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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 19, 1934 shows a decrease of 1,696,058 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 235,249,097 bushels compared with a revised figure of 236,945,155 bushels for the previous week and 228,891,246 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 10,802,537 bushels of which 4,035,885 bushels and 4,926,655 bushels were in store and afloat at Buffalo and New York respectively. This compared with 11,234,317 bushels on the same date last year of which 6,786,560 bushels were located at Buffalo and 1,837,270 bushels at New York.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2,248,845 bushels compared with 6,680,302 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 12, 1934 amounted to 2,369,521 bushels, an increase of 876,224 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 1,493,297 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1933, 2,594,478 bushels were marketed. For the twenty-four weeks ending January 12, 1934 and January 13, 1933, 164,675,422 bushels and 280,583,049 bushels were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending January 12, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those of the same week in 1933: Manitoba 169,796 (95,003) bushels; Saskatchewan 941,248 (760,131) bushels; Alberta 1,358,477 (1,739,344) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to January 12, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933 were as follows, figures in brackets being those for 1933: Manitoba 23,033,275 (29,752,042) bushels; Saskatchewan 82,685,097 (147,253,991) bushels; Alberta 58,958,050 (103,577,016) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending January 19, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,426,214 bushels compared with 2,633,028 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 793,186 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1933, 2,575,832 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.

REPORTS VIA SHIPPING ROUTES

According to Canadian Customs returns during the month of December, 1933, 17,457,963 bushels of wheat valued at \$11,300,336 were exported from Canada compared with 27,735,999 bushels with a value of \$14,504,352 for the same month in 1932. For the month no exports were made to the United States for consumption. 4,110,647 bushels moved via United States lake ports of Buffalo and Erie. Exports amounting to 7,766,520 bushels and 5,580,796 bushels moved from Canadian Atlantic and Pacific ports respectively. No rerouted wheat was registered during December.

WHEAT EXPORTS - FIVE MONTHS ENDING DECEMBER, 1933.

Exports during the five months ending December, 1933, amounted to 92,226,752 bushels valued at \$64,015,615 compared with 140,394,459 bushels with a value of \$75,824,415 for the same period in 1932. Of the former 99,645 bushels were exported to the United States for consumption, 25,571,104 bushels moved out via United States Atlantic ports, 46,425,301 bushels were exported via Canadian Atlantic ports, 17,728,823 bushels via Canadian Pacific ports and 2,401,379 bushels via the Port of Churchill, Manitoba, making a total via Canadian ports of 66,556,003 bushels.

The rerouted wheat from United States lake ports to Canadian ports amounted to 947,033 bushels which increases the movement via Canadian ports to 67,503,036 bushels and decreases the exports via United States ports to 24,628,071 bushels.

WHEAT/LOUR EXPORTS - MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1933.

During the month of December, 520 barrels of wheatflour were exported to the United States direct for consumption. 38,671 barrels moved via United States ports for export overseas and 265,752 barrels were exported via Canadian Atlantic ports, while 113,240 barrels were exported from Canadian Pacific ports. The total export for the month amounted to 418,183 barrels valued at \$1,471,708 compared with 492,033 barrels valued at \$1,535,053 during the same month in 1932.

WHEAT/LOUR EXPORTS - FIVE MONTHS ENDED DECEMBER, 1933.

Wheatflour exports during the five months ending December, 1933, show a slight increase over the same period in 1932. The number of barrels exported for the five month period in 1933 was 2,512,997 barrels valued at \$9,325,672 compared with 2,313,186 barrels valued at \$7,408,174 for the same five months in 1932, an increase in quantity of 199,811 barrels and in value \$1,917,498. Exports of Canadian Atlantic ports amounted to 1,774,417 barrels, from Canadian Pacific ports 540,508 barrels, while 196,256 barrels were exported to United States ports for export overseas and 1,816 barrels were shipped to the United States for consumption.

WHEAT AND WHEAT/LOUR - EXPORTS COMBINED FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1933.

