WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 17, 1933 shows a decrease of 1,720,593 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported at 248,339,889 bushels compared with a revised figure of 250,060,482 bushels for the previous week and 237,711,339 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932.

Canadian wheat in store in the United States amounted to 10,969,709 bushels compared with 13,870,943 bushels on the same date last year.

In transit wheat on the Great Lakes amounted to 3,769,639 bushels on November 17. On November 18, 1932, 2,999,886 bushels were in transit on the Lakes.

United States wheat in Canada was 2,821,891 bushels compared with 7,137,957 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 10, amounted 6,672,399 bushels, a decrease of 1,070,540 bushels compared with 7,742,939 bushels marketed in the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1932, 9,557,241 bushels were marketed. For the fifteen weeks ending November 10, 1933 and November 11, 1932, 138,074,887 and 235,512,258 bushels were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending November 10 were as follows: Manitoba 464,003 bushels; Saskatchewan 3,167,520 bushels; Alberta 3,040,876 bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to November 10, 1933 as compared with the same period in 1932 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1932: Manitoba 21,651,756 (26,905,062) bushels; Saskatchewan 69,426,486 (128,844,723) bushels; Alberta 46,996,645 (79,762,473) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending November 17, 1933 the export clearances amounted to 3,673,783 bushels compared with 4,695,545 bushels for the previous week, a decreased of 1,021,762 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1932, 6,968,900 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.

World shipments for the week ending November 20, amounted to 10,128,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,594,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,808,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Australia both increased by about two hundred thousand bushels while Argentine clearances show a slight decrease.

During the first sixteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 161 million bushels compared with 173 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments have amounted to 74 million bushels compared with 110 million bushels last year. Since August 1, 1933 the Argentine has cleared 32 million bushels of wheat compared with 12 million bushels for the same weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first sixteen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.1 million bushels per week during the first sixteen weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.8 and 16.3 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.6 million bushels per week compared with 6.9 million bushels per week during the first sixteen weeks of 1932-33 and 1931-32. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.0 million bushels per week as compared with .8 million bushels during the same period last year.

Import Requirement Estimate

The London Wheat Conference estimated world import requirements for 1933-34 at 560 million bushels. From August 1, 1933 to November 20, 1933 world shipments amounted to 161 million bushels, or an average of 10.1 million bushels per week. This leaves a balance of 399 million bushels to be shipped during the remaining 36 weeks of the crop year or a weekly average of 11.1 million bushels per week.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS- WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 17, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 17, 1933 show a net decrease of 1,246,769 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 248,339,889, oats 20,169,487, barley 12,167,076, flaxseed 823,964 and rye 4,210,244 bushels, a total of 285,710,660 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,720,593 and flaxseed 22,853 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 242,583 barley 238,261 and rye 15,833 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 237,711,339, oats 8,202,575, barley 5,406,595 flaxseed 1,516,801 and rye 4,851,833 bushels, a total of 257,689,143 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators decreased 38,668 bushels. Wheat decreased 88,673 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 34,633, barley 13,305 flaxseed 1,132 and rye 935 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 13,433 bushels. Wheat decreased 15,525 bushels while oats increased 2,092 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 368,915 bushels. Wheat increased 445,514 bushels while decreases are shown in oats of 10,126, barley 57,901 and rye 8,572 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Oat stocks show a decrease of 235 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks increased 405,046 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks show an increase of 61,374 bushels, made up of wheat 61,251 and oats 123 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks in store show a net decrease of 672,766 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 923,762, barley 14,497 and flaxseed 21,990 bushels while oats and rye increased 230,364 and 57,119 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit increased 890,400 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 894,121, barley 39,123 and flaxseed 55,347 bushels, while oats decreased 98,191 bushels.




