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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 6, 1934 shows a decrease of 1,334,077 bushels as compared with the previous week, in the same week of 1933 there was an increase in stocks. The visible supply was reported as 222,690,028 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 224,024,105 bushels for the previous week and 225,867,542 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 4,284,306 bushels of which 901,749 bushels were in store at Buffalo 738,361 bushels at New York and 2,334,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 5,664,352 bushels on the same date last year of which 4,516,219 bushels were located at Buffalo, 78,890 bushels at New York and 332,319 bushels at Boston.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2,203,643 bushels compared with 6,358,692 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 30, 1934 amounted to 1,999,270 bushels, an increase of 17,623 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 1,981,647 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1933, 4,104,597 bushels were marketed. For the thirty-five weeks ending March 30, 1934 and March 31, 1933, 188,483,304 bushels and 319,592,370 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending March 30, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the same week in 1933: Manitoba 109,230 (390,734) Saskatchewan 1,082,777 (1,928,026) bushels; Alberta 807,263 (1,785,837) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to March 30, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1932-33 were as follows, figures in brackets being those for 1932-33: Manitoba 24,626,544 (32,725,058) bushels; Saskatchewan 92,981,064 (162,889,678) bushels; Alberta 70,875,696 (123,977,634) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending April 6, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,969,149 bushels compared with 1,414,596 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1933, 2,099,052 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.

World shipments for the week ending April 9, amounted to 8,119,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,152,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,912,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932-33. Shipments from North America decreased slightly during the past week. Clearances from the Argentine showed a decrease of 1,579,000 bushels and Australian shipments were slightly higher as compared with the previous week.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty-six weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.2 million bushels per week during the first thirty-six weeks of the crop year as compared with 12.4 and 15.3 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.3 million bushels per week compared with 6.0 million bushels per week during the first thirty-six weeks of 1932-33 and 1931-32. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.4 million bushels per week as compared with 2.0 million bushels during the same period in the last crop year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 6, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 6, 1934 show a net decrease of 1,665,926 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 222,690,028, oats 16,410,593, barley 10,417,723, flaxseed 548,836 and rye 4,160,490 bushels, a total of 254,227,670 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,334,077, oats 336,365, barley 118,571 and flaxseed 15,941 bushels while rye increased 139,028 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 225,867,542, oats 12,233,070, barley 6,720,522, flaxseed 1,302,080 and rye 5,147,609 bushels, a total of 251,270,823 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 544,429 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 129,400, oats 331,880, barley 75,348, flaxseed 1,097 and rye 6,704 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 5,088 bushels. Barley decreased 29,225 bushels while increases are shown in wheat of 3,755, oats 19,421 and flaxseed 961 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 199,543 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 123,606, oats 63,351 and barley 12,586 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks decreased 500 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net increase of 567,978 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 537,883, oats 20,894, barley 17,423 and rye 956 bushels while flaxseed decreased 9,178 bushels.


