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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 22, 1933 shows a decrease of 1,184,795 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 242,729,406 bushels compared with a revised figure of 243,914,201 bushels for the previous week and 236,516,140 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 14,585,814 bushels of which 5,943,778 bushels and 5,816,039 bushels were in store and afloat at Buffalo and New York respectively. This compared with 14,463,835 bushels on the same date last year. 7,521,802 bushels were located at Buffalo and 3,790,566 bushels at New York.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2,248,845 bushels compared with 6,956,010 bushels last year.

PRI-MARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 15 amounted to 3,095,303 bushels, a decrease of 154,912 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 3,250,295 bushels were marketed. During the same period in 1932, 3,848,020 bushels were reported. For the twenty weeks ending December 15, 1933 and December 16, 1932, 157,730,767 and 270,077,947 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By the provinces the receipts for the week ending December 15, 1933 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the same week in 1932: Manitoba 158,112 (238,592); Saskatchewan 1,365,706 (1,381,471) bushels; Alberta 1,571,485 (2,227,957) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to December 15, 1933 as compared with the same period in 1932 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1932: Manitoba 22,776,531 (29,270,797) bushels; Saskatchewan 79,576,065 (143,592,109) bushels; Alberta 55,378,171 (97,215,041) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending December 22, 1933 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,347,673 bushels compared with 1,382,697 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 964,976 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1932, 4,770,025 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.

World shipments for the week ending December 25, amounted to 10,086,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 8,912,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,408,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from all countries, except Russia, increased slightly over last week; Australian clearances rose by eight hundred thousand bushels and the Argentine by over half a million bushels. Russian shipments dropped by almost two hundred thousand bushels.

During the first twenty-one weeks of the present crop year, world shipments amounted to 210 million bushels compared with 235 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments have amounted to 97 million bushels compared with 150 million bushels last year. Since August 1, 1933 the Argentine has cleared 37 million bushels of wheat compared with 19 million bushels for the same weeks last year. Australian shipments are slightly lower than last year.



As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.0 million bushels per week during the first twenty-one weeks of the crop year as compared with 11.2 and 15.3 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.6 million bushels per week compared with 7.2 million bushels per week during the first twenty-one weeks of 1932-33 and 1931-32. Argentine shipments have averaged 1.8 million bushels per week as compared with .9 million bushels during the same period last year.

Import Requirement Estimate

The London Wheat Conference estimated world import requirements for 1933-34 at 560 million bushels. From August 1, 1933 to December 25, 1933 world shipments amounted to 210 million bushels, or an average of 10.0 million bushels per week. This leaves a balance of 350 million bushels to be shipped during the remaining 31 weeks of the crop year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 22, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 22, 1933 show a net decrease of 1,258,069 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 2,729,405, oats 20,173,799, barley 11,719,082, flaxseed 620,565 and rye 4,116,940 bushels a total of 279,359,792 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,184,795, barley 97,177, flaxseed 1,031 and rye 11,762 bushels, while oats shows an increase of 36,696 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 236,516,140, oats 9,327,543, barley 6,645,373 flaxseed 1,421,841 and rye 4,984,930 a total of 258,895,827 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks for the week show an increase of 499,828 bushels made up as follows: wheat 353,803, oats 129,501, barley 10,149, flaxseed 3,538 and rye 2,837 bushels.


