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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 6, 1933 shows an increase of 7,655,939 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported at 235,170,472 bushels compared with a revised figure, of 227,514,533 bushels for the previous week and 210,932,689 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932.

Canadian wheat in store in the United States amounted to 6,541,114 bushels compared with 11,028,622 bushels on the same date last year.

In transit wheat on the Great Lakes amounted to 6,541,114 bushels on October 6. On October 7, 1932, 6,082,030 bushels were in transit on the lakes.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2,991,168 bushels compared with 8,318,062 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT OF WHEAT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 29, amounted to 14,325,654 bushels, an increase of 2,281,174 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 12,044,480 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1932, 24,074,080 bushels were reported. For the nine weeks ending September 29, 1933 and September 30, 1932, 78,977,916 bushels and 138,253,477 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts were as follows:- Manitoba 835,541 bushels; Saskatchewan 8,179,037 bushels; Alberta 5,311,076 bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three prairie provinces up to September 29 as compared with the same period a year ago were as follows:- figures within brackets being those for 1932 Manitoba 17,761,241 (23,280,057) bushels; Saskatchewan 38,927,520 (76,521,385); Alberta 22,289,155 (38,452,035) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES


During the week ending October 6, 1933 the export clearances amounted to 4,215,534 bushels compared with 3,813,376 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 402,158 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1932, 7,928,035 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.

World shipments for the week ending October 9th amounted to 9,987,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,680,000 bushels for the previous week and 14,872,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America increased by more than half a million bushels, while clearances from the Argentine and Australia show a decrease of half a million and seven hundred thousand bushels respectively.

During the first ten weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 101 million bushels compared with 99 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments have amounted to 43 million bushels compared with 61 million bushels last year. Since August 1, 1933, the Argentine has cleared 25 million bushels of wheat compared with 8 million for the same weeks last year. Australian shipments have also been slightly heavier than last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first ten weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.1 million bushels per week during the first ten weeks of the crop year as compared with 9.9 and 16.2 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.3 million bushels per week compared with 6.1 and 6.3 million bushels per week during the first ten weeks of 1932-33 and 1931-32. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.5 million bushels per week as compared with .8 million bushels during the same period last year.

United States

On October 10th, 1933, the United States Department of Agriculture issued revised estimates of the 1933 cereal crop of that country. The following table shows 1932 production, September and October estimates for 1933.

The October estimates are slightly higher than the estimates issued in September. Production of all cereals is greatly below that of last year.



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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 6, 1933.**

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 6, 1933, show a net increase of 8,964,318 bushels compared with the revised total of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 235,170,472, oats 16,754,641, barley 11,029,845, flaxseed 1,016,979 and rye 5,033,327 bushels a total of 269,005,264 bushels. Increases noted were as follows:- wheat 7,655,939, oats 828,385, barley 350,617, flaxseed 29,721 and rye 99,656 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 210,932,689, oats 7,998,247, barley 5,947,053, flaxseed 1,479,025 and rye 5,190,935 bushels a total of 231,547,949 bushels.

**WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:** - Grain stocks at these elevators increased 4,513,392 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 4,095,845, oats 259,110, barley 131,066 and flaxseed 30,474 bushels while rye decreased 3,103 bushels.

**INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.** - Stocks for the week show an increase of 598,101 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 565,351, oats 19,628 and barley 13,122 bushels.

**VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.** - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 662,737 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 750,332, barley 3,047 and flaxseed 374 bushels while oats and rye decreased 82,445 and 8,571 bushels respectively.

**PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.** - Grain stocks increased 426,906 bushels, made up of wheat 426,068 and oats 838 bushels.

**VICTORIA ELEVATOR.** - Grain stocks remain unchanged.

**CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.** - Wheat stocks decreased 166,213 bushels.

**PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).** - Stocks in store increased 1,538,451 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 1,026,473, oats 432,180, barley 33,587, flaxseed 450 and rye 45,761 bushels.

**IN TRANSIT LAKES.** - Grain in transit decreased 847,808 bushels. Wheat decreased 1,195,351 bushels while oats and barley increased 293,081 and 54,462 bushels respectively.
