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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 3, 1933 shows an increase of 1,960,196 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported at 250,968,013 bushels compared with a revised figure of 249,007,817 bushels for the previous week and 242,302,950 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932. The difference between the 1933 visible supplies and those for the same date in 1932 is now only a little over 8 million bushels.

Canadian wheat in store in the United States amounted to 9,722,584 bushels compared with 15,450,976 bushels on the same date last year.

In transit wheat on the Great Lakes amounted to 4,673,905 bushels on November 3. On November 4, 1932, 4,425,261 bushels were in transit on the Lakes.

United States wheat in Canada was 2,656,046 bushels compared with 7,509,687 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 27 declined to 5,323,567 bushels, a little over one-half of the amount received during the previous week when 10,420,017 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week in 1932, 15,648,568 bushels were reported. For the thirteen weeks ending October 27, 1933 and October 28, 1932, 123,659,549 and 215,006,678 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 27, were as follows: Manitoba 526,230 bushels; Saskatchewan 2,839,489 bushels; Alberta 1,957,848 bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to October 27, 1933 as compared with the same period in 1932 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1932: Manitoba 20,550,728 (26,231,349) bushels; Saskatchewan 62,075,812 (119,050,387) bushels; Alberta 41,033,809 (69,724,942) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES


During the week ending November 3, 1933 the export clearances amounted to 3,582,353 bushels compared with 4,037,493 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 455,140 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1932, 6,369,002 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.

World shipments for the week ending November 6, amounted to 9,358,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,153,000 bushels for the previous week and 14,352,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America show a decrease of three hundred thousand bushels, while Australian clearances increased by half a million bushels and shipments from Russia decreased by half a million bushels.

During the first fourteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 140 million bushels compared with 148 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments have amounted to 63 million bushels compared with 93 million bushels last year. Since August 1, 1933, the Argentine has cleared 30 million bushels of wheat compared with 13 million for the same weeks last year. Australian shipments have also been slightly heavier than last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first fourteen weeks of the present crop year, along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.0 million bushels per week during the first fourteen weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.6 and 16.4 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.5 million bushels per week compared with 6.7 and 6.8 million bushels per week during the first fourteen weeks of 1932-33 and 1931-32. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.2 million bushels per week as compared with .7 million bushels during the same period last year.

Import Requirement Estimate

The London Wheat Conference estimated world import requirements for 1933-34 at 560 million bushels. From August 1, 1933 to November 6, 1933 world shipments amounted to 140 million bushels, or an average of 10.0 million bushels per week. This leaves a balance of 420 million bushels to be shipped during the remaining 38 weeks of the crop year or a weekly average of 11.0 million bushels per week.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 3, 1933

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 3, 1933 show a net increase of 1,641,992 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows.- wheat 250,968,013, oats 19,331,206, barley 11,909,512, flaxseed 899,817 and rye 4,563,775 bushels, a total of 287,672,323 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,960,196 and oats 286,962 bushels while decreases are noted in barley of 103,062, flaxseed 28,826 and rye 473,278 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows.- wheat 242,302,950, oats 6,524,149, barley 5,225,284, flaxseed 1,552,325 and rye 5,066,984 bushels. A total of 262,677,691 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks for the week increased 1,219,865 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 867,741, oats 311,913 and barley 48,694 bushels while decreases are shown in flaxseed of 7,990 and rye 493 bushels.

INTERIOR PRIVATE AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 36,303 bushels. Wheat stocks decreased 51,395 bushels while increases are noted in oats and barley of 8,035 and 7,007 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 481,730 bushels. Increases noted were as follows.- wheat 464,308, oats 16,067 and barley 1,355 bushels.


PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain same as previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,282,377 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 930,363, barley 250,236, and rye 207,537 bushels while oats and flaxseed increased 100,140 and 5,619 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit increased 639,004 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 334,515 and barley 138,782 bushels while oats and flaxseed decreased 331,932 and 2,361 bushels respectively.




