WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 26, 1934 shows a decrease of 188,850 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 234,992,160 bushels compared with a revised figure of 235,181,010 bushels for the previous week and 229,186,647 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 10,405,745 bushels of which 4,021,784 bushels and 4,764,961 bushels were in store and afloat at Buffalo and New York respectively. This compared with 11,150,458 bushels on the same date last year of which 6,773,520 bushels were located at Buffalo and 1,694,451 bushels at New York.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2,248,845 bushels compared with 6,793,357 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 19, 1934 amounted to 3,374,304 bushels, an increase of 1,004,783 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 2,369,521 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1933, 2,381,573 bushels were marketed. For the twenty-five weeks ending January 19, 1934 and January 20, 1933, 168,050,726 bushels and 282,964,622 bushels were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending January 19, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those of the same week in 1933: Manitoba 109,033 (72,892) bushels; Saskatchewan 1,407,281 (614,060) bushels; Alberta 1,857,990 (1,694,621) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to January 19, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933 were as follows, figures in brackets being those for 1933: Manitoba 23,142,308 (29,824,934) bushels; Saskatchewan 84,092,378 (147,868,-051) bushels; Alberta 60,816,040 (105,271,637) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending January 26, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,490,498 bushels compared with 3,426,214 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 935,716 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1933, 2,934,672 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.

World shipments for the week ending January 29, amounted to 13,369,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,220,000 bushels for the previous week and 13,944,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932-33. Shipments from North America decreased by 600,000 bushels during the past week, while clearances from the Argentine and Australia increased by about 1 million and 300,000 bushels respectively. Russian shipments showed an increase of seven hundred thousand bushels.

During the first twenty-six weeks of the present crop year, world shipments amounted to 263 million bushels compared with 302 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of the last crop year. North American shipments have amounted to 117 million bushels compared with 175 million bushels in 1932-33. Since August 1, 1933, the Argentine has cleared 49 million bushels of wheat compared with 32 million bushels for the same weeks of the last crop year. Australian shipments have amounted to 44 million bushels as compared with 60 million bushels in 1932-33. Russian shipments amounted to 24 million bushels compared with 16 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twenty-six weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.1 million bushels per week during the first twenty-six weeks of the crop year as compared with 11.6 and 15.1 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.5 million bushels per week compared with 6.7 million bushels per week during the first twenty-six weeks of 1932-33 and 1931-32. Argentine shipments have averaged 1.9 million bushels per week as compared with 1.2 million bushels during the same period in the last crop year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS .. WEEK ENDING JANUARY 26, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 26, 1934 show a net decrease of 518,923 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 234,992,160, oats 18,985,036, barley 11,260,021, flaxseed 605,342 and rye 4,085,552 bushels, a total of 269,928,091 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 188,850, oats 238,264, barley 89,416, and rye 4,410 bushels while flaxseed increased 2,017 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 229,186,647, oats 9,345,322, barley 6,805,742, flaxseed 1,479,613 and rye 5,020,266 bushels, a total of 251,837,590 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.-- Grain stocks for the week show a net decrease of 342,182 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 268,716, oats 38,619 and barley 38,259 bushels, while flaxseed and rye increased 1,299 and 2,113 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PUBLIC & SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.-- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 78,341 bushels. Wheat decreased 157,388 bushels while increases are noted in oats and barley of 74,498 and 4,549 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.-- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 637,793 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 656,674 and oats 44,708 bushels while barley decreased 63,589 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.-- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.-- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).-- Grain stocks show a net increase of 673,736 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 621,003, oats 28,780, barley 24,237 and flaxseed 718 bushels while rye decreased 1,002 bushels.


Platform Loadings to January 21, 1934.
