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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 24, 1933 shows a decrease of 1,294,191 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported at 246,362,866 bushels compared with a revised figure of 247,657,057 bushels for the previous week and 238,249,080 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932.

Canadian wheat in store in the United States amounted to 11,872,671 bushels compared with 13,864,527 bushels on the same date last year.

In transit wheat on the Great Lakes amounted to 3,547,163 bushels on November 24. On November 25, 1932, 3,990,378 bushels were in transit on the Lakes.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2,250,645 bushels compared with 6,972,065 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT OF WHEAT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 17 amounted to 6,454,158 bushels, a decrease of 218,241 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 6,672,399 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1932, 9,319,945 bushels were reported. For the sixteen weeks ending November 17, 1933 and November 18, 1932, 144,529,045 bushels and 244,832,203 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts were as follows: Manitoba 357,654 bushels; Saskatchewan 2,397,285 bushels; Alberta 2,699,219 bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to November 17, 1933 as compared with the same period in 1932 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1932: Manitoba 22,009,410 (27,295,717) bushels; Saskatchewan 71,823,771 (133,522,499) bushels; Alberta 49,695,864 (84,013,987) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES


During the week ending November 23, 1933 the export clearances amounted to 4,796,504 bushels compared with 3,673,783 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,122,721 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1932, 7,164,376 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.

World shipments for the week ending November 27, amounted to 9,716,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,128,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,608,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America increased by almost two hundred thousand bushels while Argentine clearances show a decrease of over three hundred thousand bushels. Australian shipments decreased by about 500,000 bushels. Russian shipments increased sharply, amounting to 1,400,000 bushels.

During the first seventeen weeks of the present crop year, world shipments amounted to 171 million bushels compared with 186 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments have amounted to 80 million bushels compared with 118 million bushels last year. Since August 1, 1933 the Argentine has cleared 33 million bushels of wheat compared with 13 million bushels for the same weeks last year. Australian shipments are slightly lower than last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first seventeen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.1 million bushels per week during the first seventeen weeks of the crop year as compared with 11.0 and 16.1 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.7 million bushels per week compared with 7.0 million bushels per week during the first seventeen weeks of 1932-33 and 1931-32. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.0 million bushels per week as compared with .8 million bushels during the same period last year.

Import Requirement Estimate

The London Wheat Conference estimated world import requirements for 1933-34 at 560 million bushels. From August 1, 1933 to November 27, 1933 world shipments amounted to 171 million bushels, or an average of 10.1 million bushels per week. This leaves a balance of 389 million bushels to be shipped during the remaining 35 weeks of the crop year or a weekly average of 11.1 million bushels per week.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 24, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 24, 1933 show a net decrease of 1,241,621 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 246,362,866, oats 20,379,696, barley 12,126,649, flaxseed 750,561 and rye 4,196,482 bushels a total of 283,796,254 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,294,191, barley 40,736, flaxseed 94,741 and rye 7,396 bushels while oats increased 195,443 bushels. For the corresponding week last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 238,249,080, oats 8,568,441, barley 5,720,887, flaxseed 1,593,492 and rye 4,933,934 bushels a total of 259,065,834 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks in store for the week show a net decrease of 419,346 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 358,539, oats 59,319, barley 2,676 and flaxseed 1,096 bushels while rye increased 2,284 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 461,500 bushels. Wheat decreased 473,872 bushels while increases are noted in oats and barley of 12,833 and 4,539 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 24,678 bushels. Decreases are noted in oats of 59,037, barley 33,078 and flaxseed 21 bushels while wheat increased 67,458 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Oat stocks decreased 118 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat increased 166,274 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat increased 213,787 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks for the week decreased 183,456 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 525,720, barley 61,615 and flaxseed 19,368 bushels while decreases are shown in oats of 446,833 and rye 6,409 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit decreased 914,885 bushels made up as follows wheat 222,476, oats 514,675, barley 125,110 and flaxseed 52,624 bushels.
