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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 18, 1933, shows a decrease of 1,682,038 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported at 191,781,126 bushels compared with a revised figure of 193,463,164 bushels for the previous week and 113,036,231 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932.

Canadian wheat in store in the United States amounted to 5,262,942 bushels compared with 5,361,168 bushels on the same date last year.

In transit wheat on the Great Lakes amounted to 3,239,639 bushels on August 18. On August 19, 1932, 4,064,823 bushels were in transit on the lakes.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 3,700,660 bushels compared with 13,140,416 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT OF WHEAT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 11, amounted to 1,526,250 bushels, an increase of 1,131,759 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 394,491 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1932, 1,156,910 bushels were reported. For the two weeks ending August 11, 1933 and August 14, 1932, 1,920,741 bushels and 1,677,395 bushels respectively were received from the farms.

EXPORT CLEARANCES


During the week ending August 18, 1933, the export clearances amounted to 2,808,644 bushels compared with 2,048,153 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 760,491 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1932, 2,413,353 bushels were reported.

EXPORTS BY COUNTRIES OF DESTINATION

According to the Customs figures, exports of Canadian wheat by countries of destination amounted to 240,136,568 bushels in the crop year 1933 compared with 182,803,382 bushels for the previous year, making the fifth largest export from Canada in any crop year.

Wheatflour exports amounted to 5,370,613 barrels, slightly less than the previous crop year when 5,383,594 barrels were exported. Of the former amount, Great Britain received 2,372,063 barrels; British West Indies, 757,077 barrels; Newfoundland, 317,006 barrels; Irish Free State, 243,523 barrels; Hong Kong, 238,902 barrels; Norway, 176,381 barrels; Japan, 150,727 barrels; China, 147,623 barrels; Denmark, 116,895 barrels; while smaller amounts went to other countries.

Oats exports for the crop year 1933 amounted to 11,075,797 bushels compared with 13,611,111 bushels in 1932. Great Britain was the chief country of import with 6,820,013 bushels. The other important countries in order of quantity were:- Netherlands, 1,501,025 bushels; Belgium, 1,191,739 bushels; Newfoundland, 413,903 bushels; British West Indies, 358,073 bushels; Bermuda, 273,789 bushels; and France, 249,744 bushels.

Barley exports amounted to 5,391,399 bushels compared with 13,538,225 bushels for the previous crop year. The majority of the 1933 export amounting to 4,745,053 bushels was destined to Great Britain. Netherlands was next with 337,475 bushels; Irish Free State, 152,500 bushels; Belgium, 129,167 bushels; and a small balance to other countries.

EXPORTS BY SHIPPING ROUTES

In following the export of wheat from Canada, it is interesting to note the various routes taken leaving Canada. During the crop year 1933, 54,799,322 bushels were billed via United States Atlantic Seaboard ports. Of this amount 13,212,232 bushels were re-routed to Canadian channels, reducing the movement via United States ports to 41,587,090 bushels. Some 85,812,022 bushels were shown exported from Canadian Atlantic ports to which must be added 13,212,232 bushels of re-routed wheat from United States ports making a total of 99,024,254 bushels; 96,484,309 bushels were exported from the Pacific ports and 2,735,939 bushels from Churchill. An amount of 304,976 bushels was exported to the United States for consumption.

Wheatflour exports show 495,619 barrels billed via United States Atlantic ports; 3,599,397 barrels moved via Canadian Atlantic ports; 1,270,013 barrels via Pacific ports; 4,926 barrels from Churchill; and 658 barrels to the United States direct.

Oats billed via United States Atlantic ports amounted to only 38,217 bushels, but owing to carry-over in the latter ports, 94,000 bushels were re-routed to Canada increasing the original movement of 6,135,654 bushels to 6,229,654 bushels. The export from Pacific ports amounted to 4,822,563 bushels while 79,363 bushels were shipped direct to the United States.

Barley exports show that 129,058 bushels were billed via United States Atlantic Seaboard ports from which must be deducted 113,750 bushels re-routed to Canadian ports leaving 16,308 bushels to be cleared from United States Atlantic ports. An amount of 6,964,243 bushels was exported via Canadian Atlantic ports to which must be added 113,750 bushels mentioned above making 7,077,990 bushels from the Canadian Atlantic ports. Canadian Pacific ports show an export of 1,298,098 bushels.

Rye exports amounted to 2,866,358 bushels for the crop year 1933. Of this amount, 2,144,474 bushels moved via Canadian Atlantic ports; 521,684 bushels via United States ports; and 200 bushels from Pacific ports.

Flaxseed shows an export of 794,391 bushels; 717,605 bushels moving direct to the United States, 43,329 bushels from Atlantic Seaboard ports and 27,957 bushels from United States ports.

Bran, shorts and middlings exported during the crop year 1933 amounted to 2,567,562 hundredweight compared with 1,879,373 hundredweight in 1932. Oatmeal and rolled oats show an export of 551,671 hundredweight compared with 725,855 hundredweight a year ago.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 18, 1933

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 18, 1933 show a net decrease of 1,119,515 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 191,731,126, oats 12,869,635, barley 8,043,401, flaxseed 1,085,030 and rye 5,860,933 bushels a total of 219,740,125 bushels. A decrease is noted in wheat of 1,622,038 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 274,656, barley 139,112, flaxseed 450 and rye 143,295 bushels. For the corresponding date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 113,036,231, oats 6,059,616, barley 2,905,525, flaxseed 1,264,391 and rye 4,948,742 bushels a total of 123,214,505 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators decreased 207,661 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 120,369, oats 54,842, flaxseed 445 and rye 40,972 bushels while barley increased 39,467.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show an increase of 31,920 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 3,314 and oats 28,606 bushels.


PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit decreased 351,127 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 220,696, oats 55,582, barley 40,000 and flaxseed 55,592 bushels while rye increased 20,746 bushels.




