

WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 9, 1934 shows a decrease of 898,638 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 232,786,697 bushels compared with a revised figure of 233,685,335 bushels for the previous week and 229,087,945 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 9,107,756 bushels of which 3,837,810 bushels and 3,932,971 bushels were in store and afloat at Buffalo and New York respectively. This compared with 9,838,111 bushels on the same date last year of which 6,324,706 bushels were located at Buffalo and 1,172,882 bushels at New York.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2,248,845 bushels compared with 6,693,938 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 2, 1934 amounted to 1,870,053 bushels, a decrease of 249,320 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 2,119,373 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1933, 3,439,058 bushels were marketed. For the twenty-seven weeks ending February 2, 1934 and February 3, 1933, 172,040,152 bushels and 288,816,043 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending February 2, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the same week in 1933: Manitoba 114,067 (121,094) bushels; Saskatchewan 698,660 (1,243,887) bushels; Alberta 1,057,326 (2,074,077) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to February 2, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1932-33 were as follows, figures in brackets being those for 1932-33: Manitoba 23,337,158 (30,103,463) bushels; Saskatchewan 85,664,724 (150,028,773) bushels; Alberta 63,038,270 (108,682,807) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending February 9, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,388,271 bushels compared with 3,081,462 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 693,191 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1933, 3,148,831 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.

EXPORTS VIA SHIPPING ROUTES

Wheat Export month of January, 1934

According to Canadian Customs returns during the month of January, 1934, 7,088,311 bushels of wheat valued at \$4,630,824 were exported from Canada compared with 14,706,801 bushels with a value of \$6,912,278 for the same month of 1933. For the month 1,123 bushels were exported to the United States for consumption. 13,866 bushels moved via United States ports. Exports amounting to 1,311,432 bushels and 5,761,890 bushels moved from Canadian Atlantic and Pacific ports respectively. No rerouted wheat was registered during January.

WHEAT EXPORTS - SIX MONTHS ENDING JANUARY, 1934.

Exports during the six months ending January, 1934 amounted to 99,315,063 bushels valued at \$68,629,439 compared with 155,101,260 bushels with a value of \$82,736,688 for the same period in 1933. Of the former 100,768 bushels were exported to the United States for consumption, 25,584,970 bushels moved out via United States Atlantic ports, 47,736,733 bushels were exported via Canadian Atlantic ports, 23,490,713 bushels via Canadian Pacific ports and 2,401,879 bushels via the Port of Churchill Manitoba, making a total via Canadian ports of 73,629,325.

The rerouted wheat from United States lake ports to Canadian ports amounted to 947,033 bushels which increases the movement via Canadian ports to 74,576,358 bushels and decreases the exports via United States ports to 24,637,937 bushels.

WHEATFLOUR EXPORTS - MONTH OF JANUARY, 1934.

During the month of January, 949 barrels of wheatflour were exported to the United States direct for consumption. 29,813 barrels moved via United States ports for export overseas and 314,620 barrels were exported via Canadian Atlantic ports, while 103,116 barrels were exported from Canadian Pacific ports. The total export for the month amounted to 448,498 barrels valued at \$1,514,424 compared with 397,304 barrels valued at \$1,162,046 during the same month in 1933.

WHEATFLOUR EXPORTS - SIX MONTHS ENDED JANUARY, 1934.

Wheatflour exports during the six months ending January, 1934, show a slight increase over the same period in 1933. The number of barrels exported for the six months ending January, 1934, was 2,961,495 barrels valued at \$10,840,096 compared with 2,710,490 barrels valued at \$8,571,720 for the same six months in 1933, an increase in quantity of 251,005 barrels and in value \$2,268,376. Exports via Canadian Atlantic ports amounted to 2,089,037 barrels and from Canadian Pacific ports 643,624 barrels, while 226,069 barrels were exported to United States ports for export overseas and 2,765 barrels were shipped to the United States for consumption.

WHEAT AND WHEATFLOUR - EXPORTS COMBINED FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1934.

The combined exports of wheat and wheatflour, the latter reduced to bushels at $4\frac{1}{2}$ bushels to the barrel, amounted to 9,106,552 bushels compared with 16,494,669 bushels for the same month in 1933. Of the former amount 5,394 bushels went to the United States, direct, 148,025 bushels were exported to the United States for export overseas, 2,727,222 bushels were moved direct from Canadian Atlantic ports and 6,225,911 bushels were shipped overseas from Canadian Pacific ports. No rerouted grain was reported.

WHEAT AND WHEATFLOUR - SIX MONTHS ENDING JANUARY, 1934.

Exports of wheat and wheatflour in bushels for the six months ending January, 1934 and 1933 amounted to 112,641,791 bushels and 167,298,466 bushels respectively. The routing of the first amount was as follows: 113,212 bushels to the United States for consumption, 26,602,281 bushels moved to United States ports for export overseas, 57,137,399 bushels were exported direct from Canadian Atlantic ports, 26,387,020 bushels were shipped from Canadian Pacific ports and 2,401,879 bushels were moved from Churchill Manitoba. The rerouted wheat amounted to 947,033 bushels which increased the Canadian Atlantic exports to 58,084,432 bushels and decreases the amount routed via United States ports to 25,654,849 bushels.

International Trade

World shipments for the week ending February 12 amounted to 11,522,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,510,000 bushels for the previous week and 15,232,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932-33. Shipments from North America decreased by 1 million bushels during the past week, while clearances from the Argentine increased by 617,000 bushels and Australian shipments were slightly lower. Russian shipments showed a slight increase.

During the first twenty-eight weeks of the present crop year, world shipments amounted to 288 million bushels compared with 332 million bushels for the corresponding weeks of the last crop year. North American shipments have amounted to 127 million bushels compared with 133 million bushels in 1932-33. Since August 1, 1933, the Argentine has cleared 57 million bushels of wheat compared with 40 million bushels for the same weeks of the last crop year. Australian shipments have amounted to 49 million bushels compared with 72 million in 1932-33. Russian shipments amounted to 25 million bushels compared with 17 million bushels for the same period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twenty-eight weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.3 million bushels per week during the first twenty-eight weeks of the crop year as compared with 11.8 and 15.2 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.5 million bushels per week compared with 6.5 and 6.4 million bushels per week during the first twenty-eight weeks of 1932-33 and 1931-32. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.0 million bushels per week as compared with 1.4 million bushels during the same period in the last crop year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 9, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 9, 1934 show a decrease of 1,072,791 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 232,786,697, oats 18,705,287, barley 10,931,002, flaxseed 603,019 and rye 4,059,153 bushels a total of 267,085,158. Decreases noted were as follows:- wheat 898,638, oats 47,654, barley 113,621, flaxseed 817 and rye 12,061 bushels. At a comparable date last year, stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 229,087,945, oats 9,296,649, barley 6,787,651, flaxseed 1,456,184 and rye 5,041,536 bushels a total of 251,669,965 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks in store show a net increase of 129,890 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat and oats of 76,347 and 94,367 bushels respectively while decreases are shown in barley of 34,053, flaxseed 2,228 and rye 4,543 bushels.





Lake shipments for the week ending February 10, 1934 were nil. For the period from August 1, 1933 to date, lake shipments amounted to wheat 362,420 bushels.

Rail shipments for the week ending February 10, 1934 amounted to wheat 29,148 bushels, of which 16,947 bushels were imported into the United States for consumption duty paid.

Rail shipments from August 1, 1933 to date amounted to wheat 48,022 and rye 2,630 bushels.
