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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 1, 1933 shows a decrease of 3,193,027 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported at 243,074,790 bushels compared with a revised figure of 246,267,817 bushels for the previous week and 237,193,894 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932. The wheat stocks are nearing the 1932 figures, the difference being less than 6,000,000 bushels.

Canadian wheat in store in the United States amounted to 14,473,825 bushels compared with 15,196,891 bushels on the same date last year.

In transit wheat on the Great Lakes amounted to 2,350,577 bushels on December 1, On December 2, 1932, 3,446,893 bushels were in transit on the Lakes,

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2,250,645 bushels compared with 6,999,847 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT OF WHEAT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 24 amounted to 2,900,513 bushels, a sharp decrease of 3,553,645 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 6,454,158 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1932, 7,491,780 bushels were reported. For the seventeen weeks ending November 24, 1933 and November 25, 1932, 147,429,558 and 252,323,983 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending November 24, 1933 were as follows: Manitoba 1,58,006 bushels; Saskatchewan 1,542,141 bushels; Alberta 1,200,396 bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to November 24, 1933 as compared with the same period in 1932 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1932: Manitoba 22,167,416 (28,059,632) bushels; Saskatchewan 74,365,912 (136,669,296) bushels; Alberta 50,896,230 (87,595,055) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending December 1, 1933 the export clearances amounted to 4,518,364 bushels compared with 4,796,501 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 278,140 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1932, 9,234,461 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.

LAKE MOVEMENT OF WHEAT

During the period from November 22 to 30 the movement of wheat by vessel from Fort William and Port Arthur amounted to 6,818,618 bushels compared with 7,416,997 bushels for the same week in 1932. The destinations of the first amount were as follows: To Canadian lower lake ports 2,219,216 bushels; to Buffalo 4,021,966 bushels and other United States lake ports 577,437 bushels. This compared for the corresponding week in 1932 with 5,847,168 bushels to lower lake ports, 459,020 bushels to Montreal and 1,110,809 bushels to Buffalo.

International Trade

World shipments for the week ending December 4, amounted to 11,716,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,716,000 bushels for the previous week and 16,512,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America increased by over half a million bushels while clearances from Australia and the Argentine show an increase of more than eight hundred thousand bushels.

During the first eighteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 183 million bushels compared with 202 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments have amounted to 86 million bushels compared with 131 million bushels last year. Since August 1, 1933 the Argentine has cleared 34 million bushels of wheat compared with 14 million bushels for the same weeks last year. Australian shipments are slightly lower than last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first eighteen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.2 million bushels per week during the first eighteen weeks of the crop year as compared with 11.2 and 15.9 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.8 million bushels per week compared with 7.3 million bushels per week during the first eighteen weeks of 1932-33 and 1931-32. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.0 million bushels per week as compared with .8 million bushels during the same period last year.

Import Requirement Estimate

The London Wheat Conference estimated world import requirements for 1933-34 at 560 million bushels. From August 1, 1933 to December 4, 1933 world shipments amounted to 183 million bushels, or an average of 10.2 million bushels per week. This leaves a balance of 377 million bushels to be shipped during the remaining 34 weeks of the crop year or a weekly average of 11.0 million bushels per week.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 1, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Dec. 1, 1933 show a net decrease of 3,530,944 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- Wheat, 243,074,790; oats, 20,264,183; barley, 11,880,027; flaxseed, 707,606, and rye 4,173,523 bushels, a total of 280,100,129 bushels. Decreases noted were as follows:- Wheat, 3,193,027; oats, 74,363; barley, 219,415; flaxseed, 24,301, and rye 19,838 bushels. At a comparable date last year, stocks in store were as follows:- Wheat, 237,193,894; oats, 9,115,034; barley 6,023,932; flaxseed, 1,582,015, and rye 4,770,382 bushels, a total of 258,685,257 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks for the week show an increase of 226,158 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat, 180,119; oats, 35,497; barley, 8,830; flaxseed, 120; and rye 1,592 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 162,095 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 137,851, and barley 28,796 bushels, while oats increased 4,552 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 104,807 bushels. Wheat increased 185,857 bushels, while decreases are shown in oats of 20,835, barley 54,873 and rye 5,342 bushels.


PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.- Oats decreased 1,176 bushels.


