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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

A decrease of 662,679 bushels is reported in the stocks of wheat in store on August 4, as compared with the previous week. The Canadian visible supply was reported at 195,944,810 bushels compared with the revised figure of 196,607,489 bushels for the previous week and 121,202,700 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Canadian wheat in store in the United States amounted to 6,415,527 bushels as compared with 4,616,029 bushels on the same date last year.

In transit wheat on the Great Lakes amounted to 2,736,275 bushels on August 4, 1933. On August 5, 1932, 4,999,539 bushels were in transit on the lakes.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

The wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces amounted to 1,431,216 bushels for the week ending July 28, 1933, a decrease of 1,280,992 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 2,712,208 bushels were marketed. For the same week in 1932, minus 89,895 bushels were reported.


Marketings in the Prairie Provinces during the crop year to date amounted to 370,421,074 bushels compared with marketings of 265,098,385 bushels during the corresponding period in 1931-32. Marketings by provinces are as follows, with figures for the same period in 1931-32 given in brackets: Manitoba 37,658,418 (24,780,566) bushels; Saskatchewan 187,839,387 (118,874,832) bushels; and Alberta 144,923,269 (121,442,987) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES OF WHEAT

Export clearances of wheat for the week ending August 4, 1933, amounted to 2,887,958 bushels compared with 2,713,925 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 174,033 bushels. For the corresponding week in 1932, 2,342,514 bushels were reported.

WORLD SHIPMENTS

World shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the week ending August 5, 1933, amounted to 8,932,000 bushels compared with 9,139,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,776,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments by countries of origin are shown as follows:

North America shipments increased by about 1 million bushels compared with the previous week. Argentine clearances decreased sharply while Australian shipments increased over those of the week ending July 28, 1933.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 4, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 4, 1933 show a net increase of 6,887 bushels. Stocks in Store were as follows:- wheat 195,944,310, oats 12,700,746, barley 7,839,097, flaxseed 1,113,816 and rye 5,618,117 bushels, a total of 223,216,586 bushels. Increases are noted in oats of 448,556, barley 106,562, flaxseed 77,658, and rye 36,790 bushels while wheat decreased 662,679 bushels. For the corresponding date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 121,202,700 oats 5,924,251, barley 3,232,252, flaxseed 1,263,526 and rye 5,176,601 bushels a total of 136,799,330 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Grain stocks show an increase of 1,001 bushels. Oats increased 1,973 bushels, while wheat decreased 972 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 265,882 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 172,284, oats 54,350, barley 31,369 and rye 7,390 bushels while flaxseed decreased 11 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks decreased 273 bushels.


VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks in Store increased 1,183,344 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,043,257, barley 112,409, flaxseed 80,958, and rye 153,141 bushels while oats decreased 206,421 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit decreased 170,219 bushels. Decreased are noted in wheat of 639,465 and flaxseed 8,838 bushels while oats increased 478,084 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks in store at these elevators decreased 522,396 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 586,344 and barley 33,021 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 62,302, flaxseed 26,479 and rye 8,188 bushels.
