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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 2, 1934 shows a decrease of 262,786 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 229,865,751 bushels compared with a revised figure of 230,128,537 bushels for the previous week and 223,534,889 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 8,800,744 bushels of which 3,202,972 bushels and 2,207,159 bushels were in store or afloat at Buffalo and New York respectively. This compared with 7,749,761 bushels on the same date last year of which 6,493,741 bushels were located at Buffalo and 1,256,020 bushels at New York. Albany reports 2,419,000 bushels of Canadian wheat in store on March 2, 1934. No reports were received previously from this port.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2,235,096 bushels compared with 6,554,410 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 23, 1934 amounted to 1,706,540 bushels, a decrease of 1,117,084 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 2,823,624 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1933, 3,820,348 bushels were marketed. For the thirty weeks ending February 23, 1934 and February 24, 1933, 178,651,718 bushels and 296,642,399 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending February 23, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the same week in 1933: Manitoba 193,707 (153,963) bushels; Saskatchewan 687,473 (1,558,812) bushels; Alberta 825,360 (2,107,573) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to February 23, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1932-33 were as follows, figures in brackets being those for 1932-33: Manitoba 23,787,936 (30,508,308) bushels; Saskatchewan 58,486,609 (152,902,205) bushels; Alberta 66,377,173 (113,231,886) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending March 2, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,563,683 bushels compared with 2,620,873 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 942,810 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1933, 3,492,869 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.


World shipments for the week ending March 5, amounted to 8,418,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 11,663,000 bushels for the previous week and 15,464,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932-33. Shipments from North America showed a slight decrease during the past week. Clearances from the Argentina and Australia showed decreases of 1,392,000 bushels and 1,236,000 bushels respectively, as compared with the previous week.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty-one weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.3 million bushels per week during the first thirty-one weeks of the crop year as compared with 12.3 and 15.2 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.5 million bushels per week compared with 6.4 and 6.2 million bushels per week during the first thirty-one weeks of 1932-33 and 1931-32. Argentina shipments have averaged 2.2 million bushels per week as compared with 1.7 million bushels during the same period in the last crop year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 2, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 2, 1934 show a net decrease of 976,005 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 229,865,751, oats 18,294,328, barley 10,820,094, flaxseed 595,491 and rye 4,045,197 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 262,736, oats 568,754, barley 141,729 and rye 5,625 bushels while flaxseed increased 2,839 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 223,534,839, oats 9,767,245, barley 6,678,807, flaxseed 1,460,997 and rye 5,122,223 bushels, a total of 246,564,161 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 5,421 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 11,662 and barley 38,873 bushels while decreases are shown in oats of 40,534, flaxseed 758 and rye of 3,827 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 5,557 bushels. Barley increased 10,708 bushels while wheat and oats decreased 5,848 and 1,303 bushels respectively.



Rail shipments from August 1, 1933 to date amounted to wheat 49,544 and rye 2,630 bushels.






