushels per week this year as compared with 6.0 and 9.6 million bushels for the corresponding period in 1931-32 and 1930-31.

Russia

The London correspondent of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics cabled on October 1, 1932, that up until September 25, a total of 59 million acres had been sown in Russia. At the same date last year 69 million acres were under crop. The same authority advises that it is not anticipated that Russian shipments of all grains during the present crop year will amount to more than 40 per cent of the volume exported last year.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER, 30, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 30, 1932, show an increase of 25,089,683 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 198,168,126, Oats 7,030,560, Barley 5,749,393, Flax 1,362,136 and Rye 5,339,541, a total of 217,435,457 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 23,734,056, Oats 580,298, Barley 647,372, Flax 108,526 and Rye 19,431 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 160,559,538 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 126,461,896, Oats 9,568,252, Barley 11,337,605, Flaxseed 883,080, and Rye 12,308,705 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show an increase of 9,847,531 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 9,439,237, Oats 193,037, Barley 87,378, Flax 98,187, and Rye 29,692 bushels.

INTERIOR, PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. Stocks for the week show a net increase of 662,590 bushels. Wheat and Oats show increases of 663,865 and 44 bushels respectively, while Barley shows a decrease of 1,319 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 1,328,055 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 1,269,288, Oats 29,370, Barley, 28,318, and Rye 1,079 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show a decrease of 300,033 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show a decrease of 1,571 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show an increase of 35,792 bushels.


