WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 29, 1933 shows a decrease of 1,204,155 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 241,683,101 bushels compared with a revised figure of 242,887,256 bushels for the previous week and 237,390,896 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 14,038,595 bushels of which 5,482,648 bushels and 5,870,950 bushels were in store and afloat at Buffalo and New York respectively. This compared with 13,575,232 bushels on the same date last year. 7,431,720 bushels were located at Buffalo and 3,319,025 bushels at New York.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2,248,845 bushels compared with 6,937,929 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 22, 1933 amounted to 1,832,253 bushels, a decrease of 1,263,050 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 3,095,303 bushels were marketed. During the same period in 1932, 3,374,622 bushels were marketed. For the twenty-one weeks ending December 22, 1933 and December 23, 1932, 159,563,020 bushels and 273,452,569 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By the provinces the receipts for the week ending December 22, 1933 were as follows figures within brackets being those of the same week in 1932: Manitoba 24,617, (133,635) bushels; Saskatchewan 768,668 (1,142,875) bushels; Alberta 1,038,968 (2,098,112) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to December 22, 1933 as compared with the same period in 1932 were as follows, figures in brackets being those for 1932: Manitoba 22,801,148 (29,404,432) bushels; Saskatchewan 80,344,733 (144,734,984) bushels; Alberta 56,417,139 (99,313,153) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending December 29, 1933 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,990,603 bushels compared with 2,347,673 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 357,070 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1932, 3,588,445 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.



World shipments for the week ending January 1, amounted to 10,287,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,086,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,408,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932-33. Shipments from North America decreased by almost half a million bushels while Australian and Argentine clearances both increased by approximately the same amount. Russian shipments show an increase of almost two hundred thousand bushels.

During the first twenty-two weeks of the present crop year, world shipments amounted to 220 million bushels compared with 245 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last crop year. North American shipments have amounted to 100 million bushels compared with 155 million bushels in 1932-33. Since August 1, 1933 the Argentine has cleared 39 million bushels of wheat compared with 20 million bushels for the same weeks of the last crop year. Australian shipments are slightly lower than in 1932-33.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twenty-two weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.0 million bushels per week during the first twenty-two weeks of the crop year as compared with 11.1 and 15.1 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.5 million bushels per week compared with 7.0 million bushels per week during the first twenty-two weeks of 1932-33 and 1931-32. Argentine shipments have averaged 1.8 million bushels per week as compared with .9 million bushels during the same period in the last crop year.

Import Requirement Estimate

The London Wheat Conference estimated world import requirements for 1933-34 at 560 million bushels. From August 1, 1933 to January 1, 1934 world shipments amounted to 220 million bushels, or an average of 10.0 million bushels per week. This leaves a balance of 340 million bushels to be shipped during the remaining 30 weeks of the crop year or a weekly average of 11.3 million bushels

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 29, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 29, 1933 show a net decrease of 1,325,438 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 241,683,101, oats 20,157,053, barley 11,610,661, flaxseed 601,865 and rye 4,112,341 bushels, a total of 278,165,021 bushels. Decreases were made up as follows:- wheat 1,204,155, oats 21,812, barley 84,164, flaxseed 11,373 and rye 3,934 bushels. At a comparable date last year, stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 237,390,896, oats 9,235,929, barley 6,771,597, flaxseed 1,435,833 and rye 4,990,060 bushels, a total of 259,824,315 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 113,860 bushels. Wheat increased 129,227 and oats 12,688 bushels while decreases are shown in barley of 23,679, flaxseed 3,809 and rye 567 bushels.




