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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 20, 1933 shows an increase of 2,755,819 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported at 245,750,422 bushels compared with a revised figure of 242,994,603 bushels for the previous week and 230,825,217 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932. Stocks reported for October 20 reached a new high record for Canada.

Canadian wheat in store in the United States amounted to 7,554,901 bushels compared with 12,760,137 bushels on the same date last year.

In transit wheat on the Great Lakes amounted to 3,719,976 bushels on October 20. On October 21, 1932, 6,546,654 bushels were in transit on the Lakes.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2,791,878 bushels compared with 7,739,574 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT OF WHEAT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 13, amounted to 14,109,483 bushels, a decrease of 719,083 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 14,828,566 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1932, 17,754,512 bushels were reported. For the eleven weeks ending October 13, 1933 and October 14, 1932, 107,915,965 bushels and 182,349,524 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts were as follows: Manitoba 601,997 bushels; Saskatchewan 7,300,587 bushels; Alberta 6,206,899 bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to October 13, 1933 as compared with the same period in 1932 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1932: Manitoba 19,431,274 (25,178,208) bushels; Saskatchewan 53,953,972 (101,011,487) bushels; Alberta 34,530,713 (56,159,829) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending October 20, 1933 the export clearances amounted to 5,338,008 bushels compared with 3,433,414 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 2,40,594 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1932 7,060,920 bushels were cleared for overseas ports. The clearances for the week ending October 20, are the highest of the crop year to date.

World shipments for the week ending October 23, amounted to 10,627,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,374,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,864,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America increased by more than one million bushels. Clearances from the Argentine and Australia both show a very slight increase over last week while shipments from Russia were reduced by half.

During the first twelve weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 121 million bushels compared with 124 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments had amounted to 54 million bushels compared with 78 million bushels last year. Since August 1, 1933, the Argentine has cleared 28 million bushels of wheat compared with 9 million for the same weeks last year Australian shipments have also been slightly heavier than last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twelve weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.0 million bushels per week during the first twelve weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.3 and 16.4 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.5 million bushels per week compared with 6.5 million bushels per week during the first twelve weeks of 1932-33 and 1931-32. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.3 million bushels per week as compared with .8 million bushels during the same period last year.

Import Requirement Estimate

The London Wheat Conference estimated world import requirements for 1933-34 at 560 million bushels. From August 1, 1933 to October 23, 1933 world shipments amounted to 121 million bushels, or an average of 10.0 million bushels per week. This leaves a balance of 39 million bushels to be shipped during the remaining 40 weeks of the crop year or a weekly average of 11.0 million bushels per week.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 20, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 20, 1933 show a net increase of 3,704,345 bushels. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 245,750,422, oats 18,541,843, barley 11,865,742, flaxseed 1,081,265 and rye 4,995,291 bushels, a total of 282,234,563 bushels. Increases noted were as follows:- wheat 2,755,819, oats 677,333, barley 245,254, flaxseed 19,144 and rye 6,795 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 230,825,217, oats 8,374,540, barley 5,546,914, flaxseed 1,338,038, and rye 5,531,925 bushels, a total of 251,616,634 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators increased 2,256,124 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 2,136,495, oats 76,038, barley 40,165 and flaxseed 5,357 bushels while rye decreased 1,931 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC & SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 562,471 bushels, made up as follows:- wheat 507,403, oats 32,003, and barley 23,065 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 385,258 bushels. Wheat stocks increased 408,992 bushels while oats and barley decreased 8,470 and 15,264 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks increased 171,388 bushels, made up of wheat 170,557 and oats 831 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain same as previous week.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks increased 576,403 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks increased 2,829,573 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 3,230,966, barley 23,128 and flaxseed 12,362 bushels while decreases are shown in oats of 222,884 and rye 213,999 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit decreased 4,074,328 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 4,533,620, flaxseed 76,101 and rye 33,000 bushels while oats and barley increased 531,651 and 36,742 bushels respectively.