The combined exports of wheat and wheatflour, the latter reduced to bushels at $4\frac{1}{2}$ bushels to the barrel, amounted to 19,339,737 bushels compared with 29,950,148 bushels for the same month in 1932. Of the former amount 2,340 bushels went to the United States direct, 4,284,667 bushels were exported to the United States for export overseas, 8,962,404 bushels were moved direct from Canadian Atlantic ports and 6,090,376 bushels were shipped overseas from Canadian Pacific ports. No rerouted grain was reported.

WHEAT AND WHEAT/LOUR - FIVE MONTHS ENDING DECEMBER, 1933.

Exports of wheat and wheatflour in bushels for the five months ending December 1933 and 1932 amounted to 103,535,259 bushels and 150,803,797 bushels respectively. The routing of the first amount was as follows: 107,313 bushels to the United States for consumption, 26,454,256 bushels moved to United States ports for export overseas, 54,410,177 bushels were exported direct from Canadian Atlantic ports, 20,161,109 bushels were shipped from Canadian Pacific ports and 2,401,879 bushels were moved from Churchill, Manitoba. The rerouted wheat amounted to 947,033 bushels which increased the Canadian Atlantic exports to 55,357,210 bushels and decreases the amount routed via United States ports to 25,507,221 bushels.

COARSE GRAIN EXPORTS

Oats exported during the month of December 1933 amounted to 575,462 bushels and 1,895,603 bushels for the five months ending December 1933. The former figures include 2,259 bushels and the latter 35,083 bushels exported direct to the United States for consumption, the balance of the export moved from Canadian seaboard ports to overseas countries.

Barley exports amounted to 249,903 bushels during the month of December and 675,988 bushels for the five months ending December 1933. With the exception of 50 bushels exported to the United States, the balance was shipped to overseas countries.

There were no rye exports during the month of December 1933. The five month exports of rye is, therefore, the same as those for the four months ending November 1933.

Flaxseed exported for the month of December amounted to only 412 bushels from Canadian Atlantic ports. The five month exports amounted 183,112 bushels, 182,700 bushels going to the United States direct and 452 bushels as above stated.

Imports of wheat from Canada into United States for milling in bond for the period from August 5, 1933 to January 13, 1934 amounted to 5,548,000 bushels which added to 85,382,606 bushels cleared from Canadian and United States seaboard makes 90,930,606 bushels.

EXPORTS BY COUNTRIES OF DESTINATION

During the five months ending December 1933, 92,226,752 bushels were exported from Canada according to Customs Returns. the largest proportion of this was destined to the United Kingdom, the amount being 59,921,992 bushels.

Wheatflour exports for the five months ending December 1933 amounted to 2,512,997 barrels, about one-half or 1,136,998 barrels were destined to the United Kingdom. Other countries in the British Empire to which flour was destined are as follows:- Newfoundland 191,654 barrels, Irish Free State 185,519 barrels, Jamaica 134,885 barrels, Trinidad 92,509 barrels, Other British West Indies 66,736 barrels, Barbados 31,795 barrels. Smaller amounts amounting to 70,368 barrels were billed to New Zealand, British Guiana, Sierra Leone, British Honduras, Southern Rhodesia, British East and South Africa, British Indies, Straits Settlements and British Oceania.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 19, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 19, 1934 show a net decrease of 2,174,153 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 235,249,097, oats 19,196,766, barley 11,324,193, flaxseed 599,307 and rye 4,089,262 bushels a total of 270,458,625 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,696,058, oats 435,931, barley 43,636 and flaxseed 1,879 bushels while rye increased 3,351 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 228,891,246, oats 9,334,922, barley 6,789,814, flaxseed 1,476,060 and rye 5,014,237 bushels a total of 251,506,279 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 15,791 bushels. Increases are noted in barley of 69,616 and flaxseed 556 bushels while decreases are shown in wheat of 47,241, oats 2,693 and rye 4,447 bushels.


INTERIOR PUBLIC & SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 426,781 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 338,946 and oats 89,165 bushels while barley increased 1,330 bushels.

VANCOUVER & NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 51,547 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 91,088 and barley 13,934 bushels while oats increased 52,575 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain the same as the previous week.
